#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Conduct a public hearing no earlier than 6:45 p.m. at 1680 David E. Cook Way, Clovis, California, regarding the adoption of a School Facilities Needs Analysis (SFNA) to establish Level II School Facilities (Developer) Fees.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

With the passage of Senate Bill 50 (SB 50) in 1998 and the approval of Proposition 1A (the \$9.2 billion State Bond Measure) by the California Electorate on November 3, 1998, school districts are now authorized to assess both the traditional Level I developer fees as well as an alternative school facilities fee to assist in the mitigation of new development on school facilities.

The SB 50 formula to determine Level II residential-only fees requires school districts to update the SFNA annually. In addition, the Governing Board must conduct a public hearing prior to the approval of a SB 50 Level II fee. Further, a copy of the SFNA must be submitted to all interested parties and jurisdictional agencies no later than forty five (45) days prior to the public hearing. The required analysis was distributed to all interested parties on or before April 25, 2025.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The District proposes to enter into energy services agreements and related contract documents with Holt Renewables to design and construct solar energy facilities at Hirayama Elementary School and the Terry P. Bradley Educational Center. An analysis has been conducted showing the benefits of implementing the energy conservation measures through the installation of certain solar energy facilities. The analysis includes data showing that the anticipated cost to the District of installing the solar energy generating facilities will be less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of electrical energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of those facilities. The analysis is attached to Resolution No. 4051 on this agenda.

The District also proposes to enter into an agreement with Unified Film Solutions to purchase and install window film to schools across the District. An analysis has been conducted showing the anticipated cost to the District for the purchase and installation of the window film will be less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of electrical energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of the film. The analysis is attached to Resolution No. 4060, also on this agenda.

Pursuant to Government Code section 4217.12, the Board will hold this public hearing and consider the adoption of Resolutions No. 4051 and No. 4060, and make the required determinations and findings at this June 11, 2025, Governing Board meeting. Notice of the public hearing was given at least two weeks in advance.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff has prepared a written California Dashboard Local Indicators Report for Clovis Unified School District and Clovis Online Charter School for review by the Governing Board.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Annually, school districts in California are to measure their progress in meeting the requirements of specific Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) priorities. The local indicators in the attached report, in conjunction with other State measures, make up the California Dashboard that will be reported in the fall of 2025. The District continues to research the best available curriculum to meet the needs of its students. The Curriculum, Instruction and Accountability division works with school site administrators and teachers to gather input to help provide the very best and user-friendly curriculum resources for teachers and students to use in the classroom. A needs assessment is given to help maintain an equitable refresh cycle of materials based on need, timeline of the release of new state frameworks, and available funding. Textbooks are periodically piloted in our schools and teacher committees are able to provide feedback during adoption cycles. Educational partners are also invited to review materials being considered for adoption as well as already adopted materials. The District also works closely with curriculum providers to make sure we are able to access the most up to date resources within our adopted textbook materials.

CUSD is effective at building relationships between school staff and families as indicated by parents in the annual parent survey. This year 94% of parents indicated that there are adults on campus that care for their students. Furthermore, 87% of parents also responded that their school communicates the importance of respecting all cultural beliefs and practices.

While 83% of parents have indicated they know how to access additional help for their students, Clovis Unified will continue its outreach efforts so that all families are aware of the many intervention opportunities that exist at their child's school site as well as additional resources to all students outside of school hours. Clovis Unified has tutoring access available to all students at any time of the day through an online resource.

Clovis Unified will continue to provide services and supports through the feeder school transition teams. These teams provide mentorship and academic support to students as well as many parent outreach events.

CUSD is effective at building partnerships for student outcomes as indicated by parents in the annual parent survey. This year, 93% of parents indicated that their school provides a quality education for their child. Also, 93% of parents indicated that their child's reading skills are improving while 91% indicated their child's math skills are improving. Furthermore, 83% of parents stated that they know how to get help for their child if they are struggling in school while 84% of students indicated they could get additional help from their teachers.

2. Based on the analysis of educational partner input and local data, briefly describe the LEA's focus area(s) for improvement in Building Partnerships for Student Outcomes.

The District's parent survey indicates that many of our parent community have attended or been involved in some form of school or District community meeting; however, several parents at our Title 1 schools indicated they have not been as involved. CUSD will focus on further outreach to parents at our Title 1 schools by continuing monthly parent engagement nights at the district level to welcome families from all schools. These meetings will continue to be devoted to relevant topics affecting students, parents and our community and will also help provide tools and resources for our parents to help their students be the best they can be in mind, body and spirit. Meetings are provided at both the school and district level.

CUSD uses its Clovis Assessment System for Sustained Improvement (CLASSI) model to ensure there is diverse representation at various parent outreach meetings. Principals connect with key educational partners within their school communities to continue to build diverse representation at meetings such as School Assessment Review Team (SART) meetings and Intercultural Diversity Advisory Committee (IDAC) meetings. At the district level Parent Advisory Committee Meetings and District English Learner Advisory Committee meetings are held in partnership

with all schools within the District. CUSD will continue to expand its IDAC site visits each year, where each school will get to demonstrate how they are meeting the diverse needs of their student body.

CUSD is effective at seeking input from educational partners for decision making. All of CUSD's school sites conducted educational partner meetings for parents, guardians, teachers, classified personnel, and students. This year, 92% of parents indicated that they attended one or more meetings conducted by their child's school. At these meetings, plus two larger, district-wide LCAP parent meetings, feedback was collected and analyzed through the Thought Exchange tool. The feedback collected helps the District to understand what the community perceives as the needs of students. From this input, the District is able to modify, enhance, and add appropriate actions and services in the LCAP to meet the needs of students.

The District will continue to utilize its current parent meeting structure along with the Thought Exchange tool to gather feedback. The District implemented using a new survey tool in Thought Exchange to gather additional parent feedback by upgrading and modifying its current parent and student surveys.

The District will be improving engagement of underrepresented families by increasing the access to translation tools to provide better communication opportunities with families in need of translation services. The District will continue to provide readily accessible communication to families through multiple modalities and languages. The District migrated communication to one universal online platform accessible to all parents this past year, through Parent Square.

School safety is an ongoing focus in CUSD. The District is part of a multi-agency coalition that works together to implement best practices for maintaining safe schools. Additional systems to support communication and classroom safety have been implemented. Safety and alert systems have been enhanced each year to keep staff, students and families safe and informed.

Ongoing academic and social emotional learning interventions continue to be at the forefront of providing students a myriad of opportunities to have increased help during and outside of school hours. The LCAP continues to address the academic and social emotional learning intervention supports needed for our students.

Every year, CUSD reviews the California Dashboard. New systems are implemented and analyzed to enact positive change in the areas showing the most need for improvement on the California Dashboard.

Clovis Online Charter School is demonstrating strong performance on the California School Dashboard, with no indicators in the red zone. Our school's success, highlighted by a 96% graduation rate, stems from our focused program that offers rigorous, standards-based courses. We prioritize individualized student plans, maintain daily contact, and provide dedicated teachers, a high-quality curriculum, and comprehensive support for academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs. While there is room for growth when comparing our academic performance to our charter district, our Advanced Placement program excels with a 33.3% pass rate. Our growing enrollment allows us to tailor our approach to each student, in line with our district motto of nurturing excellence in mind, body, and spirit.

Clovis Online Charter School has identified two key areas for improvement. First, our College and Career Indicator (CCI) shows lower rates, with 34.7% of students classified as Prepared and 31.2% as Approaching Prepared. Many students enter with credit deficiencies, highlighting the need to focus on college and career readiness alongside graduation rates. We aim to enhance A-G preparedness and develop CTE pathways in collaboration with CUSD alternative education programs.

Second, mathematics performance is a concern, with students scoring 68 points below standard, placing us in the orange zone. This trend is consistent across all subgroups. Addressing these challenges is essential to ensure Clovis Online Charter School continues to thrive and effectively serve its students.

Clovis Online Charter School conducts an annual local survey among students, serving as a reliable gauge of perceptions regarding school safety and community cohesion. This year's findings indicate full parent attendance at school meetings and complete student participation in school events. With enrollment notably rising, partly attributable to the pandemic, the school pledges to expand avenues to address the distinct requirements of both parents and students. Furthermore, survey results highlight that 95% of students perceive Clovis Online Charter School as a secure learning environment, reinforced by affirmative feedback on the respectful treatment and appreciation of the diverse student population by teachers.

Students at Clovis Online Charter School have conveyed a strong sense of safety and connection with the institution. They articulate feeling supported both academically and socially by their teachers, who are perceived as attentive listeners. However, while students appreciate the support they receive, they have identified an area for potential growth: a desire for teachers to deepen their understanding of cultural awareness. Expanding educators' knowledge in this realm could further enrich the school's environment, ensuring that all students feel valued and understood regardless of their backgrounds.

Professional development aimed at expanding educators' knowledge in the realm of cultural awareness and sensitivity could serve as a powerful tool to enrich the environment at Clovis Online Charter School. By equipping teachers with a deeper understanding of cultural diversity and its significance in the classroom, the school can foster an even more inclusive atmosphere where all students feel valued and understood, irrespective of their backgrounds. This investment in teacher training not only enhances the educational experience for students but also reinforces the school's commitment to embracing diversity and promoting equity within its community.

Clovis Online Charter School employs various methods to guarantee that every student can access and enroll in a diverse range of courses, tailored to their grade levels, unique student demographics, and those with special requirements. Across all Kindergarten-12 campuses, the Q Web system is used to construct student schedules, ensuring comprehensive course access. School counselors and ImpactTeam members collaborate closely with students to foster awareness and facilitate enrollment in a diverse curriculum. Impact Team members specifically assist unduplicated student groups. Through analysis of master schedules, schools ensure that all student groups, including those with exceptional needs, are enrolled in a broad curriculum. Additionally, the College and Career Readiness program is implemented for grades six-12, offering students opportunities to engage in activities and lessons aligned with career and college pathways.

2. Using the locally selected measures or tools, summarize the extent to which all students have access to, and are enrolled in, a broad course of study. To address there being differences, see our list of intervention opportunities. Clovis Online Charter School will continue to utilize Q Web to ensure all students have access to, and are enrolled in, a broad course of study. Annual master schedule audits and Board Policy 3403, Placement in Ninth Grade Mathematics Course, establish protocols and identify any differences across school sites and student groups with access to, and enrollment in, a broad course of study. Placement concerns are addressed and corrected annually. Clovis Online Charter School is committed to expanding equitable opportunities for all students to have access to Advanced Placement courses at the high school level.

