Annual Governing Board Report Summer School 2024

2024 Summer School

The summer of 2024 marked another successful summer school program. Students achieved growth in Language Acquisition, English Language Arts and math at the elementary level and completed necessary credit recovery or original credit courses at the high school level.

Improvements to summer school for 2024 included the following:

- Moving to a one elementary site per area model
- New curriculum and program design for sixth, seventh and eighth grade students
- A revision of the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) Manual
- Streamlining of the HR hiring templates
- The addition of leveled phonics instruction for grades kindergarten through fifth grade
- The refining of elementary pre- and post-assessments
- Secondary students had the opportunity to take online original credit courses in World Languages, PE, Art, Health and Social Science. These students took their classes through Clovis Online.

Looking to next year, the following improvements are planned:

- Continued revision of the SOP Manual
- Revision of Independent Study Art curriculum
- Continued revision of Health, U.S. History and World History curriculum
- Examination of the success of the online original credit courses

Summary of Programs

Elementary Summer School


The Elementary Summer School program provided intervention for 1,447 students in grades kindergarten through grade five with instruction aligned to California Content Standards in English Language Arts, Language Acquisition and Mathematics. The Curriculum, Instruction and Accountability department worked with elementary summer school sites to provide a coordinated program for the district's elementary students.

For the second year, the 2024 Summer School program included a Language Acquisition Block (LAB) for all students at all elementary sites, a program that benefits all students, but specifically the District's English Learner (EL) population, as these students were able to improve their skills while attending summer school in their area with their peers. We also introduced a leveled phonics curriculum to the English Language Arts program that required teachers pre-test students so summer school administrators could level those students for targeted daily instruction.

Secondary Summer School

Intermediate Academy

This year seventh and eighth graders needing extra academic support as well as sixth graders attended Alta Sierra where they participated in the AVID Summer Bridge Academy. This program was structured to "keep students connected to learning and to one another by providing rigorous learning opportunities that build community and spark joy." As the program is designed to support learning in all students and empower participants to explore what's possible in school, careers, and life, it was determined that sixth graders may also benefit from this program as they are transitioning to an intermediate campus in the fall. In the past, the seventh and eighth graders needing academic support to be successful attended summer school on the high school campuses. Secondary administrators made the recommendation to serve the intermediate students at different sites, resulting in the AVID Summer Bridge Academy.



Summary of Programs

Clovis Community Day School Intermediate Program

Summer school at CCDS was used as an intervention for those sixth, seventh and eighth grade students identified as being below grade level academically. As the goal of CCDS is to return students to their comprehensive sites, the summer program provided students the chance to remediate so they were eligible to return to their home campuses.

Traditional High School Program

Students completed both original credit for acceleration and credit recovery coursework. Students needing courses for original credit received instruction from credentialed teachers and attended classes in-person four days a week. Credit recovery coursework was provided through Edgenuity for intervention purposes and content delivery. There were 2,547 students enrolled in independent study courses and 1,999 enrolled in face-to-face courses. An additional 106 students were enrolled in credit recovery courses.

Online Original Credit Program

In its pilot year, the new Online Original Credit program saw 75 students earn credit for World Languages, PE, Art, Health and Social Science courses.



Summary of Programs

Multilingual Learner Supports

The summer school program served 449 EL students. Of those, 188 were Newcomer students, of which 98 were high school students.

Elementary EL students attended school at the designated site for their area. Each elementary site had three EL Teachers on Special Assignment (TOSAs) who worked with EL students in leveled small groups focusing on language acquisition in addition to the instruction they received in their grade level's Language Acquisition Block. EL TOSAs also worked with the summer school teachers, extending their learning with the LAB and strategies for working with EL students.

Middle school students grades six through eight all attended the AVID Summer Bridge Academy held at Alta Sierra. Of the 226 students who attended; 60 of those students were EL students, and of the 60, 13 of those students were Newcomers.

At the high school level, all three high school sites had one teacher designated for Newcomer support. These teachers supported students' language needs along with supporting their academic needs in classes they were taking for credit recovery. An EL second grader at Jefferson reported "I really didn't want to come to summer school, but I am glad I did because this was fun." Mountain View Summer school teacher Kaitlyn Chakerian said they had a very successful summer school!

