OUR VISION

Clovis Unified Preschool strives to be the benchmark for excellence in Early Childhood Education programs.

OUR MISSION

The mission of Clovis Unified Preschool is to provide a safe, nurturing, and engaging early learning environment that effectively supports the diverse needs of children and families in our community and creates a foundation for children to enter Kindergarten as lifelong learners.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Program Description

Clovis Unified Preschool is a high-quality, developmentally appropriate program for 3- and 4-year-old children. The program strives to offer a quality curriculum that recognizes and values each child's potential and fulfills the California Preschool Learning Foundations. California State Preschool Programs (CSPP) are available at no cost to eligible families. For those families that are not eligible, two private pay programs are offered. All programs are three hours per day and available in morning or afternoon sessions.

Background Information

Created in the spring of 1993, Clovis Unified Preschool opened six programs at six elementary school sites, with 15 employees and 90 students. The program has expanded to 46 programs at 29 school sites, 135 employees and over 800 students. Preschool currently offers nine Inclusion Programs and six Language Experience Programs in partnership with Clovis Unified's Special Education Department, serving over 130 students with disabilities.

Clovis Unified Preschool is required to follow Title 22 requirements which include annual inspections of our facilities by the Department of Social Services Community Care Licensing Division. The programs are also required to adhere to Title 5 requirements, which include annual Program Self-Evaluations and Federal Program Monitoring every three to five years.

PROGRAM SELF-EVALUATION PROCESS

The California Department of Education (CDE) under Title 5, requires CSPP contractors to complete a Program Self-Evaluation (PSE) annually. The PSE consists of four components:

Desired Results Developmental Profile (DRDP)

Desired Results Parent Survey

Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale (ECERS)

Program Review Instrument

As part of the continuous improvement cycle, contractors are required to analyze findings from the self-evaluation and develop both a written list of tasks to modify the program and create procedures for ongoing monitoring to assure that areas that are satisfactory continue to meet standards. Contractors are required to submit the PSE to CDE by June 1st of every year. The PSE is shared with all stakeholders including parents and families, site staff, Child Development administration, and the Governing Board.

DESIRED RESULTS DEVELOPMENTAL PROFILE

The DRDP is an individual assessment that preschool teachers complete twice a year to measure student progress on a continuum from preschool to kindergarten entry. These results are summarized and shared with parents. Preschool teachers use the formative data to plan for instruction—just as K-12 teachers do when they assess children. Preschool teachers analyze the data, plan for individual and group instruction and continually monitor progress. Teachers complete a Summary of Findings with possible areas for improvement. District-wide program data is analyzed for trends. This data drives the program's continuous improvement cycle. The summary is used to create the annual PSE.

DESIRED RESULTS PARENT SURVEY

Desired Results Parent Surveys are distributed each spring in an online survey format. Families are asked 37 questions regarding how the program helps parents support their child's learning and development and meets the family's needs. Survey results are analyzed by individual classroom staff and program administrators. The survey data is included in the PSE.

EARLY CHILDHOOD ENVIRONMENT RATING SCALE

The ECERS is designed to assess quality in an early childhood program. The rating scale views child development from a comprehensive, or global, point of view, examining a wide variety of areas that all contribute to positive development. The areas include:

Space and Furnishings Interaction
Personal Care Routines Program Structure
Language-Reasoning Parents and Staff
Activities

Preschool staff work together to complete the Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale in their classroom. A Summary of Findings is completed with possible areas for improvement. All classroom Summary of Findings are analyzed by the Preschool Administration and one agency wide Summary of Findings is completed as a part of the PSE.

PROGRAM REVIEW INSTRUMENT

The Program Review Instrument consists of five overall areas and 20 specific requirements. The areas include:

Family Files

Family Engagement and Strengthening

Program Quality

Administrative

Fiscal/Audit

Contractors are required to identify any areas that may be out of compliance and create a corrective action plan for each item.

2023-24 POSITIVE OUTCOMES

Developmental Profile

- 88% of students were at Building Middle or higher (indicates students are developmentally ready to enter Transitional Kindergarten or Kindergarten) in Language and Literacy on the spring DRDP, which is a 36% increase from the fall DRDP data.
- 94% of children who will be age-eligible for kindergarten in the 2024-25 school year were at Building Middle or higher in Language and Literacy on the spring DRDP.
- 91% of Dual Language Learners were at Building Middle or higher in Cognition-Math on spring DRDP, which is an increase of 39% from the fall DRDP data.

Parent Survey

- 98.9% of families are satisfied/very satisfied with the overall quality of the programs.
- 99.0% of families are satisfied/very satisfied with the interactions between staff and children.
- 99.0% of families are satisfied/very satisfied with the daily activities and classroom environments.

Environment Rating Scale

- Our programs rated 6.9 out of 7 for Language and Reasoning. This subscale evaluates the quality and quantity of books available in the classroom as well as building the children's use of language and reasoning.
- Our programs rated 6.9 out of 7 for Interactions, which is in the excellent range. This subscale evaluates the general supervision and the use of positive guidance strategies as well as the quality of interactions between children and staff and between peers.

DISCUSSION:

Clovis Unified's Expanded Learning Club Program provides before and after school educational experiences for students in grades transitional kindergarten through sixth at all elementary schools.

The program components include academic support, health and wellness, and enrichment activities. State funding allows the program to be free to students who meet the following criteria: English Learner, foster youth, or qualify for free/reduced meals. A fee structure is in place for students who do not meet the fee waiver criteria.

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Program Overview

Introduction

Clovis Unified School District (CUSD) utilizes the Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELOP) fund to establish the Expanded Learning Club (ELC) program which provides quality academic support and enrichment opportunities outside of the school day for students at all 34 elementary schools in the district. Title I schools and any Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) schools with an Unduplicated Pupil Percentage over 50 percent are granted a sitewide fee waiver that allows all students enrolled access to ELC at no cost.

Vision

CUSD Expanded Learning Club strives to be America's benchmark for excellence in providing expanded learning programs for students in elementary school.

Mission

Our mission is to provide a safe and supportive expanded learning environment that fosters educational and enrichment opportunities for students and staff.



Expanded Learning Club (ELC)

ELC offers several program options for students during the school year and intersession. Parents may enroll their student(s) in multiple ELC programs based on their needs.


- ELC Before School
 - This program is available at most schools and starts at 7am until the first bell.
- ELC Transitional Kindergarten/Kindergarten (TK/K)
 - This program is available at all schools and wraps around the 3.5 hour TK/K class.
- ELC After School
 - This program is available at all schools and starts right after the dismissal bell until 5:30PM.
- ELC Full Day
 - This program is available during fall, winter, spring, and summer break at selected sites. Full day program starts at 7:30AM until 5:30PM.

Application Process

Participation in ELC is offered to all Clovis Unified students in grades transitional kindergarten through sixth. During the month of March, parent information meetings are held at all schools to ensure parents in each school community are aware of ELC programs offered and how to apply for their student(s). Parents must reapply annually when the application for the following year opens in late April.


Program Overview

A total of 4,395 ELC applications accepted in our program show 70% of students were in the primary grades (TK-3) and 30% of the students were in the upper grades (4-6).



Program Participation

From July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, a total of 12,542 students have participated in one or more ELC programs with half of them accessing programs at no cost.



Program Highlights



Growing Programs

- The total number of students enrolled increased by 2,000 from the previous year.
- Seven more TK/K programs were added.
- Over 300 hours of academic support was provided by 14 credentialed teachers.

Learning Environments

- Five new portables were added to existing sites (Copper Hills, Jefferson, Nelson, Pinedale & Temperance-Kutner).
- Hirayama will open with two new portables for programs.
- 13 sites had their furniture refreshed.
- Restrooms will be added in portables at two sites
- The Second Step curriculum and calming corner areas were implemented in all TK/K programs.





Staff

- ELC staff were placed on the Classified Salary Schedule.
- 206 out of 391 staff members were new hires
- An Assistant Director and five full-time Site Lead II's were hired to support programs.
- The Behavior Consultation Team, comprised of a full-time Psychologist and two part-time Instructional Assistant III's, provided support for students with challenging behaviors.

Evaluation Process

During the month of April, students, parents, and staff were invited to participate in the Annual Expanded Learning Club Program Survey. The feedback from the survey is utilized to evaluate the program quality and make adjustments for the following year. Survey questions are based on the Expanded Learning Quality Standards. Results are reviewed by the ELC leadership team and shared with site staff and site administration.

Expanded Learning Quality Standards

CUSD has adopted the twelve "Quality Standards for Expanded Learning in California" that are used to assist in providing effective quality programs. The Quality Standards are broken down into two categories: Point-of-Service and Programmatic. Each quality standard has three levels of action: Programmatic, Staff, and Students.






Survey Results

Parent Feedback

The Annual ELC Parent Survey link was emailed to 2,723 parents with current students enrolled in the program. From this cohort, 454 dedicated parents participated in sharing their perspectives and insights. Among the respondents, 64% reported having one student enrolled in Expanded Learning Club, while an additional 36% indicated they had two or more children enrolled in ELC. The respondents had children participating across all ELC programs (see chart below).



Key findings from 249 positive parent comments highlighted the safe learning environment, appreciation for the staff, and the various learning activities for students.

Out of the 152 parent suggestions to improve the program, the top three areas included the need for lower fees when utilizing the online payment option, adding fruits and vegetables for snacks, and more staff training.






Survey Results

Student Feedback

Over a period of two weeks, students in programs were invited to complete the Annual ELC Student Survey. At the conclusion of the survey period, 1,343 students from all grade levels provided input about their experiences in ELC.



The overwhelming positive response (1,091 comments) from the students were about the program components, specifically the structured outdoor games, art and food projects, and STEM learning activities.

The students provided recommendations with 422 comments. The top recommendations were in reference to snack options and expanding on the various activities.

Programs

- Starting in August of 2024, ELC programs will be offered at Hirayama, the newest elementary school in the district.
- With the growth in transitional kindergarten enrollment, five additional TK/K ELC programs will be added at the following sites: Cole, Miramonte, Temperance-Kutner, Weldon, and Young.
- In response to the snack suggestions, ELC summer full day programs will be piloting fresh fruit and vegetable options.
- The ELC leadership team will continue to partner with site leaders and teachers to provide academic intervention opportunities for students in ELC.

Staffing

- Building staff capacity and skills are ongoing priorities. Several mandatory and optional staff trainings
 are planned for the next school year. Training opportunities will be tailored to the job classification and
 areas of needs.
- The additional full-time positions for a total of seven Site Lead II's and five Lead I's will support the overall program quality at their designated sites.
- The new Child Development Nurse will provide nursing services during ELC hours.

DISCUSSION:

Board Policy No. 5112.5 requires an annual review of its provisions.

STUDENTS
Rights and Responsibilities

OPEN/CLOSED CAMPUS, LEAVING THE CAMPUS

PURPOSE: To establish policy for student permission to leave campus during the school day.

Students are not authorized to leave any campus of the District during the school day without a valid off campus pass. Students who leave campus without authorization shall be considered to have an unexcused absence. Off campus passes are issued under the supervision of the school principal.