3. Given the results of the tool or locally selected measures, identify the barriers preventing the LEA from providing access to a broad course of study for all students. (response limited to 1,500 characters)

Current barriers include minimal access to Career Technical Education and AP classes for students. Clovis Online Charter School is improving on their course offerings each year with AP classes and other specialty classes offered at comprehensive sites.

### **IDAC**


CUSD's Intercultural Diversity Advisory Council (IDAC) internal accountability model is unique as it provides validation, feedback, and discussion on student achievement, school climate, and student and parent involvement. This work complements the rigorous and relevant academic support students already receive. The IDAC internal accountability model and academic support enhance the Mind, Body and Spirit promoting a more positive experience increasing academic achievement and social emotional wellness.

We take pride that each CUSD site held several IDAC site-level parent and student meetings in 2024-25. In addition, our team facilitated and organized ten IDAC site visits this school year.

Members of our CUSD Governing Board, Executive Cabinet, Curriculum, Instruction and Accountability department, students, and parents from the Superintendent's Parent IDAC composed the visitation team. The goals of the IDAC site visits are to validate efforts in increasing cultural awareness and share cross-District activities which have impact on academic achievement, school culture, and school climate.

IDAC encompasses our internal growth model of simply striving to be better. Student input, parent partnerships, inclusive activities, and appropriate training are a few ways which can positively influence student achievement outcomes.

### **Curriculum Update: Supplemental Literature and Ethnic Studies**

### Curriculum

Clovis Assessment System for Sustained Improvement (CLASSI) III states that the District-adopted curriculum reflecting the diversity of the District, state, and nation will be used in all classrooms. A systematic approach to designing relevant lesson plans and professional learning opportunities supports this goal. Our Curriculum Design Teams ensure teachers have the necessary resources to support students. Professional learning opportunities are designed for administrators and teachers to foster equitable and engaging classrooms to maximize student achievement for ALL students.

The Curriculum, Instruction, and Accountability department created a systematic professional learning plan with a prioritized focus on positive school culture across campuses. School site leaders identified specific focus areas to maximize continuous growth and improvement in creating and maintaining a positive and safe learning environment for all students. In the domain of school culture, an emphasis on teaching and learning has been placed on equity awareness and cultural proficiency as well as positive social emotional, and behavioral supports.

### **Equitable and Engaging Classrooms**

CIA supports the CLASSI goal of integrating multicultural education into curriculum and classroom instruction for all grades. Resources are available for teachers in grades TK-12 and are integrated into the core curriculum. All resources are evaluated for accuracy, quality, and age appropriateness.

Professional learning has been provided for administrators, teachers, and support staff systematically throughout the year. Tiered support and learning are available through a series of trainings that build competence with each session. Specific training and learning opportunities include leadership practices and planning for equitable and engaging classrooms and schools, Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) strategies, implicit bias, and many social emotional/behavioral support frameworks and resources. This continued focus on professional learning will continue for the 2024-25 school year with equity awareness and cultural proficiency as a priority.

# >>> AIM 2 - Operate with Increasing Efficiency and Effectiveness



**School Site IDAC and Evaluation**: Site and Area IDAC meetings were held regularly during the 2024-25 school year. Positive feedback was received through numerous platforms. Site leaders were able to display and explain the wonderful work occurring at their respective sites in an attempt to reach all students.

Superintendent's Parent and Community IDAC: In 2017 these meetings were initiated through the Superintendent's office to create connectivity at the highest level of the organization. During the 2024-25 school year, District-wide parent IDAC meetings were held to share with all school site leaders and parents, the equity

held to share with all school site leaders and parents, the equity work that is occurring at the District level around our 13 cultural competencies (e.g. Human Resources, School Leadership, and Curriculum and Instruction). Dr. Folmer will continue to use her existing partnerships with the committee members to establish a District-wide parent IDAC meeting schedule for 2025-26. Members from this group will also continue to serve on the IDAC visitation teams.



Superintendent's Student IDAC: Dr. Folmer held meetings with this important student group. Students from each District area came together with Dr. Folmer, Dr. Hammack, and Dr. Salinas to share best practices, concerns, and to offer support. Students report on events and equity structures at their school. In addition, they take knowledge and insight back to their Human Relations Council and Principal Advisory for Student Affairs groups at their respective school. The goal is to provide a space where students can share and learn from one another.

**New Schools Celebrate Diverse History**: Clovis Unified School District's newest elementary school opened in August 2024 and bears the name Satoshi Hirayama Elementary. Hirayama, who retired from CUSD in 1991 and passed away in 2021, was a teacher at Clovis High School, the first principal of Gateway High School, experienced being interned during World War II, and was the first Japanese American to play in Japan's professional baseball league. CUSD's newest intermediate school, which opens this Fall 2025, has been named Phillip V. Sanchez Intermediate in honor of a Clovis Unified graduate, Governing Board trustee and widely successful Hispanic American who was a United States Ambassador to Honduras and to Columbia. Sanchez, who passed away at the age of 88 in 2017, attended Pinedale Elementary and Clovis High School and was the first Hispanic American to serve on a U.S. Presidential Cabinet.



# >>> AIM 3 - Hire, Develop, Sustain, and Value a **High Quality Diverse Workforce**

### Hiring

Hiring is the **MOST important thing that we do** in Clovis Unified! The process of hiring cannot be compromised as we make every effort to attract quality candidates to our certificated and classified open positions. The diversity of our student demographics is growing and we will continue to pursue high-quality, diverse employees to fill our open positions. Our District diversity advisory boards and equity groups will play a crucial role in recruitment, job fair participation, leadership roles, and mentorship.

Continued work with our **Quality Improvement Teams (QIT)** process to reinforce and reflect on our hiring practices:



Interview panel process - reflects our District's needs and desire to hire the most qualified candidates, maintains confidentiality, and integrity of the CUSD hiring process.



Marketing and Outreach - we continue to utilize a variety of strategies to reach the best candidates. These efforts include but are not limited to job fairs, recruitment, partnerships with local universities, social media presence, print media, and search engines (Indeed, LinkedIn, California Association of School Business Officials (CASBO), Association of School Business Officials International (ASBO), Better Team, Monster, Glassdoor, and Career Builder).



Internal recruiting via Career Technical Education Programs and Teaching Cohorts - Careers in Education courses offered through Clovis Unified and partnerships with Human Resources to recruit, offer insight into the hiring process, provide mock interview panels, as well as review resumes, and share an Edjoin overview. Special Education teaching cohorts partnered with California State University, Fresno, and CUSD, and additional opportunities provided to our students include:

- Involvement in job fairs and breakout sessions for employment opportunities
- Classified career workshop and classified job fairs
- Certificated pathways offer potential opportunities for those students interested in employment in CUSD after finishing their high school journey and planning for career or college readiness. These opportunities include: Paraprofessionals, Student Relations Liaison, positions in Child Development and Expanded Learning Club, and walk-on coaching positions

### **Equity Groups**

The establishment of Clovis Unified's Equity Groups has provided the District with tremendous insight as we partner with our employee groups to listen, learn, plan, and collaborate. This year, 2024-25 the District developed the Employee Equity Leadership (EEL). The EEL consists of District leaders from advisory groups that have worked in collaboration to be outcome oriented on areas related to hiring, recruitment, retention, professional development, and supporting our District's core values. The equity groups that continue to do targeted work and focus on recruitment and hiring are:

African American Advisory Board (AAAB)

**Latino Advisory Board (LAB)** 

Asian American/Pacific Islander Advisory Board (AAPIAB)

Initially the mission, vision, and aim of our Equity Groups was to support AIM III of the District's Strategic Plan: to hire, develop, sustain, and value a high-quality diverse workforce.

As the work related to AIM III has continued, the Equity Groups have played an important role in:

- · Hiring and job fairs
- · CLASSI III
- Curriculum and supplemental reading lists
- Trainings, Cultural Equity in the Workplace, Safe Zone and Individualized Education Program (IEP) enhancements for Spanish-speaking families
- · Leadership training for both certificated and classified employees

The growth of our Equity Groups has afforded us a partnership to be proactive in our District's work with a lens that will:

- Develop an Employee Equity Leadership component
- Ensure every employee (classified and certificated) completes annual acknowledgment of expectations around cultural proficiency
- · Review and refine Component III of the Clovis Assessment System for Sustained Improvement (CLASSI III)
- · Refine and expand the existing Hiring Task Force focused on developing a workforce reflective of our student population.
- Research, analyze, communicate, and evaluate effective marketing and outreach efforts that create an employee pool of high-quality candidates reflecting the diversity of our community for consideration for classified and certificated employment.

### **Conclusion**

We look forward to the 2025-26 school year where we will continue to build cultural proficiency through meaningful and intentional district work. The ongoing engagement of our students, employees, and community members supports clovis unified's aims and focus on providing a diverse, quality learning and working environment aligned with our district's vision and mission.

Clovis Community Day School (CCDS) and Gateway High School will use CTFF to support and improve student outcomes.

CTFF tutors/IAs will support students in academics with a variety of instructional strategies to master the standards. Tutors/IAs will work directly with the teacher to develop the support necessary to ensure student success.

CTFF is supervised by credentialed leads who receive ongoing professional development provided by school sites, CTFF and the District. CTFF brings energetic, trained staff members to help students and, in turn, receive hands-on experience in preparation for a career in education. The use of CTFF participants was first approved by the CUSD Governing Board in March 2007.

Teaching Fellows are supervised by credentialed site-based certificated leads and receive ongoing professional development provided by CTFF. Teaching Fellows bring energetic, trained staff members to support students both during and after the regular school day, while gaining valuable, hands-on experience that prepares them for a career in education.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Proposition 30, the Schools and Local Public Safety Protection Act of 2012, approved by the voters on November 6, 2012, temporarily increased the State sales tax rate for all taxpayers and the personal income tax rates for upper-income taxpayers. The temporary sales tax expired at the end of the 2016 calendar year. The personal income tax rates for upper-income taxpayers was due to expire at the end of the 2018 calendar year. On the November 2016 ballot, California voters approved Proposition 55, extending the Proposition 30 income tax increase for upper-income taxpayers through 2030.