Extended School Year

This year's Extended School Year program for special education served 896 students. Dry Creek and Cedarwood hosted our elementary students, Boris offered all of our Special Education pre-school programs, the Clovis North Educational Center held the junior high through high school programs, Adult Transition Program and Therapeutic Intervention Program were held at the Adult School, and our medically fragile students were served at the Garfield Center. These students were supported by 88 teachers and 359 para educators.

Career Technical Education Summer Academy

CUSD Career Technical teachers offered 12 three-week sessions for students in grades seven and eight at four comprehensive sites. The 215 students that participated in these programs became acquainted with the variety of CTE programs available to CUSD students.

Elementary Summer School

Overview:

This year's elementary program ran four weeks in length from Monday – Thursday, June 17th – July 11th, except for June 19th and July 4th. We moved to a model of one elementary school per area and one Expanded Learning Club site per area for the summer 2024 program. A total of five campuses served 1,447 students. The summer school programs for elementary were designed to provide students with targeted, meaningful, and engaging instruction for essential skills in English and math.

The five campuses that housed the 2024 elementary summer school were:

- Buchanan Area: Tarpey Elementary
- Clovis East Area: Temperance-Kutner Elementary
- Clovis High Area: Jefferson Elementary
- Clovis North Area: Mountain View Elementary
- Clovis West Area: Pinedale Elementary

Curriculum

The District TOSAs worked to create the curriculum for all elementary programs, and instruction was focused on meeting the needs of students by providing targeted instruction designed to support student learning.



Kindergarten Narrative

Kindergarten teachers reported that having a smaller class size in kindergarten allowed them to have more time with students to focus on the phonics curriculum. Students were able to focus within a small group and be better supported while learning phonics. Having Education Pathway students come in for additional support within Kinder classes was helpful to be able to support small groups.

Principals' Highlights

The Phonics for Reading was a good addition to the instructional program at summer school this year in the Buchanan area. Summer School allowed for much needed targeted intervention to prepare students for the upcoming school year.



Kindergarten Narrative

Smaller class sizes helped teachers work on phonics and phonemic awareness in a station setting. The math growth results provide evidence of the work teachers were able to do with the kindergarten students. The change to a longer school day from the kindergarten schedule will help students acclimate to first grade in the fall.

Principals' Highlights

Having all Clovis East area students on one campus rather than two allowed for a full-school feel in summer school. The camaraderie among teachers and students from the area was evident. The EL TOSAs were outstanding and both supported teachers in the classroom by pushing in and taking small groups of students. Teachers benefitted from watching the EL TOSAs model strategies in their classrooms.



Principal's Highlights

The Clovis Area Summer School at Jefferson Elementary focused heavily on improving student reading levels through phonics-based instruction. We embedded character instruction through daily positivity project lessons.



Kindergarten students gained skills in practicing letters and sounds, rotating in groups, and following directions.

Principals' Highlights

First grade teachers rewarded students with popsicle Thursdays for being safe on the playground and being respectful in and out of the classroom. In second grade, students learned about nouns, verbs, and adjectives around them through outdoor scavenger hunts. The third graders read *Because of Winn Dixie* and enjoyed watching the movie during the last day of summer school. Our fourth grade students learned about character traits by creating character trait story books. Fifth grade students worked on Growth Mindset and made bottle rockets and toothpick bridges as part of their science curriculum.



Kindergarten Narrative

Kindergarten teachers shared that students benefited from small group instruction – especially in reading. They also are better prepared for first grade after being in an all-day program (with the exception of Pinedale students who are in extended day program all year).

Principals' Highlights

Pinedale utilized a weekly ticket system to recognize students for perseverance. We also gave weekly prizes for perfect attendance. Students were treated to a magician show and Reptile Ron. Fresno Pacific University student teachers added support by being able to assist teachers with small group instruction.