Upon receipt of a written request of the student's parents/legal guardians, the principal or designee may authorize students with senior standing to leave campus at lunch time subject to the following rules and regulations:

- 1. Permission slips shall be signed by both parents and/or guardians and be placed on file with the high school administration.
- 2. Parental permission, in writing, shall exempt the District from all liability during the period of absence from the campus.
- 3. This privilege is granted to seniors in good standing as determined by the principal or designee.
- 4. For good and sufficient reasons, the school principal may revoke the off-campus privilege for any and all senior students.
- 5. Conditions of this policy may be changed if factors such as commercial development and related matters become an issue.
- 6. This policy shall be reviewed annually.

Nothing in this policy shall impact a student's right to leave campus for an authorized medical appointment pursuant to law and board policy.

A student violation of this policy is termed willful defiance of the valid authority of the school principal and the Board directs that the principal or designee may administer any appropriate disciplinary action, including suspension.

Neither the District nor any officer or employee thereof shall be liable for the conduct or safety of any student during such time as the student has left the school grounds pursuant to this policy and Education Code section 44808.5.

CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

PURPOSE: To establish parameters for co-curricular and extra-curricular programs, including

academic and ethical standards.

A. GENERAL PROGRAM PARAMETERS

The Board believes that the District's goals and objectives are best achieved by a diversity of learning experiences, some of which are more appropriately conducted outside the regular classroom curricular program of the school.

The Board further believes that students should have the opportunity to participate in programs that will allow them to reach their full potential. Students should learn to develop the ability to assess and interpret what it takes to be successful, develop proficiency in the skills associated with each activity or sport, and develop the personal qualities of discipline, commitment, sportsmanship, and a lifetime commitment to excellence.

It is important that every student, coach, and advisor be an exemplary role model for the school, community and each other, and that they reflect the strong value the Board places upon character. The coach, advisor, and student must recognize that the purpose of activities is to promote the physical, mental, moral, and emotional well-being of the individual student. For all extra-curricular activities at grades 7-12, including sports, the coach/advisor, student, and parent/guardian shall each sign and follow the District's Codes of Conduct, Exhibits No. 6145(1), 6145(2), 6145(3), and 6145(5). The District shall further post Codes of Conduct for spectators and officials, Exhibits No. 6145(4) and 6145(6).

The Board's policy is to offer opportunities for students to participate in co-curricular and extracurricular activities in accordance with applicable federal and state laws. No District student's participation in extra-curricular and co-curricular activities shall be required or refused based on the student's gender, sexual orientation, ethnic group identification, race, ancestry, national origin, religion, color, or mental or physical disability.

The Superintendent shall adopt an administrative regulation that sets forth Codes of Conduct for coaches and advisors, students, parents/guardians, spectators and officials, and parameters for co-curricular and extra-curricular activities in the District.

B. **DEFINITIONS**

"Extra-curricular activities" shall include those activities that are not part of the regular school curriculum, are not graded, and do not take place during classroom time. Such activities shall ordinarily be supervising or financed by the District; students participating in extra-curricular activities represent the District; students may exercise some degree of freedom in their selection,

planning, or control of the program; and extra-curricular activities typically include the preparation for performance and performance before an audience or spectators. Extra-curricular activities include District athletic programs and interscholastic athletics.

"Co-curricular activities" shall include those programs that are associated with the curricular in a regular classroom. However, such activities do not include any required program that satisfies the entrance requirements to California State University or University of California. Also, programs that have, as their primary goal, the improvement of academic or educational achievement are not considered "co-curricular activities."

C. <u>ELEMENTARY, INTERMEDIATE AND HIGH SCHOOL INTERSCHOLASTIC</u> ATHLETICS

The Board intends to provide an opportunity for all students to participate in interscholastic athletics. The Board also intends to encourage students to participate in athletics at the school in their attendance area.

The Board recognizes the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) as the regulatory body for interscholastic athletics for grades nine through twelve. Interscholastic athletics for grades nine through twelve shall be conducted in accordance with this policy and the accompanying administrative regulation and shall comply with CIF rules except when this policy and the accompanying administrative regulation establishes a higher standard than the CIF rules.

Although CIF is not the regulatory body for interscholastic athletics for grades seven and eight, the Board adopts CIF rules pertaining to residential and transfer eligibility to interscholastic athletics for grades seven and eight. However, any residential and/or transfer eligibility determinations with regard to seventh and eighth grades will be made by the District, and the District's determinations are final and not subject to appeal to CIF or any other administrative agencies. The District shall apply CIF rules as appropriate with respect to seventh and eighth grade interscholastic athletics in the District.

The Superintendent shall adopt an administrative regulation that sets forth residential and transfer eligibility requirements for interscholastic athletics for seventh through twelfth grades as well as certain academic and other qualifications and requirements for participation in interscholastic athletics for all District students.

Eligibility and other requirements for participation in elementary level athletics will be governed by the administrative regulation established by the Superintendent, as well as the District's Elementary Athletic Handbook.

The Board shall annually review this policy as required by Education Code section 35160.5.

D. COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

The Board recognizes the social and scholastic values that may be derived by students participating in various activities sponsored by community organizations. To prevent unreasonable demand on the time and energies of students and staff, requests for student participation in community sponsored activities must be made in writing to the site administrator and be approved by the Superintendent or designee. Any requests from civic institutions or special interest groups involving students in such activities as patriotic functions, contests, and exhibits must be carefully reviewed to ensure that such activities promote student interests without advancing the special interests of any particular group and that students participating do so voluntarily.

RECOMMENDATION:

Conduct the biennial review of Conflict of Interest Code – Board Bylaws and Exhibits No. 9270, as submitted.

DISCUSSION:

The Political Reform Act requires that every local agency review its Conflict of Interest Code (COI Code) every even-numbered year and, if a change in its COI Code is necessitated, submit an amended COI Code to the local agency's code reviewing body. (Government Code Section 87306.5). The Fresno County Board of Supervisors is the reviewing body for the District's Conflict of Interest Code.

The District's COI Code consists of the following items, which are attached:

- 1. Board Bylaw No. 9270: The Board approved amendments to Board Bylaw No. 9270 on September 23, 2020. The Bylaw was reviewed by the Board on June 8, 2022, with no changes being made. Staff recommend changes as set forth in the attached Bylaw to reflect the current law and more closely track language in the regulations and add formatting and headings for ease of use.
- 2. Exhibit No. 9270(1) Designated Positions: On March 18, 2022, the District's Superintendent adopted amendments to Exhibit 1 Designated Positions to include all Administrators and Directors and added the Chief Information Officer and the Chief Human Resources Officer. Exhibit No. 9270(1) was reviewed by the Board on June 8, 2022, with no changes being made. Staff is not recommending any modifications to Exhibit No. 9270(1).
- 3. Exhibit No. 9270(2) Designated Positions was last amended on September 23, 2020. Exhibit No. 9270(2) was reviewed by the Board on June 8, 2022, with no change being made. Staff is not recommending any modifications to Exhibit No. 9270(2).

Staff recommends that the Board conducts a review of the District's COI Code, adopts amended Board Bylaw No. 9270 as submitted, and makes a determination that no additional changes are necessary as to Exhibits No. 9270(1) and 9270(2). Upon the Board's review, the COI Code will be submitted to the Fresno County Board of Supervisors as required in connection with the biennial review. Staff also recommends that the Board authorizes the Superintendent or designee to make such changes to the COI Code as may be required by the Fresno County Board of Supervisors. Such additional changes, if made, would be effective July 17, 2024.

BOARD BYLAWS CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

PURPOSE: To adopt a Conflict of Interest Code for the District and set forth requirements for

disclosure statements.

A. CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The District's Conflict of Interest Code shall be comprised of the terms of the California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18730, together with attachments specifying designated positions and the specific types of disclosure statements required for each position. (Government Code 87303)

- 1B. Review. Pursuant to law, upon direction of the Fresno County Board of Supervisors, the code reviewing body, the Board shall review the Conflict of Interest Code in even-numbered years. If no change in the code is required, the District shall notify the code reviewing body by October 1 by submitting a written statement to that effect. (Government Code 87306.5)
- 2C. Revisions. When a change in the District's Conflict of Interest Code is necessitated by changed circumstances, such as the creation of new Designated Positions, amendments or revisions, the changed code shall be submitted to the code reviewing body within 90 days of the changed circumstances necessitating the amendments have become apparent. (Government Code 87306)

When reviewing and preparing the District's Conflict of Interest Code, the Superintendent or designee shall provide officers, employees, consultants and members of the community adequate notice and a fair opportunity to present their views. (Government Code 87311)

BD. DESIGNATED POSITIONS

Unless otherwise required by law, the positions listed in Exhibit No. 9270(1) shall be Designated Positions.

CE. DISCLOSURE STATEMENT – FILING

1. Persons Required to File. Persons holding Designated Positions shall file the appropriate statement listed below disclosing investments, interests in real property, business positions, and income required to be reported under the category or categories assigned in Exhibit No. 9270(1). (2 CCR 18730) An investment, interest in real property, business position, or income shall be reportable if the business entity in which the investment or business position is held, the interest in real property, or the income or source of income may foreseeably be affected materially by any decision made or participated in by the person holding a Designated Position. (Government Code 87302) The specific disclosure responsibilities assigned to each Designated Position are set forth in Exhibit No. 9270(2).

25. <u>Place of Filing</u>. The statements for Designated Positions, other than the members of the Board and the Superintendent of the District, shall be filed with the Superintendent or designee. The members of the Board and the Superintendent are to file their original statements directly with the Clerk of the Board for the Fresno County Board of Supervisors (Board of Supervisors) using the electronic filing system. (2 CCR 18730) If the statements are not filed electronically, the paper statement and waiver shall be filed with the Superintendent or designee and, upon receipt of these paper statements with waivers, the Superintendent or designee shall make and retain a copy and forward the original to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

The Superintendent or designee shall retain a copy of all electronically filed statements that are filed with the Superintendent or designee, a copy of all paper statements with waivers and the original statements of Designated Positions and shall make the statements available for public review, inspection, and reproduction. (Government Code 81008)

3. Time of Filing.

- 2. a. <u>Initial Statement</u>. An initial statement shall be filed by each person holding a Designated Position within 30 days after the effective date of this Conflict of Interest Code, disclosing reportable investments, interests in real property, and business positions held on the effective of this Conflict of Interest Code, and income received duringin the 12 months prior to the effective date of this Conflict of Interest Code. (Government Code 87302, 2 CCR 18730)
- b3. <u>Annual Statement</u>. An annual statements shall be filed by April 1 disclosing reportable investments, interests in real property, business positions, and income held or received at any time during the previous calendar year or since the date the person in the Designation Position took office if during the calendar yearduring the preceding calendar year by persons holding Designed Positions. (Government Code 87302, 2 CCR 18730)
- c4. <u>Assuming Office Statement</u>. An Assuming Office Statement shall be filed by persons elected, appointed, promoted, or transferred to Designated Positions within 30 days after assuming the position, disclosing reportable investments, business positions, and interests in real property held on, and income received during the 12 months before, the date of assuming office or the date of being appointed or nominated, respectively. (Government Code 87302, 2 CCR 18730)
- d6. <u>Leaving Office Statement</u>. A Leaving Office Statement shall be filed by any person holding a Designated Position whose position with the District is terminated, voluntarily or involuntarily, within 30 days after termination, disclosing reportable investments, business positions, interests in real property and income held or received at any time duringeovering the period between the closing date of the previous Statement of Economic Interests required to be filed and the termination date. (Government Code 87302, 2 CCR 18730)

- e7. Statements for Persons Who Resign Prior to Assuming Office. Any person who resigns from a Designated Position within 12 months of initial appointment, or within 30 days of the date of notice provided by the filing officer of the person's filing obligation, whichever is earlier, is not deemed to "assume or leave office," provided that during the period between appointment and resignation, the person does not make, participate in making, or use the position to influence any decision of the District or to receive or become entitled to receive any form of payment as a result of his or her appointment. (2 CCR 18730)
 - Within 30 days of the date of a notice from the filing officer, the person shall do both of the following: (2 CCR 18730)
 - (1) File a written resignation with the appointing power; and
 - (2) File a written statement with the filing officer signed under penalty of perjury stating that during the period between appointment and resignation he or she did not make, participate in the making, or use the position to influence any decision of the District or receive, or become entitled to receive, any form of payment by virtue of being appointed to the position.