The District's State revenue is comprised of three funding sources: State aid, EPA and property taxes. The funding received as a result of Proposition 55 does not increase the District's revenue funding because the State aid revenue is decreased according to the amount of EPA funds received. At the beginning of each year, the Department of Finance estimates the amount to be transferred into the EPA for districts. EPA revenue funds for Clovis Unified will be deposited into restricted resource 1400. These funds must, therefore, be accounted for under the following reporting requirements:

- 1. Each year, the Governing Board must approve a spending plan for the EPA money.
- 2. The EPA funds cannot be used for the salaries or benefits of administrators or for administrative costs.
- 3. The District must publish on its website the amount of EPA money received and how it was spent.
- 4. An annual audit will be required to verify that EPA funds were spent in accordance with the requirements of Proposition 55.

# RESOLUTION NO. 4053 BEFORE THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FRESNO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

## REGARDING THE EDUCATION PROTECTION ACCOUNT (EPA)

WHEREAS, the voters approved Proposition 55 on November 8, 2016; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 55 amended Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution effective November 8, 2016, and commencing on January 1, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of Article XIII, Section 36(e) create in the state General Fund an Education Protection Account (EPA) to receive and disburse the revenues derived from the incremental increases in taxes imposed by Article XIII, Section 36(f); and

WHEREAS, before June 30th of each year, the District shall estimate the total amount of additional revenues, less refunds that will be derived from the incremental increases in tax rates made pursuant to Article XIII, Section 36(f) that will be available for transfer into the EPA during the next fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, if the sum determined by the State Controller is positive, the State Controller shall transfer the amount calculated into the EPA within ten days preceding the end of the fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, all monies in the EPA are hereby continuously appropriated for the support of school districts, county offices of education, charter schools, and community college districts; and

**WHEREAS**, monies deposited in the EPA shall not be used to pay any costs incurred by the Legislature, the Governor, or any agency of state government; and

WHEREAS, a community college district, county office of education, school district, or charter school shall have the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the EPA are spent in the school, or schools, within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the District shall make the spending determinations with respect to monies received from the EPA in open session of a public meeting of the Governing Board; and

WHEREAS, the monies received from the EPA shall not be used for salaries or benefits for administrators, or any other administrative cost; and

WHEREAS, each community college district, county office of education, school district, and charter school shall annually publish on its internet website an accounting of how much money was received from the EPA and how that money was spent; and

WHEREAS, the annual independent financial and compliance audit required of community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools shall ascertain and verify whether the funds provided from the EPA have been properly disbursed and expended as required by Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution; and

WHEREAS, expenses incurred by community college districts, county offices of education, school districts, and charter schools must comply with the additional audit requirements of Article XIII, Section 36, and may be paid with funding from the EPA, and shall not be considered administrative costs for purposes of Article XIII, Section 36.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the monies received from the EPA shall be spent as required by Article XIII, Section 36, and the determinations on how the money will be spent shall be made in open session of a public meeting of the Governing Board of Clovis Unified School District.

**BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that to be in compliance with Article XIII, Section 36(e), with the California Constitution, the Governing Board of the Clovis Unified School District has determined to spend the monies received from the EPA as attached.

## **DISCUSSION:**

Federal and State laws require that all Special Education Local Plan Areas (SELPAs) submit an Annual Service Plan (ASP) and Annual Budget Plan (ABP).

The ASP includes a description of services to be provided by the Clovis Unified SELPA including the nature of services and the physical location where the services will be provided. This includes alternative schools, charter schools, opportunity schools and classes, the community day school operated by the Fresno County Superintendent of Schools, the juvenile court school and county jails.

The ASP demonstrates that all individuals with exceptional needs have access to services and instructions appropriate to meet their needs as specified in their Individualized Education Program (IEP). The 2025-26 Special Education ASP was derived from the October 2, 2024, pupil count which was extracted from the Special Education Information System (SEIS).

The ABP reflects allocations of funds that align with the services and instruction outlined in the ASP.

Clovis Unified, Fresno Unified and CART are proposing to enter into an additional addendum to the operating agreement which will provide ongoing funding to CART for the Technology Refresh Plan. The addendum provides that each party will allocate funds for the project as follows:

With this addendum, Fresno Unified and Clovis Unified will contribute \$155,000 each. This is an increase of \$11,000 annually over what has been provided in the past by each district to cover the rising costs of technology. The addendum also requires that the CART Foundation contribute \$30,000 annually to the Technology Refresh. This would provide a total of \$340,000 annually to the CART Refresh Plan.

The addendum will require approval from all agencies (Clovis Unified, Fresno Unified and CART) in order to be fully executed.

## ADDENDUM TO CART OPERATING AGREEMENT (Technology Refresh Project)

THIS ADDENDUM ("Addendum") to the CART Operating Agreement dated June 11, 2025 ("Operating Agreement"), is made and entered into as of June 11, 2025, between FRESNO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT and CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, each, a "District," and hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Districts," and the CENTER FOR ADVANCED RESEARCH AND TECHNOLOGY, hereinafter referred to as "CART." The Districts and CART are collectively referred to hereinafter as "the Parties."

The following provisions are added to the Operating Agreement:

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Parties have entered into the Operating Agreement to provide for the operation of CART's facilities and programs, including administration, routine maintenance, telecommunications and internet services and to provide for updating computer systems;

WHEREAS, CART has developed an ongoing plan to provide cutting edge technology for students, hereinafter referred to as "Technology Refresh," for the benefit of CART's students; and

WHEREAS, Fresno Unified, Clovis Unified and the CART Foundation have agreed to share expenses for the Technology Refresh Project as set out below.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Funding of Technology Refresh Project</u>. As part of the Technology Refresh Project, the Districts agree to each pay \$155,000 beginning during the 2025-2026 school year and for each year thereafter, as set out in more detail below. Foundation agrees to pay \$30,000 by May 15 of each school year.
  - At the CART Administrative meeting in or about September 2025 and each subsequent September meetings, the Administration team will review the contributions received to date from each District and from the Foundation and the total contributions projected for each subsequent school year. The Districts' contributions are contingent upon receipt of the Foundation's contributions. The Districts are each committed to contribute \$5.17 for each \$1.00 received from the Foundation. The Districts' contributions will be reduced to account for each \$1.00 Foundation does not contribute towards its commitment. The adjustments may be made annually or at other times as is appropriate and agreed to by the Districts.
  - 2. <u>CART Account</u>. CART shall deposit the funds received from each District and the Foundation pursuant to Section 1 in an account dedicated to the payment for the Technology Refresh Project, unless the Parties agree that the funds shall be deposited in a

different account. CART shall use the funds received pursuant to this Addendum for the purpose of procuring the computer equipment and services, including related administrative costs, if any, and for no other purpose. If the amount of funds received by CART pursuant to Section 1 is insufficient to fully fund the Technology Refresh, the Districts and the Foundation shall work together to reduce the scope of the Technology Refresh Purchases. If any funds remain in the dedicated account after all costs related to the Technology Refresh have been fully paid, those funds shall be dedicated to future Technology Refresh Purchases.

- 3. <u>Amendment</u>. The terms of this Addendum shall not be amended in any manner except by written agreement signed by the parties.
- 4. <u>Authorization</u>. The individuals signing below represent that they are authorized to sign on behalf of this District/CART or Foundation and to commit their District/CART or the Foundation to the obligations included here. The individuals signing below will insure that the necessary steps are taken to perform the obligations in a timely manner.
- 5. <u>Other Terms</u>. All other terms and provisions of the Operating Agreement shall remain in full force and effect for the current term of the Operating Agreement and each renewal term of the Operating Agreement thereafter.

## PHILOSOPHY, GOALS, OBJECTIVES, AND COMPREHENSIVE PLANS COMPREHENSIVE SAFETY PLAN

PURPOSE: To set forth the procedures and requirements for the development of a comprehensive safety plan.

The Board recognizes the importance of safe and secure school campuses. The Board is committed to school safety and to creating a positive learning environment.

The school site council at each District school shall develop a comprehensive school safety plan relevant to the needs and resources of that particular school. New school campuses shall develop a <u>comprehensive</u> safety plan within one year of initiating operations. (Education Code 32281, 32286)

The <u>comprehensive</u> school safety plan shall address the school's staffing, available resources, and building design, as well as other factors unique to the site.

The comprehensive safety plan(s) shall be reviewed and updated by March 1 of each year and forwarded to the Board for approval. (Education Code 32286, 32288)

The Board shall review the comprehensive safety plan(s) to ensure compliance with state law, board policy, and administrative regulation and shall approve the plan(s) as set forth in Education Code section 32286. The comprehensive safety plan shall include a disaster preparedness plan as set forth in Board Policy No. 3516 – Emergency and Disaster Preparedness Plan.

By October 15 of each year, the Superintendent or designee shall notify the California Department of Education (CDE) of any schools that have not complied with the requirements of Education Code section 32281. (Education Code 32288)

### A. SAFE SCHOOLS

The Superintendent or designee is instructed to prepare and ensure the implementation of such regulations that will require each school principal to establish a School Site Council and/or Safety Planning Committee (as defined by Education Code section 32281) to assess the school climate on campus, in the community while the students are under school authority, during the lunch break, and going to and from school. Each School Site Council/Safety Planning committee shall, in accordance with the law, develop and maintain Safe School Plans unique to the individual school climate. The Safe School Plan shall be adopted within one year of a school's opening, and annually updated thereafter according to the timeline set forth by the State of California.

The Superintendent or designee shall review each Safe School Plan prior to its submittal to the Board for approval to ensure student and staff safety and to ensure compliance with policies and regulations of the Board and statutes of the State of California. When such reviews establish that

additional rules and regulations are required District wide, the Superintendent or designee shall make appropriate recommendations to the Board.

The School Site Council/Planning Committee is to be particularly concerned with any conditions that exist that constitute a threat to the welfare of students and staff and to determine whether any additional rules, regulations, or actions are necessary to correct such threats. When it is determined that additional rules or regulations are required, the principal or designee shall review and consider for adoption and implementation such rules.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish procedures to ensure notification of the Safe School Plan to all continuing students at the beginning of each year and new enrollees upon enrollment of the District.