Intermediate Summer School

Overview:

AVID Sumer Bridge Academy

This summer, the AVID Summer Bridge Academy at Alta Sierra Intermediate School focused on enhancing English Language Development skills for sixth, seventh and eighth graders. Students engaged in a variety of activities designed to improve their reading, writing, speaking, and listening abilities. Each student received an AVID binder and learned the importance of keeping it organized, a key skill for their future academic success.

Throughout the program, students explored their individual learning styles and how to effectively use their strengths in the classroom. They worked together as a cohort to create classroom norms and agreements, fostering a sense of community and mutual respect. This collaboration emphasized the importance of building a supportive and inclusive classroom environment. Students also practiced essential AVID-based skills, including Cornell notetaking, Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading (WICOR) strategies, building word banks, and focusing on grammatical structure. All skills are designed to enhance their academic performance and prepare them for future educational challenges.

When principal Danny Bravo interviewed students about their experiences during the summer session, many shared that they enjoyed meeting new students from other schools and building new friendships. One student stated that she appreciated the classroom environment and learning new English Language Development skills that she can use in the next school year. Another student mentioned that his favorite part of summer school was his teacher, saying, "she was really cool!" Overall, the AVID Summer Bridge Academy provided students with a comprehensive and enriching experience, equipping them with the tools and skills necessary for their future academic success.

Clovis Community Day School Intermediate Program

Students were broken into two groups, with each group spending half their day in Math intervention and the other half of their day in ELA intervention. Standards-based instruction was given in areas that had been identified as weaknesses of the students. This past summer, students worked to create a functional budget that included working with integers and fractions as well as percentages. Members of the community were brought in daily to share their stories, offer career insight, and connect and motivate the students. The students spent 12 hours with staff at the Pinedale Boys and Girls Club participating in community service, learning the hazards of vaping and drug use, and creating vision boards related to financial literacy.

High School Summer School

Overview:

Traditional High School Summer School Program

Grades 8 – 12 participated in the summer school program in one of three programs:

Independent Study: Students came to campus one day a week to turn in material and complete assessments that measured their learning.

In-Person Original Credit: Students came to campus Monday – Thursday to take classes for original credit to have room in their schedule for electives such as Instrumental Music or Leadership.

In-Person Credit Recovery: Students came to campus Monday – Thursday to make up credits in a variety of subjects.

Curriculum:

The curriculum used for Independent Study was created by CUSD teachers. Independent Studies PE was rewritten last summer, and World and U.S. History packets and U.S. History tests were revised prior to this summer. Math courses were taught by credentialed teachers using curriculum provided by CUSD TOSAs. Science courses were taught by credentialed teachers using the school-year curriculum. English courses were taught by credentialed teachers using a new curriculum created by a team of CUSD English teachers. Credit Recovery courses were taught by credentialed teachers using the Edgenuity curriculum.

The three campuses that housed the 2024 secondary summer school programs were:

- Buchanan Area and Clovis North Area: Clovis North High School
- Clovis High Area and Clovis East Area: Clovis High School
- Clovis West Area: Kastner Intermediate

NEW High School Online Original Credit Program



This was the first year that CUSD students had the opportunity to take courses in World Languages, PE, Art, Health and Social Science online. All students were taught by Clovis Online teachers using the Clovis Online curriculum.

While 103 students initially enrolled, 28 students dropped, leaving the total number of participating students at 75. All 75 passed their original credit online classes with a grade of "C" or better, with the vast majority earning "A's" and "B's".

Career Technical Education Summer Academy

CUSD Career Technical Education (CTE) teachers again opened their classrooms to current seventh and eighth grade students in order to expose them to the career pathways available to them. All programs were filled to capacity; 195 spots were filled with 195 students.

Buchanan Area

Graphic Design for Beginners: Students learned the basic elements of graphic design like color use, principles of design, typography, writing for media, and basic photography skills. With these new skills, students created several projects including logo design, event poster, and a thematic portfolio that could be accessed both digitally and in print.