DF. DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS - CONTENTS

Disclosure statements shall be made on forms (Form 700) prescribed by the California Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) and supplied by the FPPCDistrict. (2 CCR 18730)

1. Contents of Investment and Interest in Real Property Reports

When an investment or interest in real property is required to be disclosed, the statement shall contain the following: (2 CCR 18730)

- a. A statement of the nature of the investment or interest.
- b. The name of the business entity in which each investment is held and a general description of the business activity in which the business entity is engaged.
- c. The address or other precise location of the real property.
- d. A statement whether the fair market value of the real property or investment equals or exceeds two thousand dollars (\$2,000), but does not exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), exceeds ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), but does not exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), exceeds one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), but does not exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000), or exceeds one million dollars (\$1,000,000). This information need not be provided with respect to an interest in real property that is the filer's principal residence.

- e. If the property or investment was partially or wholly acquired or disposed of during the period covered by the statement, the date of acquisition or disposal.
- f. Other information required by the FPPC (Fair Political Practices Commission) forms.

2. Contents of Income Reports

- a. <u>Personal Income</u>. When personal income is required to be reported under this Conflict of Interest Code, the statement shall contain the following: (2 CCR 18730)
 - (1) The name and address of each source of income aggregating five hundred dollars (\$500) or more in value and a general description of the business activity, if any, of each source. (Persons holding Designated Positions are not required to report salary, reimbursement for expenses or per diem, social security, disability, or other similar benefit payments received from a federal, state, or local government agency, including sums received as compensation for serving as Board Members as provided in the Education Code.)
 - (2) A statement whether the aggregate value of income from each source or in the case of a loan reportable as income, the highest amount owed to each source, was one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or less, was greater than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), was greater than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or was greater than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).
 - (3) A description of the consideration, if any, for which the income was received.
 - (4) In the case of a gift valued at fifty dollars (\$50) or more, the name, address, and business activity of the donor and any intermediary through which the gift was made; a description of the gift; the amount or value of the gift; and the date on which the gift was received.
 - (5) In the case of a loan reportable as income, the annual interest rate and the security, if any, given for the loan, and the term of the loan.
 - (6) Other information required by the FPPC forms.
- b. <u>Business Entity Income</u>. When income of a business entity, including income of a sole proprietorship, is required to be reported, the statement shall contain: (2 CCR 18730)
 - (1) The name, address, and a general description of the business activity of the business entity.
 - (2) The name of every person from whom the business entity received payments if the filer's pro rata share of gross receipts from such person was equal or greater than ten

thousand dollars (\$10,000) during a calendar year.

(3) Other information required by the FPPC forms.

3. Contents of Business Position Reports

When business positions are required to be reported, a person holding a Designated Position shall list the name and address of each business entity not specified above in which he/she is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or in which he/she holds any position of management, a description of the business activity in which the business entity is engaged, and the designated employee's position with the business entity, and any other information required by the FPPC forms. (2 CCR 18730)

EG. PROHIBITION ON RECEIPT OF HONORARIA

- 1. No person holding a Designated Position shall accept any honorarium from any source, if the person would be required to report the receipt of income or gifts from that source on his or her statement of economic interests. (2 CCR 18730)
- 2. Subdivisions (a), (b), and (c) of Government Code section 89501 shall apply to the prohibitions in this section. (2 CCR 18730)
- This section shall not limit or prohibit payments, advances, or reimbursements for travel and related lodging and subsistence authorized by Government Code section 89506. (2 CCR 18730)

F. PROHIBITION ON RECEIPT OF GIFTS IN EXCESS OF GIFT LIMIT

- Board members and persons holding Designated Positions may accept gifts only under the conditions and limitations specified in Government Code section 89503 and California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18730. (2 CCR 18730)
- 2. Subdivisions (e), (f), and (g) of Government Code section 8950-3 shall apply to the prohibitions in this section. (2 CCR 18730)
- 3. The limitations on gifts do not apply to wedding gifts and gifts exchanged between individuals on birthdays, holidays, and other similar occasions, provided that the gifts exchanged are not substantially disproportionate in value as described in Government Code section 89503. (Government Code 89503)
- 4. Gifts of travel and related lodging and subsistence shall be subject to the prevailing gift limitation except as described in Government Code section 89506. (Government Code 89506)

5. A gift of travel does not include travel provided by the District for Board members and persons holding Designated Positions. (Government Code 89506)

GH. LOANS TO PUBLIC OFFICIALS

- 1. No member of the Board of the District shall, from the date of his or her election to office through the date that he or she vacates office, receive a personal loan from any officer, employee, member, or consultant of the District (including those of any public agency over which the District has direction and control). (2 CCR 18730)
- 2. No member of the Board of the District shall, from the date of his or her election to office through the date that he or she vacates office, receive a personal loan from any person who has a contract with the District (including those of any public agency over which the District has direction and control). This subdivision shall not apply to loans made by banks or other financial institutions or to any indebtedness created as part of a retail installment or credit card transaction, if the loan is made or the indebtedness created in the lender's regular course of business on terms available to members of the public without regard to the elected officer's official status. (2 CCR 18730)
- 3. Paragraphs G.1 and G.2 above shall not apply to the following: (2 CCR 18730)
 - a. Loans made to the campaign committee of an elected officer or candidate for elective office.
 - b. Loans made by a Board Member's spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, parent-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, nephew, niece, aunt, uncle, or first cousin, or the spouse of any such persons, provided that the person making the loan is not acting as an agent or intermediary for any person not otherwise exempted under this section.
 - c. Loans from a person who is an officer, employee, member, or consultant of the District (including those of any public agency over which the District has direction and control), or who has a contract with the District (including those of any public agency over which the District has direction and control) that, in the aggregate, do not exceed five hundred dollars (\$500) at any given time.
 - d. Loans made, or offered in writing, before January 1, 1998.

4. Loan Terms

a. Except as set forth in subdivision (G.4.b.) below, no Member of the Board of the District shall, from the date of his or her election to office through the date he or she vacates office, receive a personal loan of five hundred dollars (\$500) or more from a single lender, except when the loan is in writing and clearly states the terms of the loan, including the parties to

the loan agreement, date of the loan, amount of the loan, term of the loan, date or dates when payments shall be due on the loan and the amount of the payments, and the rate of interest paid on the loan. (2 CCR 18730)

- b. This section shall not apply to the following types of loans: (2 CCR 18730)
 - 1) Loans made to the campaign committee of the elected officer.
 - 2) Loans made by a Board member's spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, parent-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, nephew, niece, aunt, uncle, or first cousin, or the spouse of any such persons, provided that the person making the loan is not acting as an agent or intermediary for any person not otherwise exempted under Government Code section 87460.
 - 3) Loans made, or offered in writing, before January 1, 1998.
- 4) c. Nothing in this section shall exempt any person from any other provision of Title 9 of the Government Code (the Political Reform Act of 1974). (2 CCR 18730)

5. Personal Loans

- a. Except as set forth in subdivision G.5.b. below, a personal loan received by any person holding a Designated Position shall become a gift to the designated employee for the purposes of this section in the following circumstances: (2 CCR 18730)
 - 1) If the loan has a defined date or dates for repayment, when the statute of limitations for filing an action for default has expired.
 - 2) If the loan has no defined date or dates for repayment, when one year has elapsed from the later of the following:
 - a) The date the loan was made.
 - b) The date the last payment of one hundred dollars (\$100) or more was made on the loan.
 - c) The date upon which the debtor has made payments on the loan aggregating to less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) during the previous 12 months.
- b. This section shall not apply to the following types of loans: (2 CCR 18730)
 - 1) A loan made to the campaign committee of an elected officer or a candidate for elective office.

- 2) A loan that would otherwise not be a gift as defined in Title 9 of the Government Code (the Political Reform Act of 1974).
- 3) A loan that would otherwise be a gift as set forth under G.subdivision 5.a. above, but on which the creditor has taken reasonable action to collect the balance due.
- 4) A loan that would otherwise be a gift as set forth under subdivision G.5.a. above, but on which the creditor, based on reasonable business considerations, has not undertaken collection action. Except in a criminal action, a creditor who claims that a loan is not a gift on the basis of this paragraph has the burden of proving that the decision for not taking collection action was based on reasonable business considerations.
- 5) A loan made to a debtor who has filed for bankruptcy and the loan is ultimately discharged in bankruptcy.
- c. Nothing in this section shall exempt any person from any other provisions of Title 9 of the Government Code (the Political Reform Act of 1974). (2 CCR 18730)

H. CONFLICT OF INTEREST FROM CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS

To avoid improper influence over the Board's decision-making involving the issuance of a license, permit, or other entitlements for use, including a contract, any District officer shall comply with Government Code section 84308, including the following: (Government Code 84308)

- 1. A District officer is prohibited from accepting, soliciting, or directing a contribution of more than \$250 from any party or participant to a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use, including a contract, or from that person's agent, while the proceeding is pending before the Board and for 12 months following the date a final decision is rendered in the proceeding, if the District officer knows or has reason to know that the party or participant has a financial interest in the Board's decision.
- 2. A District officer who received a contribution of more than \$250 from a party or participant in the preceding 12 months shall disclose that fact on the record of the proceeding prior to the Board rendering a decision in the proceeding. If the District officer willfully or knowingly received the contribution and knows or has reason to know that the participant has a financial interest in the Board's decision, he/she shall not make, not participate in making, or in any way attempt to use the official position to influence the Board's decision.
- 3. A District officer who receives a contribution that would otherwise require disqualification as described in H.2. above may participate in the proceeding if the contribution is returned within 30 days from the time he/she knows or should have known about the contribution and the proceeding.

4. A District officer who unknowingly accepts, solicits, or directs a contribution of more than \$250 during the 12 months after the date of the Board's final decision on the proceeding may cure the violation by returning the contribution, or the portion exceeding \$250, within 14 days of accepting, soliciting, or directing the contribution, provided the District officer did not knowingly or willfully accept, solicit, or direct the prohibited contribution. The District officer shall maintain records of curing the violation.