### B. ACCESS TO SAFETY PLAN(S) ACCESS AND REPORTING

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that an updated file of all safety-related plans and materials is readily available for inspection by the public. (Education Code 32282)

The Superintendent or designee shall share the comprehensive safety plans and any updates to the plans with local law enforcement, the local fire department, and other first responder entities. (Education Code 32281)

The Superintendent or designee shall provide data to CDE in accordance with Education Code section 32289.5. (Education Code 32289.5)

## COMMUNITY RELATIONS USE OF DISTRICT FACILITIES

PURPOSE: To establish procedures and requirements for the use of District facilities.

The Board believes that school facilities and grounds are a vital community resource which should be used to foster community involvement and development.

## A. USE OF DISTRICT FACILITIES OR GROUNDS PURSUANT TO THE CIVIC CENTER ACT

### 1. Permitted Uses of District Facilities

The Board authorizes the Superintendent or designee to make District facilities and grounds available as a civic center to citizens and community groups for the following purposes, subject to applicable laws and District policies and regulations: (Education Code\_38131)

- a. Public, literary, scientific, recreational, educational, or public agency meetings.
- b. The discussion of matters of general or public interest.
- c. The conduct of religious services for temporary periods, on a one-time or renewable basis, by any church or religious organization that has no suitable meeting place for the conduct of the services, provided the church or religious organization is charged a fee as specified in Education Code section 38134(d).
- d. Childcare or daycare programs to provide supervision and activities for children of preschool and elementary school age.
- e. The administration of examinations for the selection of personnel or the instruction of precinct board members by public agencies.
- f. Supervised recreational activities.
- g. Community youth centers.
- h. A ceremony, patriotic celebration, or related assembly conducted by a veterans' organization.
- i. Other purposes deemed appropriate by the Board.

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# CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

### [MOVED TO PARAGRAPH C BELOW]

The Board authorizes the use of District facilities for mass care and welfare shelters during disasters or other emergencies affecting the public health and welfare. The Board shall grant the use of school buildings, grounds, and equipment to public agencies, including the American Red Cross, and shall cooperate in furnishing and maintaining such services as it deems necessary to meet community needs.

The Superintendent or designee may grant the use of District facilities or grounds on days on which District schools are closed. (Education Code 37220)

### 2. Prohibited Uses of District Facilities

The Board shall not grant the use of District facilities for any of the following activities:

- a. Any use by an individual or group for the commission of any crime or any act prohibited by law.
- b. Any use of District facilities or grounds which is inconsistent with their use for school purposes or which interferes with the regular conduct of school or school work.
- c. Any use that violates the establishment clause of the federal Constitution.
- d. Any use which involves the possession, consumption, or sale of alcoholic beverages or any restricted substances on school property.
- e. Any use for the commission of any act intended to further any program or movement the purpose of which is to accomplish the overthrow of the government of the United States or the state by force, violence, or other unlawful means.
- f. Any use which is not open to the public or which is not supportive of the multicultural goals of the District.
- g. Any use of District facilities which is inconsistent or conflicts with the District's educational mission, including the growth and development of the whole student to "Be the best you can be in mind, body and spirt."

There shall be no advertising on District facilities and grounds except as allowed by Board Policy No. 1325 – Advertising and Promotion.

#### 3. Fees for Use of District Facilities

### a. Fee Schedule (Exhibit No. 1330)

The Board authorizes the Superintendent or designee to establish a Facility Use Fee Schedule, Exhibit No. 1330, setting forth fees to be charged for community use of District facilities and grounds and reflecting the direct costs for the use of the facilities or grounds. The schedule of fees shall be prepared in accordance with applicable law.

Pursuant to Education Code section 38134, the District will charge non-profit organizations an amount not to exceed the District's direct costs for the use of District facilities or grounds. Direct costs shall be determined in accordance with applicable law, including 5 CCR 14037-14041. Other groups that request the use of District facilities or grounds under this policy and the Civic Center Act will be charged pursuant to the established Facility Use Fee Schedule. When District facilities or grounds are used for religious services, the amount that is charged shall be at least equal to the District's direct costs. (Education Code 38134)

The Superintendent or designee shall, as appropriate, review the fee schedule with consideration to the consumer price index.

The facility use fee schedule does not apply to District-sponsored activities which include District students.

#### b. Waiver of Fee Schedule

When an alternative location is not available, the Superintendent or designee may waive the fee schedule for the use of District facilities or grounds by nonprofit organizations or clubs/associations which promote youth and school activities. These groups include, but are not limited to, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Camp Fire, Inc., parent-teachers' associations, and school/community advisory councils.

Where a group is eligible for a waiver of the fee schedule and prefers to use District facilities at a time when custodial, grounds, and/or food services are not normally available, the District will charge for the direct cost of a custodian, grounds personnel, and/or food services personnel. The principal or designee shall first ensure the availability of other times during the week when the facility could be provided without charge, and this availability shall be pointed out to the requesting group. The District will charge for the direct cost of a security guard for events requiring security.

### c. Fair Rental Value for Certain Groups and Organizations

Groups shall be charged fair rental value when using District facilities or grounds for entertainment or meetings where admission fees are charged, or contributions are solicited

and net receipts are not to be expended for charitable purposes or for the welfare of the District's students. (Education Code 38134) Fair rental value means the direct costs to the District, plus the amortized costs of the District facilities or grounds used for the duration of the activity authorized. (Education Code 38134)

### d. Expending Funds Collected as Capital Direct Costs

Any funds collected as capital direct costs shall be deposited into a special fund to be used only for capital maintenance, repair, restoration, and refurbishment of District facilities and grounds. (5 CCR 14042)

## 4. Use by a Church or Religious Organization.

Subject to the requirements of law and this policy, District facilities shall be available for use by outside organizations without regard to their religious or non-religious nature. It is the policy of the District not to become entangled in the nature of the use of District facilities by religious organizations provided that such use complies with this policy and the law.

The Board, in approving the use of District facilities for religious services, does not support, condone, endorse, or in any way whatsoever indicate any District preference for a particular sect, belief, or religion, and no member of the Board or District employee may cause to be printed, distributed, or posted any material, or any other manner recognize through any auspices of the District, any particular organization approved for religious services.

Any sign, notice, or other means of announcing a religious use shall be posted only on the day of the use itself and shall not be posted during school hours.

### 5. Priority of Users.

Applications for use of District facilities shall be given preference in the following order:

- a. In-school uses, such as clubs and class events.
- b. Contracted uses.
- c. School support groups, or youth and senior citizens groups.
- d. Public agencies and public affairs groups.
- e. Community recreational and cultural groups (nonprofit).
- f. Nonprofit special interest groups, such as the Audubon Society, etc.
- g. Others as approved by the Superintendent or designee.

### 6. Damage to District Property.

Groups or persons using District facilities under the provisions of this policy shall be liable for any property damages caused by the activity. (Education Code 38134)

Any damage to District facilities caused by or arising out of any group's or person's use of such facilities, including but not limited to, painted surfaces, wood moldings, walls, backboards, ceilings, and/or other equipment caused by improper use of scotch tape, masking tape, or any other type of tape or adhesive, or by improper use of nails, tacks, thumbtacks, etc., shall be charged against the groups or persons. The Superintendent or designee shall charge the amount necessary to repair or restore the damaged surface to its condition before the group or person's use of District facilities and may deny the group or persons further use of District facilities. (Education Code 38134)

### 7. Application for Use of Facilities.

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain application procedures and regulations for the use of District facilities. Regulations shall include, but not be limited to: (Education Code 38133)

- a. Providing aid, assistance, and encouragement for any of the activities listed in Paragraph A.1 above.
- b. Preserving order in District facilities and on District grounds and protecting District facilities. If necessary, a person may be designated to supervise this task.
- c. Ensuring that the use of District facilities or grounds under this policy is not inconsistent with the use of the District facilities or grounds for school purposes and does not interfere with the regular conduct of school work.

Any persons applying for the use of District property on behalf of any society, group, or organization shall be a member of the applicant group. Unless the applicant is an officer of the group, the applicant shall present written authorization from the group to make the application.

### **HB.** USE OF DISTRICT FACILITIES AS POLLING PLACES

If a city or county elections official specifically requests the use of a school building as a polling place, the Board shall allow its use for such purpose. (Elections Code 12283) The Board may authorize the use of school buildings as polling places on any election day, and may also authorize the use of school buildings, without cost, for the storage of voting machines and other vote-tabulating devices. (Elections Code 12283) If school will be in session, the Superintendent or designee shall identify to elections officials the specific areas of the school buildings not occupied by school activities that will be allowed for use as polling places. (Elections Code 12283) When a school is used as a polling place, the Superintendent or designee shall provide the elections

official a site with an adequate amount of space that will allow the precinct board to perform its duties in a manner that will not impede, interfere, or interrupt the normal process of voting and shall make a telephone line for Internet access available for use by local elections officials if so requested. (Elections Code 12283) He/she shall make a reasonable effort to ensure that the site is accessible to persons with disabilities. (Elections Code 12283)

### C. USE OF DISTRICT FACILITIES FOR EMERGENCY SHELTERS

Pursuant to Education Code section 32282 and the District's school safety plan, District facilities may be used by a public agency, including the American Red Cross, for mass care and welfare shelters during disasters or other emergencies affecting the public health and welfare. (Education Code 32282)

## D. USE OF DISTRICT FACILITIES FOR COMMUNITY RECREATION PROGRAMS OR OTHER ACTIVITIES

Any groups or organizations that wish to use District facilities for recreational purposes shall submit requests in accordance with Board Policy and Administrative Regulation No. 6145.1. Any requests for use of District facilities that are not addressed in this board policy or another board policy shall be considered in accordance with the applicable law.

Purchasing and Contracting
EXPENDITURES AND PURCHASES

PURPOSE: To establish policies and procedures for the procurement of goods and services.

The Board recognizes <u>its fiduciary responsibility to oversee the that prudent expenditure of District</u> funds is important. To best serve District interests, the Superintendent or designee shall develop and maintain effective purchasing procedures that are consistent with sound financial controls and that ensure the District receives maximum value for items purchased. He/she shall ensure that records of expenditures and purchases are maintained in accordance with law.