Clovis East Area

Explore Health Careers and Medical Wellness: Students learned basic first aid and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) through a hands-on real-world experience. Students also had the option to earn the Heart Saver certification (with parent permission). Students took a field trip to Clovis Regional Medical Center where they observed medical professionals taking vital signs (Blood Pressure, Pulse Rate, and Respiration) and administering basic First Aid.

Welding Basics: Students learned to "light it up" using the gas metal arc welding process. The course covered safety, types of welders, welding wires and, of course, how to weld. Students learned to make welding beads and created a small project to take home.

Clovis High Area

3-D Design Workshop: Students were introduced to basic design concepts and discovered how to use Computer-Aided Design (CAD) software to model and 3D print their own creations. Students created unique solutions to design prompts that challenged them to think creatively and work collaboratively. This course combined creative and technical skills, and therefore appealed both to those who like the arts and those who prefer math and science.

Clovis North Area

The Art of Storytelling: Students learned the basics of story writing and storytelling, plus the elements of plot structure and character development to develop themes that are important to the development of Child and Adolescent Literature. Through the perspective of Ancient Mythology, participants read and researched different aspects, including the fundamentals of a Hero, and ending with the creation of their own mythological story. At the end of the session, students received a professionally bound copy of their story!

A Look into Health Careers: In this session, students learned all about CPR, Automatic External Defibrillator, and also First Aid. At the end of the session, students obtained a CPR, AED, and First Aid certification from the American Heart Association. Other skills acquired included taking vital signs including taking blood pressure, pulse, respirations, vision, and blood-oxygen saturation.

Clovis West Area


Wheels and Reels: Students got their wheels and reels turning this summer! In the immersive Cars and Video Production program, students learned the basics of auto maintenance and honed their storytelling skills through film production. In just three weeks, students rolled up their sleeves and received hands-on experience repairing classic cars while also mastering the art of video creation.




At the conclusion of the summer school program, parents were surveyed on their student(s)' experience.


Parent Survey Responses

When parents were asked to rate the quality of the curriculum used during summer school, 92.2% rated the curriculum as Good, Very Good or Excellent.



When parents were asked to rate their student's feeling of success with the instruction they received, 95% rated their student's perception of success as Good, Very Good or Excellent.





Summer School Parent Survey Results Summary

Compliments from the parent survey included the following:

- My student "made new friends and is excited about learning".

- My daughter "came in knowing twelve sight words and now knows them all. They will be prepared for first grade after attending summer school. Thank you for putting this program on."
- "Pinedale summer school gave my son a lot of confidence and he loves school again."
- Due to taking summer school, my daughter is "able to take her elective of choice during the regular school year."
- "Attending summer school has significantly improved my child's student habits."

Constructive feedback from the parent survey:

Comments centered around issues about transportation, timing, and the absence policy. Some samples of parent feedback include:

- Elementary summer school "is too short".
- Develop and implement a better way to have kids board the correct bus.
- At the elementary level, develop a way to provide teacher feedback to parents during the summer session.
- Please allow for true independent study with more than one absence allowed.

WHEREAS, in order to acquire and install certain energy related improvements to the District's facilities, the Governing Board desires to enter into a PACT/Energy Services Agreement with Electric Motor Shop (Contractor), whereby Contractor shall construct/install certain energy efficiency retrofits consisting of the installation of upgrade lighting (Project).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Governing Board finds that it is in the best interests of the District to enter into the PACT/Energy Services Agreement for the implementation of certain energy related improvements to the District's facilities, as described in the PACT/Energy Services Agreement.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED the Governing Board further finds that the anticipated cost to the District for thermal or electrical or conservation services provided by the energy conservation facility under the energy services agreement will be less than the anticipated marginal cost of thermal, electrical, or other energy that would have been consumed in the absence of those purchases.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED the Governing Board hereby approves and authorizes the execution of the Energy Services Agreement. The Superintendent or designee is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the PACT/Energy Services Agreement and related exhibits attached thereto.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED the Governing Board authorizes the Superintendent or designee to take all actions necessary or reasonably required to carry out, give effect to, and consummate the transactions contemplated by the PACT/Energy Services Agreement and to take all actions necessary in conformity therewith. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.