The provisions in Government Code section 84308 as specified above do not apply to labor contracts, competitively bid contracts, and personal employment contracts. (Government Code 84308)

I. <u>DISQUALIFICATION</u>

- 1. <u>Disqualifying Financial Interests</u>. Persons holding Designated Positions must disqualify themselves from making or participating in the making of any decisions or using their official positions to influence the making of any decision which will have a reasonably foreseeable material financial effect, distinguishable from its effect on the public generally on the official or a member of his or her immediate family or on: (2 CCR 18730)
 - a. Any business entity in which the designated person has a direct or indirect investment worth two thousand dollars (\$2,000) or more;
 - b. Any real property in which the designated person has a direct or indirect interest worth two thousand dollars (\$2,000) or more;
 - c. Any source of income, other than gifts and other than loans by a commercial lending institution in the regular course of business on terms available to the public without regard to official status, aggregating five hundred dollars (\$500) or more in value provided to, received by or promised to the designated person within 12 months prior to the time when the decision is made;
 - d. Any business entity in which the designated person is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or holds any position of management; or
 - e. Any donor of, or any intermediary or agent for a donor of, a gift or gifts aggregating exceeding the limitation specified in Government Code section 89503 and California Code of Regulations, Title 2, section 18730, provided to, received by, or promised to the designated person within 12 months prior to the time when the decision is made.
- 2. <u>Legally Required Participation</u>. No person holding a Designated Position shall be prevented from making or participating in the making of any decision to the extent his or her participation is legally required for the decision to be made. (2 CCR 18730) The fact that the vote of a designated person who is on a voting body is needed to break a tie does not make his or her participationng legally required for purposes of this section. (2 CCR 18730)

3. <u>Disclosure of Disqualifying Financial Interest</u>. When a person in a Designated Position determines that he/she should not make a governmental decision because the employee has a disqualifying interest in it, the determination not to act may be accompanied by disclosure of the disqualifying interest. (2 CCR 18730)

J. <u>DEFINITION OF TERMS</u>

Except as otherwise provided in this board bylaw, the definitions contained in the Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code section 81000, et seq., and any regulations adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission (2 CCR 18110, et seq.) pursuant to the Act, are incorporated herein and this Conflict of Interest Code shall be interpreted in a manner consistent therewith. (2 CCR 18730)

K. ASSISTANCE OF THE COMMISSION AND COUNSEL

Any person in a Designated Position who is unsure of the duties under this Conflict of Interest Code may request assistance from the FPPC pursuant to Government Code section 83114 and Sections 18329 and 18329.5, Title 2, California Code of Regulations or the District's legal counsel, provided that nothing in this section requires the District's legal counsel to issue any formal or informal opinion. (2 CCR 18730)

L. VIOLATIONS

This Conflict of Interest Code has the force and effect of law. Persons in Designated Positions who violate any provision of this Conflict of Interest Code are subject to the administrative, criminal, and civil sanctions provided in the Political Reform Act, Sections 81000-91014. In addition, a decision in relation to which a violation of the disqualification provisions of this Conflict of Interest Code or of Government Code section 87100 has occurred may be set aside as void pursuant to Government Code section 91003. (2 CCR 18730)

Designated Positions

Employees determined to hold positions subject to the Conflict of Interest Code will be organized into three categories. Reporting requirements will then be determined by the category into which a specific position has been designated.

The following three categories have been identified pursuant to law:

<u>Category One:</u> Positions that have authority to vote on a matter, appoint a person or obligate or commit the agency to a course of action, or authorized to bind the agency into a contractual agreement.

<u>Category Two:</u> Positions with significant authority to negotiate decisions on behalf of the agency with little review.

<u>Category Three:</u> Positions that advise or make recommendations to key decision-makers and conduct substantive research or investigation that requires the exercise of judgment on the part of the employee and that influences decisions on behalf of the agency without significant review.

A. REPORTABLE INTERESTS

An investment, interest in real property, business position, or income, is reportable if the business entity in which the investment or business position is held, the interest in real property or income or source of income may foreseeably be affected materially by any decision made or participated in by the person holding a Designated Position.

B. DESIGNATED POSITIONS IN CATEGORY ONE MUST REPORT

1. Interests in real property located in whole or in part within or within two miles of the boundaries of the District including any leasehold, beneficial or ownership interest or option to acquire such interest in real property, if the fair market value of the interest is \$2,000 or more. "Interest in real property" includes interest held by an individual, a business entity, or a share or interest in real property of any business entity or trust in which a designated person or his or her immediate family owns directly, indirectly or beneficially, a ten percent interest or greater. Generally, a residence, such as a home or vacation cabin, used as a personal residence of the person holding the Designated Position, need not be reported. However, a residence for which the designated person claims a business deduction for income tax purposes may be reportable.

2. Investments in, business positions with, and income from the business entities which are contractors or subcontractors, which are engaged, foreseeably may be engaged, or have been engaged within the previous two year period, in the performance of building, construction, and/or design with the District.

- 3. Investments in, business positions with, and income from persons or business entities engaged in the acquisition or disposal of real property within the District.
 - "Investment" includes any financial interest in or security issued by a business entity, including, but not limited to, common stock, preferred stock, rights, warrants, options, debt instruments and any partnership interest or other ownership interest. Investments of any individual also include a pro rata share of investments of any business entity or trust in which a designated person or his or her immediate family owns directly, indirectly or beneficially a ten percent interest or greater.

"Investment" does not include bank accounts, savings accounts, and money market accounts, shares in a credit union, any insurance policy, annuities, retirement accounts invested in non-reportable interests, interest in a diversified mutual fund registered with the Securities Exchange Commission under the Investment Company Act of 1940 defined benefit pension plans and profit sharing plans qualified under Internal Revenue Code section 401(a), or any bond or other debt instrument issued by any government or governmental agency.

No investment or interest in real property is reportable unless its fair market value exceeds \$2,000. No source of income is reportable unless the income received by or promised to the public official aggregates \$500 or more in value, or \$50 or more if a gift, during the preceding twelve (12) month reporting period.

C. DESIGNATED POSITIONS IN CATEGORY TWO MUST REPORT

Investments in, business positions with, and income from business entities which are doing business with the District, foreseeably may do business with the District, or have done business with the District at any time during the two years prior to the filing of the statement, which manufacture or sell materials, commodities, supplies, books, machinery, vehicles or equipment of the type utilized by the District. Investments include interests described in Category One.

D. <u>DESIGNATED POSITIONS IN CATEGORY THREE MUST REPORT</u>

Investments in, business positions with, and income from business entities which are doing business with the District, foreseeably may do business with the District, or have done business with the District at any time during the two years prior to the filing of the statement, which are contractors or subcontractors, engaged in the performance of work or services of the type utilized by the District. Investments include the interests described in Category One.

DISCUSSION:

Gizmos offers over 500 virtual simulations and STEM Cases that foster student experimentation and inquiry aligned to the Next Generation Science Standards. Students can ask questions, observe results, and draw conclusions, gaining a deeper understanding of topics. Teachers gain access to research-backed content and inquiry-driven lessons that support the Science and Engineering Practices. These lessons are also utilized by our teachers for intervention purposes. Gizmos provides embedded professional development and resources in its digital platform, and the contract gives us access to in-person or webinar-based professional learning opportunities for our teachers for each year of the contract.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The fiscal impact for a three-year contract with ExploreLearning Gizmos is \$117,369 over three years, to be included in the Curriculum, Instruction and Accountability budget. This reflects a cost savings of \$13,041 over three years.

Approve the Provisional Internship Permits for the recommended teaching candidates, as submitted.

Agenda Item: M 4

DISCUSSION:

The Provisional Internship Permit (PIP) is available when the employing agency knows that there will be a teacher vacancy yet is unable to recruit a suitable candidate. The expectations of the employer and the employee are higher since this individual will be the teacher of record and should be on a credential track. The focus of the document is meeting subject matter competency. Once a candidate completes subject matter competency, the candidate can be employed on a document such as a District Internship Credential. Candidate requirements include the following: (1) Bachelor's degree or higher; (2) passage of the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST); and (3) specific course work or experience, explained in detail on the Provisional Internship Permit information leaflet.

As required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC), employing agencies offering employment to a candidate on a Provisional Internship Permit are required to: (1) conduct a diligent search for a suitable credentialed teacher or qualified internship teacher; (2) provide the PIP holder with orientation, guidance, and assistance as specified in Title 5 Section 80026.5 of the California Code of Regulations; (3) assist the PIP holder in developing a personalized plan (kept on file at the local level) through an agency-defined assessment leading to completion of subject matter competence; and (4) counsel the PIP holder to enroll in subject matter training. Clovis Unified School District administration hereby declares that a diligent search was conducted for suitable credentialed teachers or qualified internship teachers. Upon Board approval, District administration asserts that steps 2-4, as outlined above, will be completed.

School districts submitting Provisional Internship Permit requests must include verification that a notice of intent to employ the applicants in the identified positions was made public. The public notice must include the following information: (1) the name of the applicant(s); (2) the assignment in which the applicant(s) will be employed including subject(s), grade level(s), and school site; and (3) a statement that the applicant(s) will be employed on the basis of a Provisional Internship Permit. Clovis Unified intends to submit a Provisional Internship Permit request for the following teacher candidates, contingent upon administration and Board approval:

A Provisional Internship Permit shall be issued for one year and may not be renewed.

The permit request must include a signed statement from the Superintendent, or designee, that the item was acted upon favorably. SUMMARY

Under general direction, plans, organizes and supervises the operational and technical duties of the Purchasing Department. Serves in a lead capacity to provide assistance, support and resolution to routine matters concerning Warehouse and Graphic Arts departments. Supports the educational process through collaboration and communication with management, district departments, school sites, outside agencies, vendors and other personnel to coordinate activities, resolve issues or concerns, exchange information and accomplish District and department goals. Responsible for applying seasoned knowledge to purchasing principles and practices for effective program management.

DISTINGUISHING CAREER FEATURES

The Purchasing Supervisor performs duties of a senior-level Buyer with additional breadth coordinating, leading and supervising purchasing functions. To advance to this position, an individual must demonstrate in depth and expert knowledge of public procurement principles and practices, including public works and federal procurement regulations. Prospective incumbents must have prior supervisory experience or considerable supervisory or management training.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assists the Director in supporting operational and routine activities for the Warehouse and Graphic Arts departments. Participates in the development and administration of the Purchasing, Warehouse and Graphic Arts budgets. Forecasts additional funds, processes expense transfers and budget updates as directed.
- Plan, organize, and supervise the daily operations of the Purchasing Department to provide timely delivery of high-quality, cost-effective materials and services to students, staff, sites, and departments.
- Participates in ensuring all purchases support the District's Vision, Mission and Philosophies and are made in accordance with applicable laws, codes, policies, and budgetary guidelines.
- Train, supervise and evaluate the performance of assigned staff. Provide clear, Purchasing Supervisor

constructive feedback to improve staff effectiveness. Plan, coordinate, and arrange for appropriate training or professional learning. Recommend disciplinary and other personnel related action if necessary.