Whenever required by law, purchasing shall be done by calling for bids or quotations as applicable. The Superintendent or designee may purchase supplies, materials, apparatus, equipment, and services up to the amounts specified in Public Contract Code section 20111, beyond which a competitive bidding process is required.

District funds shall not be expended for the purchase of alcoholic beverages. (Education Code 32435)

- A. Purchase Order List The Board shall review all transactions entered into by the Superintendent or designee on behalf of the Board every 60 days. (Education Code 17605). The purchase order list shall be updated on a regular basis by the Superintendent or designee and made available as an attachment to prepared Board agenda items for the Board's review. The list shall be made available prior to the Board meeting at which purchase orders shall be approved or ratified by the Board.
- B. Open Blanket (open) pPurchase oOrders.—To eliminate the processing of numerous small purchase orders, the Superintendent or designee may authorize school sites and departments to create open or "blanket" purchase orders for the purchase of minor items as needed from an authorized vendor. Examples of such items are may be used with vendors for the purchase of bus parts, and small items for Plant Operations, the Custodial and, Transportation and Maintenance Departments, and instructional supplies as needed for non-warehouse stocked items. The Campus Catering Department may utilize open purchase orders to procure food and supplies under the federal meal program, ensuring uninterrupted service in the event of unexpected supply chain disruptions, back orders, order cancellations, product shortages, or delivery delays. Other departments may also request open purchase orders as needed for nonwarehouse stocked items on an emergency basis. School sites may request open purchase orders for non-warehouse stocked instructional material. To comply with Education Code section 35168, an item whose value including tax and shipping exceeds \$500 may not be purchased on an open purchase order. Open purchase orders shall be issued to cover a period of time not to exceed 12 months and shall state the maximum amount authorized. In no case may the maximum amount be exceeded. Open purchase orders will be valid through the last day of school for school sites and through June 30 of each fiscal year. for non-school sites

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(departments). Increases to open purchase orders may be submitted <u>in accordance with District</u> <u>practices and policies</u>. through May 15 for school sites and June 15 for non-school sites (departments).

- C. <u>Surplus Property</u>. The Superintendent, Associate Superintendent of Administrative Services, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, and/or Director of Purchasing are authorized to sign for the purchase of surplus property items. <u>from the State Educational Agency for Surplus Property</u>. The Superintendent, Associate Superintendent of Administrative Services, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, Director of Campus Catering, and/or Director of Purchasing are authorized to sign documents for the purchase of food from the State of California sources.
- D. Purchasing Procedures and Authority. All purchases shall be made by a formal contract or a purchase order or shall be accompanied by a receipt. The Superintendent, Associate Superintendent of Administrative Services, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, and/or Director of Purchasing are authorized to issue, approve, and sign all purchase orders. The Superintendent, Associate Superintendent of Administrative Services, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, Director of Campus Catering, are authorized to issue, approve, and sign all purchase orders for the federal meal program food, food service equipment, and Campus Catering supplies. -All District purchasing shall be done by the use of purchase orders or by use of a District-issued credit card pursuant to District use, restrictions, and agreements as outlined in the CUSD Credit Card Manual, operating procedures, and policies with authorized District cardholders and District-approved credit card issuers. Merchandise shall be delivered either directly to the District location or to the District warehouse. Under no circumstances should merchandise be delivered to the personal residence of an employee or vendor. All purchase orders shall be approved or ratified by the Board. The District will not be liable for purchases made without a purchase order. If a purchase is made on behalf of the District without an approved purchase order, payment will be the responsibility of the individual that made the request. Payment of all contracts, including consultant agreements, shall follow the procedures outlined in Board Policy No. 3312.

The signature of one of the aforementioned designees shall be authority for the payment of purchases followed by ratification by the Board.

E. <u>Membership</u>. Memberships to professional associations or organizations in the District's name are allowable expenses. Memberships in employee's name only are non-allowable expenses except where provided in individual employee contracts.

PURPOSE: To establish an emergency and disaster preparedness plan.

The Board recognizes that all District staff and students must be prepared to respond quickly and responsibly to emergencies, disasters, or threats of disasters on any District sites. Therefore, the Superintendent or designee shall develop and maintain a disaster preparedness plan that contains routine and emergency disaster procedures and complies with applicable laws. Such procedures shall be incorporated into the District's comprehensive school safety plan. (Education Code 32282) The Superintendent or designee shall provide such training to District employees as are required of the District relating to the District's disaster preparedness plan.

The District's disaster preparedness plan shall also comply with the National Incident Management System (NIMS) and the Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS) in California. Such compliance will meet federal or state requirements necessary to receive disaster relief funding.

In the event of a natural, manmade, or war-caused emergency, District employees are considered disaster service workers and are subject to disaster service activities assigned to them. (Government Code 3100)

[NOTES: The following paragraph A regarding safe school is more aligned with the subject matter in BP 0450 — Comprehensive Safety Plan; therefore, it is being moved to BP 0450.]

#### A. SAFE SCHOOLS

The Superintendent or designee is instructed to prepare and ensure the implementation of such regulations that will require each school principal to establish a School Site Council and/or Safety Planning Committee (as defined by Education Code section 32281) to assess the school climate on campus, in the community while the students are under school authority, during the lunch break, and going to and from school. Each School Site Council/Safety Planning committee shall, in accordance with the law, develop and maintain Safe School Plans unique to the individual school climate. The Safe School Plan shall be adopted within one year of a school's opening, and annually updated thereafter according to the timeline set forth by the State of California.

The Superintendent or designee shall review each Safe School Plan prior to its submittal to the Board for approval to ensure student and staff safety and to ensure compliance with policies and regulations of the Board and statutes of the State of California. When such reviews establish that additional rules and regulations are required District wide, the Superintendent or designee shall make appropriate recommendations to the Board.

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The School Site Council/Planning Committee is to be particularly concerned with any conditions that exist that constitute a threat to the welfare of students and staff and to determine whether any additional rules, regulations or actions are necessary to correct such threats. When it is determined that additional rules or regulations are required, the Principal shall review and consider for adoption and implementation such rules.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish procedures to ensure notification to all continuing students at the beginning of each year and new enrollees upon enrollment of the District.

#### **AB. DISTRICT-LEVEL CRISIS READINESS**

At certain times, District personnel will be challenged with situations that could potentially threaten the safety of students, employees, and/or community members. The Superintendent or designee shall establish and implement District-wide emergency protocols to be followed if such a situation occurs. To manage particularly grave situations, the District will enact the Respond and Assist Crisis Team (ReACT). The ReACT Planning Group shall determine the need to implement ReACT and coordinate all ReACT activities. The Superintendent will serve as the ReACT Team Leader and the Deputy Superintendent will be the EOC Command Center Director. A ReACT oversight committee will meet regularly to update ReACT assignments, organize and implement ReACT drills, conduct training and maintain on-going communications with local agencies who would be critical partners in the face of a crisis (i.e. law enforcement, fire department, and emergency health services).

### **BC.** COMMUNICATIONS

The Board directs that the Superintendent or designee obtain and maintain for the District a multichannel communications system, adequate to meet daily and emergency needs of the District.

The Superintendent or designee shall communicate the District's disaster preparedness plan to parents through various means, including but not limited to, the Student and Parent Rights and Responsibilities Handbook.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

PURPOSE: Parents/guardians shall have the opportunity to work with schools in a mutually supportive and respectful partnership to support their children's success in school.

The Board recognizes that parents/guardians are their children's first and most influential teachers and that sustained parent involvement in the education of their children contributes greatly to student achievement and a positive school environment. The Superintendent or designee shall work with staff and parents/guardians to develop meaningful opportunities at all grade levels for parents/guardians to be involved in District and school activities; advisory, decision-making, and advocacy roles; and activities to support learning at home.

Parents/guardians shall be notified of their rights to be informed about and to participate in their children's education and of the opportunities available to them to do so, including the process for filing a complaint. Such notification shall be in the District's informational materials and publications, including the Student and Parent Rights and Responsibilities Handbook available to parents and students upon registration in the District and at the beginning of each school year. This information is available at www.cusd.com.

The District's local control and accountability plan (LCAP) shall include goals and strategies for parent/guardian involvement and family engagement, including District efforts to seek parent/guardian input in District and school site decision making and to promote parent/guardian participation in programs for English learners, foster youth, students eligible for free and reduced-price meals, and students with disabilities. (Education Code 42238.02, 52060)

The Superintendent or designee shall regularly evaluate and report to the Board on the effectiveness of the District's parent involvement efforts, including, but not limited to, input from parents/guardians and school staff on the adequacy of parent involvement opportunities and barriers that may inhibit parent/guardian participation.

#### NON-TITLE I SCHOOLS

For each school that does not receive federal Title I funds, the Superintendent or designee shall, at a minimum:

1. Develop a District parent involvement policy reflecting the needs of the community in collaboration with the various parent committees (School Site Council (SSC), School Assessment Review Team (SART), English Language Advisory Committee (ELAC), Intercultural Diversity Advisory Council (IDAC), etc.), as well as develop strategies to address the purposes and goals described in Education Code section 11504. The policy will be reviewed, revised, presented and made available to the parents on an annual basis

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through the District newsletter, web site, Parent and Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook or other methods.

- 2. Engage parents/guardians positively in their children's education by helping them develop skills to use at home that support their children's academic efforts at school and their children's development as responsible members of society.
  - a. Provide or make referrals to literacy training and/or parent education programs designed to improve the skills of parents/guardians and enhance their ability to support their children's education.
  - b. Provide information, in parent handbooks and through other appropriate means, regarding academic expectations and resources to assist with the subject matter.
  - c. Provide parents/guardians with information about their children's class assignments and homework assignments.
- 3. Inform parents/guardians that they can directly affect the success of their children's learning by providing them with techniques and strategies that they may use to improve their children's academic success and to assist their children in learning at home.

### FEDERAL AND STATE FUNDED PROGRAMS

The Board intends to provide opportunities for parents/guardians of children served by programs supported by designated funding (federal/state categorical funds) to participate in the design, implementation, and evaluation of the programs provided for their children.

Regulations and guidelines for federal/state categorical programs require parent involvement and/or advisory committees. The committees shall be organized in accordance with state and/or federal guidelines.

Parent involvement committees for federal/state categorical programs shall advise and report only on those programs which relate to the specific purpose for which they were organized. They shall serve in an advisory capacity and function on behalf of the District schools through established lines of authority. Their actions shall not financially obligate the District except with Board approval.