- Provide technical expertise, training, and assistance to District personnel regarding purchasing policies, procedures, and requirements. Serve as an expert resource for questions regarding purchasing, budgets, commodities, e-procurement, online bid software, vendor relations and related information.
- Regularly, reviews trends in material and supply usage. Adjusts re-order points and cycles to comply with needs.
- Facilitates and prepares bid documents and requests for proposals including bids involving construction, maintenance, labor, materials, and project contracts. Works with appropriate staff, architects, engineers, or consultants to obtain information required to prepare and distribute bid specifications. Reviews and tabulates bid responses for bid law compliance and recommends bid awards. Prepares and manages contracts.
- In collaboration with district staff and vendors, develops uniformity and quality specifications to establish, update and maintain District standards for goods and services.
- May prepare documentation and communication materials to convey and uphold standards.
- Responsible for contractor pre-qualification and CUPCCAA processes including review of compliance with applicable laws, policies, procedures, and recognized standards.
- In collaboration with other departments, oversees the district's vendor database. Establishes and maintains new vendor requirements. Researches, vets, contacts, and selects potential vendors to receive proposals. Conveys District standards and expectations. Independently, or in partnership with others, resolves vendor discrepancies and disputes.
- In support of educating students, regularly participates in the development of goals and objectives for the District and department. Identifies opportunities for change and improvements and recommends implementation procedures.
- Periodically studies information and document flow through the Purchasing department. Suggests improvements that expedite decisions and purchasing activity.
- Performs and manages activities concerning obsolete personal property including but not limited to Surplus and E-Waste.
- May serve on behalf of the Director in his / her absence.
- Performs other duties as assigned that support the overall objective of the position and

department.

QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge and Skills: The position requires comprehensive knowledge of procedures used in contracting for the purchase of equipment, goods, supplies and services. Requires thorough knowledge of Education Code, Public Contract Code, Government Code, Code of Federal Regulations, as well as State of California public works requirements. Requires knowledge of the specification development process. Requires a working knowledge of computer-aided purchasing and purchase order systems as well as modern office productivity software, proprietary business software used by the District, and the internet. Requires working knowledge of capital and noncapital assets. Requires extensive knowledge in Public Works (Construction) bid law processes, including contract language and bond requirements. Requires a working knowledge of inventory management, including economic reorder points, accounting and inventory... Requires well-developed skill using the English language, grammar, spelling, punctuation, proofreading/editing, to prepare bid documents and professional correspondence, forms, manuals, training materials and reports. Requires well developed communication skills to convey technical information to internal and external stakeholders.. Requires working knowledge of District organization, operations, policies and objectives.. Requires sufficient math skills to compute sums, fractions, decimals, averages, trends, and ratios. Requires leadership skills and thorough knowledge of the practices and principles of effectively supervising staff.

Abilities: Requires the ability to carry out the essential functions of the position. Requires the ability to set up and execute processes and procedures for developing bid specifications and bidding processes. Requires the ability to organize, prioritize, and maintain workload for the successful operation of the department. Requires the ability to use a l computer to access and enter information onto established data entry screens, format and produce computer- generated and typewritten documents, and research information stored on databases or internet. Must be able to troubleshoot purchasing system problems. Must be able to supervise and lead staff in a manner which encourages high morale and efficiency. Must be able to establish harmonious and effective work relationships with departments and outside vendors.

Physical Abilities: The position incumbent must be able to function indoors in an office environment engaged in work of primarily a sedentary nature. Requires ambulatory ability to sit for extended periods of time, to utilize computers and peripheral equipment, accomplish other desktop work, and to move to various campus locations. Requires the ability to use vision to read printed materials. Requires auditory ability to carry on conversations in person and over the phone. Requires the ability to retrieve work materials from overhead, waist, and ground level files. Requires manual and finger dexterity to write, use a pointing device and keyboard at an advanced rate, operate a computer, and to operate other standardized office equipment, constantly requiring repetitive motions.

Education and Experience: The position requires a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college with major course work in purchasing, materials management, business

administration, or a related field plus 3 years of increasingly responsible supervisory purchasing, materials management, and distribution experience in a multi-site educational institution or similar public service agency. Additional relevant experience may substitute for higher education.

The Governor's Enacted Budget for 2023-24 district's received 8.22% COLA for the LCFF funding formula. The 2023-24 budget and excess reserves are funding the proposed 5.5% increase for the CSEA Operations Unit.

The District's General Fund reserve is projected to be 18.46% for 2023-24, as of the Board approved Third Quarter budget. The District reviews the current budget and five subsequent budgets (5 years) to determine our ability to afford any compensation increases. Based on this multi-year projection, that includes all future projected revenues and expenditures known at this time, the District's reserve is not projected to drop below 11.3%. The projected reserve includes committed and unassigned portions of the ending fund balance.

Yes, this will increase the District's operating deficit. However, it should be noted, the District has an 18.46% reserve projected for Third Quarter of the 2023-24 fiscal year budget. Given the current financial information and multi-year projection, the District is projecting a 18.28% for 23-24 after considering the proposed settlement for CSEA Operations unit, 15.88% for 24-25, 13.23% for 25-26, and 11.3% for 26-27. These reserve percentages were calculated taking the proposed, increased salary schedule into consideration. This reserve level is well above the State required 2% and exceeds the Clovis Unified Board approved minimum reserve of 10%.

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt Resolution No. 3997 ordering an election to authorize the issuance of \$400 million of general obligation school bonds, establishing specification of the election order and requesting consolidation with the November 5, 2024, Statewide general election to be conducted under Proposition 39 and its related legislation. (TWO-THIRDS VOTE REQUIRED).

DISCUSSION:

The District currently has unmet school facility needs and must identify a funding source to ensure school repairs, modernization and construction projects can occur. Earlier this year, a committee of citizens convened to study the District's capital facility program. This group spent six months studying City and County growth plans, revisiting our Facility Audits and Master Plan, and examining available financial resources for school facility repairs, maintenance and growth. At the conclusion of this study, the group reported to the CUSD Governing Board on June 12, 2024, with their determination that a new bond measure was needed on the November 5, 2024, ballot.

November 5, 2024, is the date of the Statewide general election, and also is an election date at which local bond measures that provide facilities funding can be placed on the ballot. In order to appear on the November 5, 2024, ballot, an adopted Resolution Calling Bond Election must be filed with the Fresno County Elections official at least 88 days prior to the election date.

The attached Resolution provided for Board consideration has been prepared in accordance with all legal requirements and presents a \$400 million bond measure to District voters under Proposition 39 (55% vote) for the purpose of financing projects. The District also requests that the County Elections Official consider assigning the item as Measure A given its historical use in prior ballot measures of the District.

In order to call the election, the resolution must have a two-thirds vote of the Board (for a seven-seated member Board, five yes votes are required).

FISCAL IMPACT:

None to the General Fund. If the bond measure receives a 55% or greater affirmative vote, the District will

be able to issue bonds and apply the proceeds to finance much-needed school facilities improvement
projects. Costs of issuance are payable from bond proceeds.

RESOLUTION NO. 3997

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ORDERING AN ELECTION TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF SCHOOL BONDS, ESTABLISHING SPECIFICATIONS OF THE ELECTION ORDER, AND REQUESTING CONSOLIDATION WITH OTHER ELECTIONS OCCURRING ON NOVEMBER 5, 2024

WHEREAS, the Clovis Unified School District (the "District") in Fresno County (the "County"), State of California (the "State"), is committed to providing quality education to its students; and

WHEREAS, the District's facilities continue to be in need of construction and modernization including repairs, upgrades, and safety improvements in order to provide the education District students deserve in a safe and modern environment; and

WHEREAS, education funding derived from the State is inadequate to address the District's facilities needs and a local funding source such as proceeds of general obligation bonds is needed to enable the District to provide said facilities for its present and future students; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the District (the "Board") has determined that it is necessary to address the foregoing concerns, among others, to ensure that its schools are upgraded, repaired, improved and equipped; and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2000, the voters of the State of California approved Proposition 39 ("Proposition 39"), which amended Articles XIIIA of the California Constitution ("Article XIIIA") to allow for the levy of *ad valorem* property taxes for the payment of bonded indebtedness of a school district, community college district or county office of education approved by at least 55 percent of the voters voting on such proposition; and

WHEREAS, upon the passage of Proposition 39, the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bond Act of 2000, being California Education Code Section 15264 and following (the "Act"), became operative; and

WHEREAS, in order to address the facilities needs of the District as described herein, in the judgment of the Board, it is advisable to call an election pursuant to the Act to submit to the electors of the District the question whether bonds of the District shall be issued and sold pursuant to the authority of Article XVI Section 18 of the California Constitution and Article XIIIA

(together with the Act, the "Law") for the purposes authorized by the Law and as described more particularly in Appendix A hereto (the "Full Text of Bond Measure"); and

WHEREAS, under the Act, the election may be ordered at a primary or general election, a regularly scheduled local election at which all of the electors of the District are entitled to vote, or a statewide special election, upon a two-thirds vote of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to call an election in the District pursuant to the Law on November 5, 2024, which is the date of the statewide general election, and pursuant to Education Code Section 15121 and Elections Code Section 10400 and following, to request consolidation with any and all other elections held in the District on such date, and to request the Fresno County Registrar of Voters (the "County Registrar") to perform election services for the District; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the calling of a bond election and in accordance with Education Code Section 15100 subparagraph (c), the Board has obtained reasonable and informed projections of assessed property valuations that take into consideration projections of assessed property valuations made by the County assessor, if any have been made available by the assessor; and

WHEREAS, furthermore, the Board has examined the District's currently outstanding bonded indebtedness and the related cumulative tax levy per \$100,000 of assessed value on the fiscal year 2023-24 tax roll, and based on reasonable assessed valuation growth estimates, the scheduled amortization of outstanding bonds and other bond structuring factors, it reasonably projects that bonds issued pursuant to this measure will extend but not increase the aggregate tax rate supporting outstanding District general obligation bonds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to United States Income Tax Regulations Section 1.150-2, the Board desires to declare its official intention at this time that if the measure submitted to voters hereunder is successful and bonds are issued pursuant to such measure, that it intends to reimburse from said bond proceeds any expenditures made by the District prior to the date of issuance of said bonds for the purposes described in the measure; and

WHEREAS, the District's bond measures have historically been assigned the measure designation "A" since the year 1986, and as such, the Board includes in this Resolution in Section 16 a request to the Fresno County Registrar to assign the measure designation "A" to the bond measure provided for herein; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees has reviewed and approves the following:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. Call for Election. The Board hereby orders an election and submits to the electors of the District the question of whether general obligation bonds of the District shall be issued and sold in the maximum principal amount of \$400,000,000 for the purposes described in the ballot measure approved under Section 4 and attached hereto as <u>Appendix A</u> (Full Text of Bond Measure) and <u>Appendix B</u> (Abbreviated Text of Bond Measure), and paying all costs incident thereto. This Resolution constitutes the order of the District to call such election and shall constitute the "specifications of the election order" pursuant to Education Code Section 5322.

Section 3. Election Date. The date of the election shall be <u>November 5, 2024</u>, and such bond election shall be held solely within the boundaries of the District. The boundaries of the District have not changed since the District's last election.

Section 4. Purpose of Election; Ballot Measure. The purpose of the election shall be for the voters in the District to vote on a bond measure, a full copy of which is attached hereto as Appendix A and marked "Appendix A – Full Text of Bond Measure" (the "Full Text of the Measure"), containing the question of whether the District shall issue general obligation bonds for the purposes stated therein, together with the accountability requirements of Article XIIIA and the requirements of Section 15272 of the Act. The Full Text of the Measure, which commences with the heading "FULL TEXT OF BOND MEASURE" and includes all of the text thereafter on Appendix A, is requested to be printed in the voter information pamphlet provided to voters, with such measure designation as is assigned to the measure by the County elections official.