### A. Federal-Funded Programs

The parents/guardians of children enrolled in Title I programs shall be involved in planning, designing, and implementing these programs in an organized, systematic, ongoing, informed and timely fashion. They shall have regular opportunities to make recommendations on the educational needs of their children and on ways in which they can help their children benefit from the programs. All such recommendations shall receive timely responses.

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Federal regulations require schools receiving Title I funds to conduct annually at least one public meeting to which all parents/guardians of eligible children are invited. The purpose of the annual meeting shall be to discuss Title I programs and activities; inform parents/guardians of the right to consult in the planning, design, implementation and evaluation, solicit parent/guardian input, and provide for ongoing communications.

Federal regulations for Title I funding allow the District to provide for parent involvement through a formal advisory committee structure and through other less formal activities. The District shall include a description of the parent involvement structure/activities in its School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA). Federal regulations further require the District to annually assess, through consultation with parents/guardians, the effectiveness of the Title I Parental Involvement Policy and Program and to determine what action needs to be taken, if any, to increase parental participation.

The District, if it receives Title I funds, shall provide parents/guardians with timely information about schools in a language and format they can understand. The information shall include annual notification in accordance with applicable laws.

The District shall, as appropriate, provide information to assist the schools in building parents'/guardians' capacity for involvement and identifying barriers to greater participation, giving particular attention to parents/guardians of students who are economically disadvantaged, disabled, limited English proficient, have limited literacy, and/or of any racial or ethnic minority background. The District shall provide, as appropriate, technical assistance and other support to schools as needed to implement its Title I Parent Involvement Policy and/or Program.

The procedures for developing and implementing Title I parent involvement policies and programs shall be stated in Administrative Regulation No. 6020.

If the District also receives funds under federal Title IV, Part E, to coordinate and enhance family engagement programs, the Superintendent or designee shall inform parents/guardians and organizations of the existence of Title IV. (20 USC 6318)

The District's board policy and administrative regulation containing parent/guardian and family engagement strategies shall be incorporated into the District's LCAP in accordance with 20 USC section 6312. (20 USC 6318)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that each school receiving Title I funds develops a school-level parent/guardian and family engagement policy in accordance with 20 USC section 6318.

District and school-level parent/guardian and family engagement policies and administrative regulations shall be distributed to parents/guardians of students participating in Title I programs and shall be available to the local community. Parents/guardians shall be notified of the policy in

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an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, provided in a language the parents/guardians can understand.

### B. District/School Advisory Committees for State Funded Programs

The District shall establish <u>Parent District</u> and School Advisory Committees (<u>DAC PAC</u> and SAC) in accordance with applicable laws. The Superintendent shall include in Administrative Regulation No. 6020 a list of the required District/school advisory committees and a description of their purposes.

## **CLOVIS**-COMMUNITY SPORTS AND RECREATION AND COMMUNITY RECREATION PROGRAMS

PURPOSE: To establish and supervise the Clovis <u>Unified School District</u> Community Sports

and Recreation Department, and set forth provisions regarding requests by outside

groups or organizations to use District facilities for recreational purposes.

## A. Clovis-Community Sports and Recreation.

Clovis <u>Unified School District</u> Community Sports and Recreation Department (Department) activities are defined as noneducational, cultural, recreational, or sports programs and activities (Department programs and activities) facilitated by the District through one or more of its employees. The Department's noneducational, cultural, recreational and sports programs and activities are not part of the District's curricular, extra-curricular, or co-curricular educational program, and are entirely separate and distinct from the District's educational program. Participation in Department programs and activities does not result in any academic credits toward a District issued diploma, certificate, or license. The Department's recreational offerings are available to all age-appropriate participants in Clovis and surrounding communities, whether or not such participants are enrolled in the District's educational program. Students enrolled in the District's educational program are never required to participate in Department programs or activities. Participation in Department programs and activities, distinct from the District's educational curricular, extracurricular, or co-curricular offerings, may require the participants payment of registration costs.

The Board believes that the Department can offer recreational and enrichment opportunities and experiences to all age-appropriate community residents in a structured and motivational environment. Department programs and activities may complement regular District offerings and/or serve as fundraising opportunities for District programs, but are specifically intended as non-educational, cultural, recreational, and sports opportunities for Clovis and surrounding communities.

The Board also believes that the Department should be operated under guidelines that assure fairness, consistency, and financial accountability. Department programs and activities are not intended to supplement the regular school year salaries of District employees or to use the District to underwrite the cost of operating a private business.

The Superintendent is directed to adopt an administrative regulation that will provide safeguards to ensure the proper operation of District programs and activities consistent with this policy.

The Board directs the Department to budget scholarships to assist those age-appropriate community members who would face a hardship in paying a registration fee for participation in Department programs and activities.

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## B. Community Recreation Programs.

The Board desires to promote community recreation programs and to allow community groups and organizations to use District facilities for community recreational purposes whenever the use will not interfere with the District's use. (Education Code 10902, 10910, 10912) The procedures and requirements set forth in Administrative Regulation No. 6145.1 shall apply to requests by outside groups or organizations to use District facilities for community recreational purposes.

## HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

PURPOSE: To establish requirements for earning a high school diploma.

The mission of the District, in partnership with the community, is to provide exemplary educational programs and services that prepare students to be productive citizens in our democratic society. The following high school requirements encompass the knowledge, skills, and experiences needed to develop the essential habits of a productive citizen, which include habits of character, communication, citizenship, mind, self-direction, collaboration, wellness, and productivity.

		Commencement ceremonies will be scheduled at the end of the spring semester. Students completing the required graduation requirements after seven semesters of work and who complete the early graduation process shall be offered the opportunity to be awarded their diploma in a ceremony in the principal's office at the close of the seventh semester.
5.	Transfers	To Alternative Education: For students transferring into continuation classes from regular classes, grades and credits earned as of the date of transfer shall be transferred to continuation classes.

### C. Vocational Competency Certificate Program For Special Education Students.

The Vocational Competency Certificate Program (VCCP) is a course of study option for special education students which leads to graduation with a Vocational Competency Certificate. The VCCP is intended for students with a current Individualized Education Program (IEP) and recommended by their IEP team upon entering high school in the ninth-grade year or no later than the beginning of the eleventh grade. The outcome of the VCCP provides students with the skills necessary for employability and self-sufficiency within the community.

2.5 Commencement Exercises	Based on Education Code sections 56390 and 56391, students with an Individualized Education Program who have completed an alternative course of study approved by the Board are entitled to graduate with a certificate as specified by the Board. The students are also eligible to participate in any graduation ceremony and any school activity related to graduation as long as it meets all other requirements of being a student in good standing with their school.

### D. Exemptions from District-Adopted Graduation Requirements.

District students are required to complete graduation course requirements specified above, including the requirements imposed by Education Code section 51225.3 and those adopted by the Board. However, a foster youth, homeless student, former juvenile court school student, dependent of an active child of a military family, or migrant student who transfers into the District or between District schools any time after completing the second year of high school, or a newly arrived immigrant student who is in the third or fourth year of high school and is participating in a newcomer program, shall be exempted from any graduation requirements adopted by the Board that are in addition to statewide course requirements. This exemption shall not apply if the Superintendent or designee makes a finding that the student is reasonably able to complete the requirements in time to graduate by the end of the fourth year of high school. Within 30 days of the transfer or of the commencement of participation in a newcomer program, as applicable, the Superintendent or designee shall notify any eligible student of the availability of the exemption and whether the student qualifies for it. Any such student who at one time qualified for the exemption may request the exemption even if the student is no longer eligible. (Education Code 51225.1)

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Additionally, a student with disabilities shall be eligible for an exemption from all coursework and other requirements adopted by the Board in addition to the statewide course requirements for high school graduation, if the student's individualized education program ("IEP") provides for both the following requirements:

- 1. That the student is eligible to take the alternate assessment as described in Education Code 60640.
- 2. That the student complete state standards aligned coursework to meet the statewide coursework specified in Education Code section 51225.3.

The District's responsibility to provide a free appropriate public education shall not terminate when a student with a disability who is exempted from District-adopted graduation requirements participates in graduation activities unless the IEP team has determined that the student has completed the high school experience. (Education Code 51225.31)

# E. Retroactive Diplomas.

Any student who completed grade 12 in the 2003-04 through 2014-15 school year and met all applicable graduation requirements other than the passage of the high school exit examination shall be granted a high school diploma. (Education Code 51413)

In addition, the District may retroactively grant high school diplomas to: (Education Code 48204.4, 51430, 51440)

1. Persons who departed California against their will while in grade 12 and did not receive a diploma because the departure interrupted their education, provided that they were in good academic standing at the time of the departure.

Persons may be considered to have departed California against their will if they were in custody of a government agency and were transferred to another state, were subject to a lawful order from a court or government agency that authorized their removal from California, were subject to a lawful order and were permitted to depart California before being removed from California pursuant to the lawful order, were removed or were permitted to depart voluntarily pursuant to the federal Immigration and Nationality Act, or departed due to other circumstances determined by the district that are consistent with the purposes of Education Code section 48204.4.

In determining whether to award a diploma under these circumstances, the Superintendent or designee shall consider any coursework that may have been completed outside of the United States or through online or virtual courses.

2. Former students who were interned by order of the federal government during World War II or who are honorably discharged veterans of World War II, the Korean War, or the Vietnam War, provided that they were enrolled in a District school immediately preceding

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the internment or military service and did not receive a diploma because their education was interrupted due to the internment or military service in those wars.

Deceased former students who satisfy these conditions may be granted a retroactive diploma to be received by their next of kin.

- 3. Veterans who entered the military service of the United States while in grade 12 and who had satisfactorily completed the first half of the work required for grade 12 in a District school.
- 4. Former members of the military, that are a resident of California, and received an honorable discharge, or current members of the military, that are a resident of California, and a resident of California when entering the military.

In determining whether to award a diploma under these circumstances, the Superintendent or designee shall evaluate classes completed in any high school, community college, or state college, grant credit toward military service and training received while in the military, and if satisfied that the person has completed the equivalent of the requirements for graduation from high school, grant the person a diploma of graduation.