As required by Education Code Section 5322 and 15122, Elections Code Section 13247, and in accordance with Elections Code Section 13119, the abbreviated statement of the measure to appear on the ballot label is attached hereto as <u>Appendix B</u> and is marked as "Appendix B – Abbreviated Form of Bond Measure."

The President of the Board and the Superintendent are hereby separately authorized and directed to make any changes to the text of the bond measure as described herein to conform to any requirements of the Law or the County Registrar, to changes in applicable legal provisions, to address word count limitations, and upon the advice of its legal counsel. Any such changes shall be directed in writing by the Superintendent to the County Registrar.

Section 5. Authority for Election. The authority for ordering the election is contained in Section 15264 *et. seq.* of the Education Code, Article XVI Section 18(b) of the California Constitution and paragraph (b) subsection (3) of Article XIIIA. The authority for the specification of this election order is contained in Section 5322 of the Education Code. The vote passage requirement for the measure is least 55 percent of the voters voting on the measure.

Section 6. Proceeds for School Facilities Projects. The Board certifies that the proceeds from the sale of the bonds will be used only for the purposes specified in Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) as further specified in Appendix A, and not for any other purpose, including teacher and administrator salaries and other school operating expenses. Further, as required by Article XIIIA, the Board hereby certifies that it has evaluated safety, class size and information technology needs in developing the list of school facilities projects set forth in Appendix A.

Section 7. Covenants of the Board upon Approval of the Bonds by the Electorate; Accountability Measures. As required by Article XIIIA, Section 15278 of the Act, and Government Code Section 53410, in the event 55 percent of the voters voting in the District approve of the Bonds, the Board shall:

- (a) conduct an annual, independent performance audit to ensure that the funds have been expended only on the projects listed in Appendix A;
- (b) conduct an annual, independent financial audit of the proceeds from the sale of the Bonds until all of those proceeds have been expended for the school facilities projects listed in Appendix A;
- (c) establish and appoint members to an independent citizens' oversight committee in accordance with Sections 15278, 15280, and 15282 of the Act, which may be a committee that has been previously established and exists for a prior bond measure of the District, at the discretion of the Board;
- (d) apply the Bond proceeds only to the specific purposes stated in the ballot proposition;
- (e) cause the creation of accounts into which bond proceeds shall be deposited; and
- (f) cause the preparation of an annual report pursuant to Government Code Sections 53410 and 53411.

Section 8. State Matching Funds. The Board hereby finds that some of the projects identified on the Full Text of Measure may require state matching funds for completion. As such, the statement required by Education Code Section 15122.5 has been included in the Full Text of Measure attached hereto which shall be reproduced in the sample ballot.

Section 9. Delivery of this Resolution. The Clerk of the Board is hereby directed to send a copy of this Resolution to (1) the County Registrar, and (2) the Fresno County Clerk of the Board of Supervisors (the "Clerk of the Board") for purposes of consolidation pursuant to Elections Code Section 10403. The Resolution shall be received by the County Registrar and the Clerk of the Board no later than 88 days prior to the election date, unless otherwise permitted by law.

The County Registrar is hereby requested to print the full text of the ballot measure in the ballot materials as it appears on Appendix A hereto and to provide all required notices of the election and other notices related thereto.

Section 10. Consolidation of Election; Request to Provide Services. The County Registrar and the Fresno County Board of Supervisors are hereby requested to consolidate the election ordered hereby with any and all other elections to be held on November 5, 2024, within the District.

Pursuant to Section 5303 of the Education Code and Section 10002 of the Elections Code, the Board of Supervisors of Fresno County is requested to permit the County Registrar to render all services specified by Section 10418 of the Elections Code and other applicable law relating to the election, for which services the District agrees to reimburse Fresno County in full upon presentation of a bill from the County, such services to include the publication of a formal Notice of School Bond Election and the mailing of the sample ballot and tax rate statement (described in Section 9401 of the Elections Code). The County Registrar is requested to transmit this Resolution to County Counsel, in accordance with Elections Code Section 9500.

Section 11. Approval of Tax Rate Statement. Pursuant to Elections Code Section 9400 and following including as amended by Senate Bill 798 (chaptered October 10, 2023, and effective January 1, 2024), a tax rate statement has been prepared in the form attached hereto as Appendix C, which form of Tax Rate Statement is hereby approved for inclusion in the sample ballot. The President of the Board, the Superintendent, or any written designee of the foregoing, are hereby separately authorized and directed to execute the tax rate statement, and to file said Statement with the County Registrar, in accordance with Section 9 hereof.

Section 12. Ballot Arguments. As provided in Elections Code Section 9501, any and all members of this Board are hereby authorized to (but not required nor directed to) act as an author of any ballot argument prepared in connection with the election, including a rebuttal argument, each of which if filed shall be filed within the time frame established by the County Registrar.

Section 13. Maturity Limit of Bonds; Covenant Regarding Maximum Term. The Bonds may be issued in one or more series by the District from time to time. The District covenants that the term of each series of the Bonds will not extend longer than 25 years from the date of issuance. The Bonds shall be issued under the Act, under the provisions of Section 53506 *et seq.* of the California Government Code, or under any other provision of law authorizing the issuance of general obligation bonds by school districts.

Section 14. Estimates Included in Ballot Materials. The measure and related tax rate statement authorized by this Resolution includes certain information which is based upon reasonable assumptions and current expectations, which include information with respect to the amount of money required to repay issued bonds, the estimated rate of the approved tax levy, and the duration through which the proposed tax levy supporting bond repayment will be levied and collected.

In particular, in connection with this bond measure, the District expects that bonds issued pursuant to this measure will not result in an increase to the rate of the tax levy for the District's currently outstanding general obligation bonds, in the aggregate, from the levy placed on the 2023-24 property tax roll (\$155.35 per \$100,000 of assessed value), which is the most recently available tax rate due at the time of adoption of this Resolution. In connection with this current expectation, the District has examined the debt service requirements due on its previously issued and outstanding voter-approved general obligation bonds, the District's fiscal year 2023-24 assessed value and the future projected assessed value taking into account reasonable assessed value growth estimates. Due to the currently scheduled payment of outstanding bonds, and the expectation that tax levies required for bonds issued pursuant to this measure will commence in fiscal year 2024-25, the District expects that this bond measure will not increase current tax rates in the aggregate. The period through which the tax rate will apply is through the final maturity date of the bonds approved by this measure (which is expected to be a longer duration than existing debt), as more particularly identified in the Tax Rate Statement set forth in Appendix C hereto.

Any estimates and expectations in this Resolution and in the appendices hereto have been provided by the District in good faith based upon information currently available to the District, but such items depend on numerous factors which are subject to variation and change over the term of the District's overall facilities and bond financing plan. General obligation bonds are secured by a tax levy which in accordance with State law is unlimited as to rate or amount. As such, although provided in good faith and based on information currently known to the District, the estimates and approximations provided with this bond measure are not intended to be additional restrictions on the District's bond program, bond issuances and tax rate, and, other than the total principal amount of bonds authorized to be issued by the bond measure, shall not represent legal maximums or additional limitations on bond issuance, including on the tax levy securing the bonds or other structuring and repayment terms.

Finally, the abbreviated and condensed statement of the bond measure set forth in Appendix B, limited by State law to 75 words or less, does not limit the scope and broader and more complete meaning provided in the Full Text of Bond Measure, set forth in Appendix A, and references herein to spending bond funds locally means spending bond funds on local schools and related facilities.

Section 15. Joint/Community Use. Using funds from the Bonds, the District may enter into agreements with the City of Fresno, the City of Clovis, the County of Fresno or other agencies or nonprofit organizations for joint use of school facilities in accordance with State law. The District may seek State grant or matching funds for eligible joint-use projects as permitted by law, and Bond funds may to be used to fund all or a portion of the share for such eligible joint-use projects as the Board shall determine.

Section 16. Request for Measure "A" Designation. The District has been assigned the measure designation "A" on past measures, since the year 1986. At the time that the County Registrar assigns measure designations pursuant to Elections Code Section 13116 to measures appearing on the November 5, 2024, ballot, the District respectfully requests, for consistency with its voters and to avoid voter confusion, that the bond measure called by this Resolution be designated by the letter "A".

Section 17. Reimbursement. Pursuant to federal tax law, particularly United States Income Tax Regulations Section 1.150-2, the District hereby declares that it may (i) pay certain costs of the projects listed in <u>Appendix A</u> prior to the date of issuance of bonds and, in such case,

(ii) intends to use a portion of the proceeds of bonds for reimbursement of said expenditures for the projects that are paid before the date of issuance of bonds.

Section 18. Official Actions. The President of the Board and the Superintendent are hereby separately authorized and directed to execute and deliver to County officials any directions, requisitions or other writings, and to make any changes to the texts of the measure as described herein and in the tax rate statement, to conform to any legal requirements or the County Registrar, in order to cause the election to be held and conducted in the District.

Section 19. Effective Date. This resolution shall take effect on and after its adoption.

FULL TEXT OF BOND MEASURE

The full text of bond measure to be printed in the election material begins below the following line. Letter designation of measure is requested to be assigned and input into applicable blanks by the County Registrar.

CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT MEASURE _____ FULL TEXT OF BOND MEASURE

BOND AUTHORIZATION

By approval of this measure by at least 55 percent of the registered voters voting on the measure, the Clovis Unified School District will be authorized to issue and sell bonds of up to \$400 million in aggregate principal amount at interest rates not to exceed legal limits and to provide financing for the specific types of local school facilities projects listed in the Bond Project List described below, subject to all the accountability requirements specified below.

ACCOUNTABILITY REQUIREMENTS

The provisions in this section are specifically included in this measure in order that the voters and taxpayers in the District may be assured that their money will be spent wisely. Expenditures to address specific facilities needs of the District will be in compliance with the requirements of Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3), of the State Constitution and the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000 (codified at Education Code Sections 15264 and following.)

Evaluation of Needs. The School Board hereby certifies that it has evaluated safety, class size reduction, enrollment growth, and information technology needs in developing the Bond Project List shown below.

Independent Citizens' Oversight Committee. Following approval of this measure, the Board of Trustees will establish an Independent Citizens' Oversight Committee (ICOC), under Education Code Sections 15278 and following, to ensure bond proceeds are expended only on the types of school facilities projects listed below. The committee will be established within 60 days of the date when the results of the election appear in the minutes of the School Board. A previously established and existing ICOC may at the School Board's option be appointed to serve as the ICOC for this measure.

Performance Audits. The School Board will conduct annual, independent performance audits to ensure that the bond proceeds have been expended only on the school facilities projects listed below.

Financial Audits. The School Board will conduct annual, independent financial audits of the bond proceeds until all of those proceeds have been spent for the school facilities projects listed below.

Government Code Accountability Requirements. As required by Section 53410 of the Government Code, (1) the specific purpose of the bonds is set forth in this Full Text of the Measure, (2) the proceeds from the sale of the bonds will be used only for the purposes specified in this measure, and not for any other purpose, (3) the proceeds of the bonds, when and if issued, will be deposited into a building fund to be held by the Fresno County Treasurer, as required by the California Education Code, and (4) the Superintendent of the District shall cause an annual report to be filed with the Board of Trustees of the District not later than January 1 of each year, which report shall contain pertinent information regarding the amount of funds collected and expended, as well as the status of the projects listed in this measure, as required by Sections 53410 and 53411 of the Government Code.