1.5. Seniors in high school during the 2019-20 school year, that were in good academic standing and on track to graduate at the end of the 2019-20 school year as of March 1, 2020, and were unable to complete the statewide graduation requirements as a result of the COVID-19 crisis.

# F. <u>Honorary Diplomas</u>.

The Board may grant an honorary high school diploma to: (Education Code 51225.5)

- 1. An international exchange student who has not completed the course of study ordinarily required for graduation and who is returning to the home country following the completion of one academic school year in the District.
- 2. A student who is terminally ill or deceased.

The honorary diploma shall be clearly distinguishable from the regular diploma of graduation awarded by the District. (Education Code 51225.5)

# SELECTION, EVALUATION, AND ADOPTION OF TEXTBOOKS

PURPOSE: To establish criteria and procedures for the selection, evaluation, and adoption of

textbooks.

The Board recognizes its responsibility to provide quality textbooks for District students.

# A. TEXTBOOKS

The Board shall adopt the primary text used in all courses/classes offered in the District.

The Board authorizes the Superintendent to adopt an administrative regulation to establish selection procedures for textbooks. The selection procedures shall provide for substantial involvement of teachers and shall encourage the participation of parents and community members. The procedures shall also evaluate whether the textbook accurately portrays individuals' roles and contributions in society and also enhances the use of multiple teaching strategies and technologies. (Education Code 60010, et seq.)

The Board authorizes the Superintendent or designee to take actions to implement this <u>board</u> policy, including but not limited to:

- 1. Verifying content requirements of purchased textbooks that are not on the state approved list pursuant to the Education Code.
- 2. Establishing professional development for employees reflective of effective instructional strategies for implementation of newly adopted materials.
- 3. Establishing procedures for an annual textbook inventory and distribution control.

Individuals who participate in the selection or review or adoption of textbooks or other instructional materials shall not receive or accept any gift or inducements from a representative of any publisher, manufacturer, or vendor.

The textbook adoption process will be coordinated by the Assistant Superintendent, of Curriculum, Instruction, and Accountability. All sample copies of textbooks shall be supplied to or requested through the Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum, Instruction, and Accountability or designee.

# B. <u>INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS</u>

<u>The Board shall adopt Instructional materials for grades 9-12 that meet the criteria specified in law, this board policy, and the administrative regulation-shall be adopted by the Superintendent.</u>

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(Education Code 60400) In adopting such instructional materials, the Board shall comply with Education Code section 243.

Standards-aligned materials in each core curriculum area shall be provided to each student <u>within</u> two months ofat the beginning of the first-school <u>yearterm</u>. (Education Code 60119)

# C. <u>SUFFICIENCY OF TEXTBOOKS</u>

The Board shall annually conduct one or more public hearings on the sufficiency of the District's instructional materials in accordance with Education Code section 60119 and other law as may be applicable. (Education Code 60119). The availability of sufficient core curriculum standards-based textbooks for each student, including English learners, shall be assessed annually and reported to the Board in accordance with applicable law. Sufficiency shall be defined as adequate site inventories so that each student, including English learners, shall have appropriate standards aligned textbooks to use in class and take home for the core curriculum areas of English language arts, mathematics, science, and social science for preschool - 12. (Education Code 60119) In addition, world language, health, and science laboratory equipment for grades 7 through 12, as appropriate shall be provided.

# D. COMPLAINTS

Complaints concerning instructional materials shall be addressed by the District, as applicable, using the District's complaint procedures set forth in Board Policy and Administrative Regulation No. 1312.2 – Complaints Regarding Instructional Materials, Board Policy and Administrative Regulation No. 1312.3 – Uniform Complaint Procedures, or Board Policy and Administrative Regulation No. 1312.4 – Williams Uniform Complaint Procedures.

# LIBRARY MEDIA CENTERS AND LIBRARY MATERIALS

PURPOSE: To ensure that students and teachers are provided access to a wide variety of

appropriate print and digital resources.

# A. STATEMENT OF POLICY

The Board recognizes that school libraries are an essential part of the school's educational program. By providing access to high-quality informational and supplemental resources, school libraries can deepen and personalize student learning to positively impact achievement and prepare students to become lifelong learners.

The Superintendent or designee may, in consultation with teacher librarians, classroom teachers, administrators, parents/guardians, and students as appropriate, develop and regularly update a plan for school libraries that describes the District's goals for school libraries and how funds will be distributed and used at school sites for the school library program. As appropriate, the plan may also address staffing, facilities, selection, and evaluation of materials, the development and maintenance of classroom libraries, prevention of loss and damage of library materials, prioritization of needs, and other related matters. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the library plan is aligned with the District and school plans as appropriate.

# B. STAFFING

The District may employ one or more teacher librarians at each school site who possess appropriate teaching credentials issued by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing. (Education Code 18120, 44868; 5 CCR 80024.6, 80053) The District may also appoint classified paraprofessionals to serve as library aides or library technicians. Volunteers may assist with school library services in accordance with law, board policy, and administrative regulation.

## C. SELECTION

Library materials shall be evaluated and selected by teacher librarian and/or site principal through a process that <u>complies with Education Code section 243 and other applicable laws, and invites</u> recommendations from administrators, teachers, other staff/parents/guardians, and students as appropriate.

Library materials shall meet these criteria:

- 1. Contain current and accurate information.
- 2. Represent artistic, historic, and literary qualities.

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- 3. Reflect diverse problems, aspirations, attitudes, and ideals of our nation.
- 4. Be selected for their strengths rather than rejected for their weaknesses.
- 5. Contribute to the objectives of the instructional program.
- 6. Be appropriate for the age, grade, and ability levels of the students for whom they are selected.
- 7. Represent differing viewpoints on controversial subjects.
- 8. Meet national and professional library standards for high quality materials.

Gifts and sponsored materials shall be subject to the same criteria as materials selected for purchase by the District.

Selection is an ongoing process which shall include the removal of resources that are no longer appropriate and the replacement of lost and worn resources still deemed necessary and/or valuable.

Complaints regarding the appropriateness of library materials used in the District's educational program shall be addressed by the District, as applicable, with the District's complaintmust be made according to the procedures outlinedset forth in Board Policy No. 1312.2 — Complaints Regarding Instructional Materials or Board Policy and Administrative Regulation No. 1312.3 — Uniform Complaint Procedures.

# **EDUCATION FOR ENGLISH LEARNERS**

PURPOSE: To ensure that English learners (EL) are provided with programs that develop

fluency in English as prescribed by law.

The Board intends to provide English learners with a challenging core curriculum and instruction that develops proficiency in English as rapidly and effectively as possible to assist students in becoming productive members of our society.

#### A. STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

English learners shall be provided differentiated English language development instruction which is targeted to their English proficiency level. Such instruction shall be based on sound instructional theory, be aligned with state content standards, emphasize inquiry-based learning and critical thinking skills, and be integrated across all subject areas.

No middle or high school student who is an English learner shall be denied enrollment in any of the following (Education Code 60811.8):

1. Courses in the core curriculum areas of reading/language arts, mathematics, science, and history/social science, courses required to meet state and local high school graduation requirements, or courses required for middle school grade promotion.

However, a middle or high school student who is a newcomer student or an immigrant child or youth, as defined in 20 USC 7011, or is a student participating in a program designed to meet the academic and transitional needs of newcomer students and that has as its primary objective the development of English language proficiency, may be denied enrollment in any of the courses stated above if the course of study provided to the student is designed to remedy academic deficits incurred during participation and is reasonably calculated to enable the student to attain parity of participation in the standard instructional program within a reasonable length of time after the student enters the school system.

- 2. A full course load of courses specified in Item #1 above.
- 3. Other courses that meet the "A-G" course requirements for college admission or are advanced courses such as honors or Advanced Placement courses, on the sole basis of the student's classification as an English learner.

The District shall identify in its local control and accountability plan (LCAP) goals and specific actions and services to enhance student engagement, academic achievement, and other outcomes for English learners and long-term English learners, in accordance with Board Policy 0460 - Local Control and Accountability Plan.

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The Superintendent or designee shall encourage parent/guardian and community involvement in the development and evaluation of programs for English learners. The Superintendent or designee may also provide an English development literacy training program for parents/guardians and community members so that they may better support students' English language development.

# B. STAFF QUALIFICATIONS AND TRAINING

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all staff employed to teach English learners possess the appropriate authorization from the Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

The District shall provide effective professional development to teachers (including teachers in classroom settings that are not the settings of language instruction educational programs), administrators, and other school or community-based organization personnel to improve the instruction and assessment of English learners and enhance staff's ability to understand and use curricula, assessment, and instructional strategies for English learners. Such professional development shall be of sufficient intensity and duration to produce a positive and lasting impact on teachers' performance in the classroom. (20 USC 6825)

Staff development shall also address the sociocultural needs of English learners and provide opportunities for teachers to engage in supportive, collaborative learning communities.

# C. IDENTIFICATION AND ASSESSMENT

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain procedures for the early identification and assessment of the proficiency of English learners at all grade levels, except transitional kindergarten, using the English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC). To oversee test administration, the Superintendent or designee shall annually designate a District ELPAC coordinator and a site coordinator for each test site in accordance with 5 CCR 11518.40-11518.45.

Once identified as an English learner, a student shall be annually assessed for language proficiency until the student is reclassified based on criteria specified in the accompanying administrative regulation.

In addition, English learners' academic achievement in English language arts, mathematics, science, and any additional subject required by law shall be assessed using the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress. As necessary, the test shall be administered with testing variations in accordance with 5 CCR 853. English learners who are in their first 12 months of attending a school in the United States shall be exempted from taking the English language arts assessment to the extent allowed by federal law. (Education Code 60603, 60640; 5 CCR 853)

Formative assessments may be utilized to analyze student performance and appropriately adapt teaching methodologies and instructions.

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# D. LANGUAGE ACQUISITION PROGRAMS

The District shall offer research-based language acquisition programs that are designed to ensure English acquisition as rapidly and as effectively as possible and that provide instruction to students on the state-adopted academic content standards, including the English language development standards. (Education Code 306; 5 CCR 11300)

At a minimum, the District shall offer a structured English immersion program which includes designated and integrated English language development. In the structured English immersion program, nearly all of the classroom instruction shall be provided in English, but with the curriculum and presentation designed for students who are learning English. (Education Code 305-306; 5 CCR 11309)

For the purpose of determining the amount of instruction to be conducted in English in the structured English immersion program, "nearly all" means that all classroom instruction shall be conducted in English except for clarification, explanation, and support as needed.