NO TEACHER OR ADMINISTRATOR SALARIES

Proceeds from the sale of bonds authorized by this measure shall be used only for the purposes specified in Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3), those being for the construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, or replacement of school facilities, including the furnishing and equipping of school facilities, and the acquisition or lease of school facilities, and not for any other purpose, including teacher and administrator salaries and other school operating expenses.

COVENANT REGARDING MAXIMUM BOND TERM

The bonds may be issued in one or more series. Each series of bonds authorized by this measure will not have a term that extends more than 25 years from the date of issuance.

STATE MATCHING FUNDS

The following statement is included in this measure pursuant to Education Code Section 15122.5: Approval of this measure does not guarantee that the proposed project or projects that are the subject of bonds under this measure will be funded beyond the local revenues generated by this measure. The District's proposal for the project or projects described below may assume the receipt of matching state funds, which, if available, could be subject to appropriation by the Legislature or approval of a statewide bond measure.

INFORMATION ABOUT ESTIMATES AND PROJECTIONS INCLUDED IN BALLOT

Voters are informed that any estimates or projections in the bond measure or ballot materials, including relating to estimated tax rates, the duration of issued bonds and related tax levies and collections are provided as informational only. Such amounts are estimates and are not maximum amounts or limitations on the terms of the bonds, the tax rate or duration of the tax supporting repayment of issued bonds. Such estimates depend on numerous variables which are subject to variation and change over the term of the District's overall facilities and bond financing plan, including but not limited to the amount of bonds issued and outstanding at any one time, the interest rates applicable to issued bonds, market conditions at the time of sale of the bonds, when bonds mature, timing of project needs and changes in assessed valuations in the District. In addition, the District expects that due to scheduled amortization of currently outstanding general obligation bonds, the expected timing of property tax levies required to amortize bonds issued pursuant to this measure (commencing in fiscal year 2025-26), and taking into account reasonable assessed valuation growth estimates, that if this measure is successful and

bonds are issued, the tax rate required to be levied for bonds pursuant to this measure will extend but not cause an increase in the aggregate tax rate that applied for District general obligation bonds from the rate placed on the 2023-24 property tax roll (which is the most current tax roll available at the time of placing this measure on the ballot). While such estimates and approximations are provided based on information currently available to the District and its current expectations, such estimates and approximations are not limitations or maximums on the terms of bonds or the related tax levies. In addition, the abbreviated and condensed statement of the bond measure presented to voters on the ballot label which is subject to a 75-word count limitation imposed by State law does not limit the full scope and broader, more complete meaning of the measure provided in this Full Text of Bond Measure and related ballot materials.

BOND PROJECT LIST

<u>Scope of Projects</u>. Bond proceeds will be expended on the modernization, renovation, expansion, acquisition, construction/reconstruction, rehabilitation, and/or replacement of school facilities of the Clovis Unified School District, including the furnishing and equipping of such facilities, at current and future sites and properties.

<u>School Facility Project List.</u> The items presented on the following list provide the types of projects authorized to be financed with the proceeds of bonds authorized by this measure. Specific examples included on this list which follow the broad type of project authorized are not intended to limit the broader and more general types of projects identified below and authorized by this measure. The types of projects authorized are:

- Acquire, Install and Implement School Safety and Security Upgrades, including security window film, surveillance systems/cameras, fire alarms, sprinkler systems, alarm systems, communication systems, public address systems, fencing and lighting.
- Constructing and Expanding Educational Facilities, including completion of a
 new educational complex and all related improvements for a complete new facility
 to serve students, teachers, staff and the community and deliver a complete
 educational program including career and vocational training, science, arts and
 athletics, resulting in expanding educational programs and capacity to prevent
 overcrowding, and further including construction and expansion of existing
 facilities and replacing temporary or portable classrooms with permanent or
 upgraded facilities.
- Upgrade, Modernize, Expand and Rehabilitate Aging School Facilities to Provide a Modern Educational Environment, including for classrooms, labs, career tech and training, college preparation, athletic, performing arts, cafeterias, kitchens and other educational and support facilities, including repairing and/or replacing interior finishes such as floors, paint, lighting, acquiring updated furnishings and equipment, updating restrooms, and providing outside learning or gathering areas including shade structures.
- Upgrades to Facilitate Up-To-Date Modern Technology and Access to Education, including installing all necessary infrastructure for connectivity and

security, providing technology equipment and devices and modern instructional equipment, software and hardware, and further including upgrade and equipping of facilities to be used for science and technology programs, including labs and project-based facilities.

- Ensure ADA Accessibility and Compliance With All Legal Requirements, including ensuring barrier free access, updates to restrooms, drinking fountains, and other facilities, and upgrades to ensure compliance with all applicable building and other legal codes and standards for school facilities.
- Improvements to School Grounds and Outdoor Equipment, including improvements/expansions to drop-off areas and parking, parking controls, improving and upgrading playgrounds, walkways and parking areas, replacement/repair of damaged or non-compliant playground equipment, acquire and install shade structures, signage, landscaping including drought-resistant landscaping, irrigation systems and lighting.
- Acquisition and Installation of Improvements That Ensure Energy Efficient Facilities, including windows, doors, flooring, insulation, lighting including control systems, roofing.
- Infrastructure Improvements and Expansions, including electrical, gas, utility, plumbing and sewer, including renewable energy systems.
- Renovation, Upgrades and Construction of P.E. and Athletic Facilities, including all related improvements to playgrounds, gymnasiums, tracks, fields, stadiums, aquatics, weight rooms and locker rooms, including furnishing and equipping, and all related improvements such as lighting, seating, bleachers and sound systems.

<u>Furnishing and Equipping; Incidental Expenses</u>. Each of the bond projects described in this Bond Project List include the costs of furnishing and equipping such facilities, and all costs which are incidental but directly related to the types of projects described above.

Examples of incidental costs include, but are not limited to: costs of design, engineering, architect and other professional services, facilities assessments, inspections, site preparation, utilities, landscaping, bond project construction management, administration and other planning and permitting, legal fees including fees relating to litigation (if any), accounting and similar costs; independent annual financial and performance audits; a customary construction contingency; demolition and disposal of existing structures; the costs of interim housing and storage during construction including relocation and construction costs incurred relating to interim facilities; rental or construction of storage facilities and other space on an interim basis for materials and other equipment and furnishings displaced during construction; costs of relocating facilities and equipment as needed in connection with the projects; interim classrooms and facilities for students, administrators, and school functions, including modular facilities; federal and statemandated safety upgrades; addressing unforeseen conditions revealed by construction/modernization and other necessary improvements required to comply with

existing building codes, including the Field Act; access requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act; and costs of the election.

Alternations to Scope; New Construction. The School Board is hereby authorized to alter the scope and nature of any of the specific projects described above as required or recommended by new conditions, discoveries or any other factors including economic factors that may become apparent during the course of planning, design and construction. In the event that the School Board determines that a modernization or renovation project is in the best interests of the District and it students to be undertaken as new construction based on cost or safety considerations or other compelling factors, this bond measure authorizes said project to be undertaken in whole or in part as new construction, including land acquisition, relocation and construction at a new or alternative site, and/or demolition and reconstruction and/or repurposing on the original site, including an expanded site, and all costs relating thereto. In addition, to accomplish any of the projects included on the above list, this measure authorizes the acquisition of real property, including necessary rights of ways or other real property interests.

<u>Interim Financing Included; Joint Use Projects Authorized</u>. Authorized projects include paying and/or prepaying interim or previously obtained financing for the types of projects included on the project list, such as bond anticipation notes and lease financings. Projects may also be undertaken on a joint use basis with other public entities.

Other Funding Sources. Approval of this bond measure does not guarantee that the proposed projects will be funded beyond the local revenues generated by the measure. The District's capital needs currently exceed the amount of bonds the voters are being asked to authorize. The District plans to pursue funds from other sources to advance the identified projects to the greatest extent possible. If matching funds from the State or any other source become available as a result of this measure, they will be used for and applied to projects identified on the Project List.

<u>Project List Not in Order of Priority; Unforeseen Circumstances</u>. The order in which particular projects are listed is not intended to suggest priority for funding or completion, and itemization of projects in the list above does not guarantee that all such projects will be undertaken. Project priorities will be determined by the Board of Trustees. The ability of the District to undertake and complete the listed projects is subject to numerous variables including the adequacy and availability of sufficient funding sources. The District is unable to anticipate all unforeseen circumstances which may prevent some of the projects listed above from being undertaken or completed.

Interpretation. The terms of this Bond Measure and the words used in the Bond Project List shall be interpreted broadly to effect the purpose of providing broad and clear authority for the officers and employees of the District to provide for the school facilities projects the District proposes to finance with the proceeds of the sale of bonds authorized by this proposition within the authority and scope provided by law, including Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution, Education Code Section 15000 *et seq.* and the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000. Words used in the Project List such as repair, improve, upgrade, expand, modernize, renovate, and reconfigure are used to describe school facilities projects in plain English but are not intended to expand the nature of such projects beyond what is authorized by State law. References to spending funds locally refers to spending funds on local schools and related facilities. The

Bond Project List does not authorize bond proceeds to be spent on current maintenance, operation or repairs.

<u>Severability</u>. The District Board hereby declares, and the voters by approving this Bond Measure concur, that every section and part of this bond proposition has independent value, and the District Board and the voters would have adopted each provision hereof regardless of every other provision hereof. Upon approval of this measure by the voters, should any part be found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid for any reason, all remaining parts hereof shall remain in full force and effect to the fullest extent allowed by law, and to this end the provisions of this bond measure are severable.

APPENDIX C

TAX RATE STATEMENT REGARDING PROPOSED CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS

An election will be held in the Clovis Unified School District (the "District") on November 5, 2024, to authorize the sale of up to \$400 million in bonds of the District to finance school facilities as described in the measure. If such bonds are authorized and sold, principal and interest on the bonds will be payable only from the proceeds of *ad valorem* tax levies made upon the taxable property in the District. The following information is provided in compliance with Sections 9400-9404 of the Elections Code of the State of California. Such information is based upon the best estimates and projections presently available from official sources, upon experience within the District, and other demonstrable factors.

Based upon the foregoing and projections of the District's assessed valuation, the following information is provided:

- 1. The best estimate of the average annual tax rate which would be required to be levied to fund this bond issue over the entire duration of the bond debt service, based on a projection of assessed valuations available at the time of filing of this statement, is \$46.50 per \$100,000 (or \$0.0465 per \$100) of assessed value. The final fiscal year in which the tax is anticipated to be collected is 2052-53.
- 2. The best estimate of the highest tax rate which would be required to be levied to fund this bond issue, based on a projection of assessed valuations available at the time of filing of this statement, is \$60 per \$100,000 (or \$0.06 per \$100) of assessed value. It is estimated that such rate would be levied starting in fiscal year 2032-33 and in certain years following.
- 3. The tax rates associated with the bonds to be issued pursuant to this measure combined with the District's outstanding bonds, based on a projection of assessed valuations, are estimated not to increase aggregate future tax rates above the current tax rate of \$155.35 per \$100,000 (or \$0.15535 per \$100) of assessed value.
- 4. The best estimate of the total debt service, including the principal and interest, that would be required to be repaid if all the bonds are issued and sold is approximately \$800 million.

Voters should note the estimated tax rate is based on the assessed value (not market value) of taxable property on the County's official tax rolls. Property owners should consult their own property tax bills and tax advisors to determine their property's assessed value and any applicable tax exemptions.

The attention of all voters is directed to the fact that the foregoing information is based upon projections and estimates only, which amounts are not maximum amounts and are not binding upon the District. The actual debt service, tax rates and the years in which they will apply may vary from those used to provide the estimates set forth above, due to

factors such as variations in the timing of bond sales, the par amount of bonds sold and market interest rates available at the time of each sale, actual assessed valuations over the term of the bonds, and other factors. The date and amount of bonds sold at any given time will be determined by the District based on the need for project funds and other considerations. The actual interest rates at which the bonds will be sold will depend on conditions in the bond market at the time of sale. Actual future assessed valuations will depend upon the amount and value of taxable property within the District as determined by the County Assessor in the annual assessment and the equalization process.

Adopt Resolution No. 3999 Declaring Intention to Convey an Easement to Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Hirayama Elementary School, APN 574-130-01T (TWO-THIRDS VOTE REQUIRED).

DISCUSSION:

Clovis Unified School District (District) owns the real property located between McKinley and Clinton avenues and Fowler and Armstrong avenues in the City of Fresno, County of Fresno, State of California and designated as a portion of APN 574-130-01T (Property). The District is in the process of constructing a new elementary school, Hirayama Elementary School, on the Property.

The purpose of the proposed Easement is to grant Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PGE) the right from time to time to excavate, construct, reconstruct, replace (of initial or any other size), remove, maintain, inspect, and use facilities and associated equipment for public utility purposes, including, but not limited to electric, gas, and communication facilities, together with a right of way therefore, on, over, and under the Easement areas as hereinafter set forth, and also ingress thereto and egress therefrom over and across the Property. The Easement will also grant PGE the right to use such portion of the Property contiguous to said Easement area as may be reasonably necessary in connection with the excavation, construction, reconstruction, replacement, removal, maintenance and inspection of said facilities.

The conveyance of the Easement referenced above is authorized by the California Education Code. Pursuant to Education Code section 17556, a school district governing board may dedicate or convey to any public corporation or private corporation engaged in the public utility business an easement to lay, construct, reconstruct, maintain, and operate water, sewer, gas, or storm drain pipes or ditches, electric or telephone lines, and access roads used in connection therewith, over and upon any land belonging to the school district, upon such terms and conditions as agreed to by the parties. Education Code section 17577 requires the governing board, by not less than a two-thirds vote of all of its board members, to adopt a resolution declaring its intention to dedicate or convey the easement and set a public hearing not less than 10 days thereafter on the question of making the conveyance.

The dedication and conveyance of the Easement pursuant to Education Code section 17556 et seq. is a two-step process. At this July 17, 2024, Board meeting, the Board will take action on the first step by adopting the proposed Resolution No. 3999 that is attached. By adopting Resolution No. 3999, the Board

would: (1) declare its intention to convey the Easement to PGE, which Easement is described in the attached Deed of Easement, and (2) set a public hearing to be held at the board meeting on August 7, 2024. Proposed Resolution No. 3999 must be adopted by at least a two-thirds vote of all of the Board Members and be signed by the Board Members or a majority thereof.

The Board's action for the second step is anticipated to occur at the Board meeting on August 7, 2024. At this Board meeting, the Board will: (1) hold the public hearing on the question of making the conveyance of the Easement to PGE; and (2) consider and adopt a resolution to approve the conveyance of the Easement to PGE.

RESOLUTION NO. 3999 BEFORE THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FRESNO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

IN THE MATTER OF DECLARING INTENTION TO CONVEY A PUBLIC UTILITY EASEMENT TO PACIFIC GAS & ELECTRIC AND SETTING OF PUBLIC HEARING

WHEREAS, Clovis Unified School District (District) owns the real property located between McKinley Avenue and Clinton Avenue, and Fowler Avenue and Armstrong Avenue in the City of Fresno, County of Fresno, State of California and designated as a portion of APN 574-130-01T (Property); and

WHEREAS, the District has undertaken a public works project to design and construct a new elementary school (Project) on the Property. The Project is anticipated to be completed by Fall 2024; and

WHEREAS, to connect gas, electricity, and other services to the Property, work is needed by Pacific Gas & Electric (PGE), a public utility, to excavate, construct, install and maintain certain facilities and equipment. PGE desires to acquire an easement over a portion of the Property for the purpose of excavating, constructing, reconstructing, replacing, removing, maintaining, inspecting, and using such facilities and equipment (Utility Improvement Purposes). The Deed of Easement and attached map (Easement Area) is set forth in the attached Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Easement Area is not now and will not at the time of the proposed delivery of possession and title to PGE be needed exclusively for classroom or other school purposes by the District; and

WHEREAS, the Utility Improvement Purposes to be carried out by PGE will benefit the District; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to transfer ownership of said Easement Area to PGE in that PGE will carry out the Utility Improvement Purposes; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code section 17556, a school district governing board may dedicate or convey to any public corporation or private corporation engaged in the public utility business an easement to lay, construct, reconstruct, maintain, and operate water, sewer, gas,

or storm drain pipes or ditches, electric or telephone lines, and access roads used in connection therewith, over and upon any land belonging to the school district, upon such terms and conditions as agreed to by the parties; and

WHEREAS, Education Code section 17557 requires the governing board, by not less than a two-thirds vote of all of its board members, to adopt a resolution declaring its intention to dedicate or convey the easement and set a public hearing not less than 10 days thereafter on the question of making the conveyance; and

WHEREAS, by this Resolution, the Board intends to declare its intention to convey the Easement Area to PGE, and to fix a date and time for the public hearing upon the question of making the conveyance of the Easement Area.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the District's Governing Board hereby:

- 1. Declares and adopts the foregoing recitals as true and correct.
- 2. Declares its intention to convey the Easement Area to PG&E for the Utility Improvement Purposes, such Easement Area as stated in Exhibit A and to be set forth in the Easement Deed along with such terms and conditions as agreed upon by the District and PGE.
- 3. Fixes the date and time of the public hearing upon the question of making the conveyance of the Easement Area as follows: No earlier than 6:45 p.m. on August 7, 2024, the Board shall hold a public hearing upon the question of making the proposed conveyance of the Easement Area to PGE. The meeting shall be held at the Board's place of meeting, Library Lecture Hall, Clovis North High School, 2770 E. International Avenue, Fresno, California.
- 4. The Superintendent or designee is authorized and directed to give notice of the adoption of this Resolution and of the time and place of holding the meeting at which the public hearing shall be conducted. The notice shall be given by posting copies of this Resolution and publishing as required by law.
- 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.



At its regular Board meeting on July 17, 2024, the Board will vote to adopt Resolution No. 3999, declaring its intention to convey a public utility easement to PGE and setting a public hearing to be held on August 7, 2024. Notice of the public hearing will be posted and published in accordance with Education Code section 17558. On August 7, 2024, the Board will hold a public hearing regarding the conveyance of the public

utility easement to PGE. No protest has been filed under Education Code section 17560.

At its regular Board meeting on July 17, 2024, the Board adopted Resolution No. 3999, declaring its intention to convey a public utility easement to PGE and setting a public hearing to be held on August 7, 2024. Notice of the public hearing was posted and published in accordance with Education Code section 17558. On August 7, 2024, the Board held a public hearing regarding the conveyance of the public utility easement to PGE; and

WHEREAS, Education Code section 17559 requires the governing board, by not less than a two-thirds vote of all of its board members, to adopt a resolution authorizing and directing the execution of a deed of dedication or conveyance of the property and deliver it. By this resolution, the Board intends to authorize and direct the Superintendent or designee to execute the deed of conveyance of the Property and deliver it to PGE; and

WHEREAS, no protest has been filed under Education Code section 17560.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the District's Governing Board hereby:

- 1. Declares and adopts the foregoing recitals as true and correct.
- 2. Pursuant to Education Code section 17556 et seq., conveys the Easement Area to PGE for the Utility Improvement Purposes, which Easement Area is set forth in Exhibit A.
- 3. Authorizes and directs the Superintendent or designee to execute and deliver to PGE the Easement Deed attached as Exhibit A or similar instrument(s), with such modifications thereto as the Superintendent or designee determines appropriate and agreed upon with PGE, to convey the Easement Area to PGE for the Utility Improvement Purposes.
- 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

hereinafter called Grantor, hereby grants to PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, a California corporation, hereinafter called Grantee, the right from time to time to excavate for, construct, reconstruct, replace (of initial or any other size), remove, maintain, inspect, and use facilities and associated equipment for public utility purposes, including, but not limited to electric, gas, and communication facilities, together with a right of way therefor, on, over, and under the easement area as hereinafter set forth, and also ingress thereto and egress therefrom, over and across the lands of Grantor situated in the City of Fresno, County of Fresno, State of California, described as follows:

The parcel of land conveyed by Woodside 06N, LP, a California limited partnership to Grantor by deed dated April 25, 2019 and recorded as Document No. 2019-0045079, Fresno County Records.

- The granting of this easement is an accommodation to PG&E's applicant requesting the extension of PG&E utility facilities to the applicant's property or project. Because this easement is an accommodation for a service extension to a single customer or group of customers, PG&E is not authorized to purchase any such easement.
- By granting this easement to PG&E, the easement area may be used to serve additional customers in the area and **may be used to install additional utility facilities.** Installation of any proposed facilities outside of this easement area will require an additional easement.
- Removal and/or pruning of trees or other vegetation on your property may be necessary for the installation of PG&E facilities. You have the option of having PG&E's contractors perform this work on your property, if available, or granting permission to PG&E's applicant or the applicant's contractor to perform this work. Additionally, in order to comply with California fire laws and safety orders, PG&E or its contractors will periodically perform vegetation maintenance activities on your property as provided for in this grant of easement in order to maintain proper clearances from energized electric lines or other facilities.
- The description of the easement location where PG&E utility facilities are to be installed across your property must be satisfactory to you.
- The California Public Utilities Commission has authorized PG&E's applicant to perform the installation of certain utility facilities for utility service. In addition to granting this easement to PG&E, your consent may be requested by the applicant, or applicant's contractor, to work on your property. Upon completion of the applicant's installation, the utility facilities will be inspected by PG&E. When the facility installation is determined to be acceptable the facilities will be conveyed to PG&E by its applicant.

By signing the Grant of Easement, you are acknowledging that you have read this disclosure and understand that you are voluntarily granting the easement to PG&E. 

DISCUSSION:

Description

ParentSquare is a communication platform that allows educators to consolidate multiple school-to-home communication methods into one easy-to-use portal for parents. Combining text, voice, email, direct message and internet options ParentSquare would allow the District to simplify communication with parents and create consistency across school sites and programs. This outcome would address feedback received over time from parents seeking easier ways to stay engaged with their child's school while also making it easier for staff to communicate. The platform also features translation capabilities to increase engagement with second language families as well as secure document delivery, a content management system, social media integration, attendance, reporting and online payment features.

For the above reasons, the District has been piloting (at no cost) this platform during the 2024 Summer Session and is poised to make a decision as to whether or not it is the right solution for Clovis Unified. Should outcomes of the current pilot be a recommendation to move forward, this item will be updated with additional information prior to the August 7, 2024, Governing Board meeting. If adopted, this platform could replace multiple existing platforms with similar functionality in use in the District currently.