In addition, language acquisition programs offered by the District may include, but are not limited to, the following: (Education Code 305-306)

- 1. A dual-language immersion program that provides integrated language learning and academic instruction for native speakers of English and native speakers of another language, with the goals of high academic achievement, first and second language proficiency, and cross-cultural understanding
- 2. A transitional or developmental program for English learners that provides literacy and academic instruction in English and a student's native language and that enables an English learner to achieve English proficiency and academic mastery of subject matter content and higher order thinking skills, including critical thinking, to meet state academic content standards

The District's language acquisition programs for grades K-3 shall comply with class size requirements specified in Education Code 42238.02. (Education Code 310)

In establishing the District's language acquisition programs, the Superintendent or designee shall consult with parents/guardians and the community during the LCAP development process. The Superintendent or designee shall also consult with administrators, teachers, and other personnel with appropriate authorizations and experience in establishing a language acquisition program. (Education Code 305)

At the beginning of each school year or upon a student's enrollment, parents/guardians shall be provided information on the types of language acquisition programs available to students enrolled in the District, including, but not limited to, a description of each program, the process to be followed in making a program selection, identification of any language to be taught in addition to

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English when the program includes instruction in another language, and the process to request establishment of a language acquisition program. (Education Code 310; 5 CCR 11310)

Whenever a student is identified as an English learner based on the results of the ELPAC, the student's parents/guardians may choose a language acquisition program that best suits their child. To the extent possible, any language acquisition program requested by the parents/guardians of 30 or more students at the school or by the parents/guardians of 20 or more students at any grade level shall be offered by the school. (Education Code 310; 5 CCR 11311)

## E. RECLASSIFICATION/REDESIGNATION

When an English learner has acquired a reasonable level of English proficiency, as determined based on state and District reclassification criteria pursuant to Education Code 52164.6, or upon the request of the parent/guardian of an English learner, the student shall be transferred from a language acquisition program into an English language mainstream classroom.

English learners shall be reclassified as fluent English proficient when they are able to comprehend, speak, read, and write English well enough to receive instruction in an English language mainstream classroom and make academic progress at a level substantially equivalent to that of students of the same age or grade whose primary language is English and who are in the regular course of study. (Education Code 52164.6)

The criteria for determining whether an English learner shall be reclassified as fluent English proficient shall include, but not be limited to (Education Code 313, 52164.6; 5 CCR 11303):

- 1. Assessment of English language proficiency using an objective assessment instrument, including, but not limited to, the ELPAC.
- 2. Evaluation by the student's classroom teacher and any other certificated staff with direct responsibility for teaching or placement decisions related to the student, including, but not limited to, a review of the student's curriculum mastery and academic performance.
- 3. Parent/guardian involvement, including:
  - a. Notice to parents/guardians of language reclassification and placement, including a description of the reclassification process and the parent/guardian's opportunity to participate.
  - b. Encouragement of parent/guardian participation in the District's reclassification procedure, including seeking parent/guardian opinion and consultation during the reclassification process.

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- c. Provision of an interpreter for the parent/guardian, when necessary.
- 4. Comparison of student performance on an objective assessment of basic skills in English against an empirically established range of performance in basic skills, based on the performance of English proficient students of the same age, which demonstrates whether the student is sufficiently proficient in English to participate effectively in a curriculum designed for students of the same age whose native language is English

The student's language proficiency assessments, the participants in the reclassification process, and any decisions regarding reclassification shall be retained in the student's permanent record. (5 CCR 11305)

The Superintendent or designee shall monitor the progress of reclassified students to ensure their correct classification and placement. (5 CCR 11304)

The Superintendent or designee shall monitor students for at least four years following their reclassification to ensure the students have not prematurely exited, any academic deficit incurred through participation in the English learner program has been remedied, and the students are meaningfully participating in the standard instructional program compared to students who had never participated in an English learner program. (5 CCR 11304; 20 USC 6841)

## F. PROGRAM EVALUATION

To evaluate the effectiveness of the District's educational program for English learners, the Superintendent or designee shall report to the Board, at least annually, regarding:

- 1. Progress of English learners towards proficiency in English.
- 2. The number and percentage of English learners reclassified as fluent English proficient.
- 3. The number and percentage of English learners who are or are at risk of being classified as long-term English learners as defined in Education Code 313.1.
- 4. The achievement of English learners on standards-based tests in core curricular areas.
- 5. For any language acquisition program that includes instruction in a language other than English, student achievement in the non-English language in accordance with 5 CCR 11309.
- 6. Progress toward any other goals identified in the District's LCAP for English learners and long-term English learners as defined in Education Code 52052.

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7. A comparison of current data with data from at least the previous year in regard to Items #1-6 above.

8. A comparison of data between the different language acquisition programs offered by the District.

The Superintendent or designee shall also provide the Board with regular reports from any District or schoolwide English learner advisory committees.

The District's program shall be based on sound instructional theory and shall be adequately supported so that English learners can achieve results at the same academic level as their English-proficient peers.

To ensure that the District is using sound methods that effectively serve the needs of English learners, the Superintendent or designee shall annually examine program results, including reports of the students' academic achievement and their progress towards proficiency in English. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that schools compile data on programs for English learners to determine program effectiveness. The Board encourages District staff to exchange information with other school districts and the county office of education about programs, options, and strategies for English learners that succeed under various demographic conditions.

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain procedures that provide for the identification, assessment, and placement of English learners and for their re-designation based on criteria adopted by the Board and specified in the administrative regulation. Said procedures are described in the District's Master Plan - A Guide to Services for English Learners.

Students who are English learners shall be educated through structured English immersion during a temporary transition period not normally intended to exceed one year. After one year, students may continue in structured English immersion until they meet the District's criteria but not to exceed three years. In the structured English immersion process, classroom instruction shall be nearly all in English. All classroom instruction shall be in English; however, clarification, explanation, assistance, and support, as needed, may be in a student's primary language. Instruction shall be enhanced through identified techniques (i.e., graphic organizers, academic day instruction, and realia) that support the needs of English learners.

Upon enrollment, each student's primary language shall be determined. The Home Language Survey is the instrument used for the determination. Within 30 calendar days of their initial enrollment, students who are identified as having a primary language other than English, as determined by the Home Language Survey, shall be assessed for English proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Within 90 days of initial enrollment, students identified as having limited English proficiency shall be further assessed for primary language proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. English learners will be assessed annually until they are reclassified

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as English proficient. The Superintendent or designee shall develop criteria for determining student needs on the basis of these assessments.

Before students are enrolled in a program for English learners, parents/guardians shall receive information about the program and their opportunities for parental involvement. This information shall include the fact that a student's participation in the program is voluntary. A parent/guardian may request that his/her child not be enrolled in a program for English learners.

An English learner shall be transferred from a structured English immersion process to an English language mainstream classroom when the student has acquired a reasonable level of English proficiency, as measured by any of the state-designated assessments approved by the California Department of Education or any locally developed assessments. Additional and appropriate services shall be provided until the English learner is re-designated to fluent English proficiency. A student has acquired a reasonable level of English proficiency when he/she has reached the intermediate fluency stage of English language development as measured by the English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC).

Upon the request of his/her parent/guardian, a student shall be placed in an English language mainstream classroom.

The Board recognizes that English learners who have been enrolled in the District for less than one year (12 months) may be tested in the Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC), with standard or non-standard accommodations, in accordance with the manuals or other instructions provided by the test publisher. Such nonstandard accommodations may be applied at each school to identified English learners enrolled in the District less than one year for whom nonstandard accommodations may be appropriate due to the student's limited English proficiency. Nonstandard accommodations may include, but are not limited to, reading and translating the test instructions into the student's primary language and the use of a bilingual dictionary.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt mCLASS with DIBELS by Amplify Education as the reading difficulty risk screener to be used by all kindergarten, first grade and second grade teachers in Clovis Unified School District.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Under California Education Code section 53008(a)(1)(2), local educational agencies (LEAs) must annually screen kindergarten through grade two students, both English speakers and non-English speakers, for risk of reading difficulties, including dyslexia, to meet the requirements of Senate Bill (SB) 114 (Education Omnibus Trailer Bill).

An expert panel, the Reading Difficulties Risk Screener Selection Panel, formed per SB 114 and appointed in January 2024, selected four approved screening tools based on criteria set by the State Board of Education emphasizing validity, reliability, cultural/language appropriateness and student representation. The list of approved screeners is as follows:

- 1. Amira Grades K-2, English/Spanish, by Amira Learning
- 2. mCLASS with DIBELS 8 / mCLASS Lectura Grades K-2, English/Spanish, by Amplify Education
- 3. ROAR Grades 1-2, English only, by Stanford University
- 4. Multitudes Grades K-2, English/Spanish, by UCSF Dyslexia Center

In March 2025, 70% of a teacher panel across Clovis Unified recommended Amplify Education's mCLASS with DIBELS for universal kindergarten through second grade screening.

LEAs' governing boards must adopt a screener by June 30, 2025, at a public meeting.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

No financial impact in year one. Continuation of State funding to be determined in future California budgets.

- 2024 State Budget Act: \$15 million (one-time) for educator training.
- 2025-26 Governor's Budget: \$40 million (one-time) for screeners, materials, training.

Approval/disclosure also includes the implementation of an increased contribution for health benefits, bringing the total District contribution to \$16,385 for health, dental and vision per eligible employee annually.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The costs associated with the salary schedule increase, the employer contribution toward health and welfare benefits, and the implementation of the classification study for non-represented employees will be funded through a combination of increased LCFF revenues and the existing fund balance.  The additional LCFF revenue is driven by the cost-of-living adjustment (COLA), as well as increases in district enrollment and, ultimately, Average Daily Attendance (ADA).

The District will continue to strategically reduce its unrestricted reserve, while ensuring it does not fall below the Board-approved minimum reserve level of 10%. Additionally, LCFF revenue is projected to increase in future years, driven by anticipated cost-of-living adjustments (COLA) and continued growth in enrollment and Average Daily Attendance (ADA).

All of the projected reserves are inclusive of the Board approved 10% minimum reserve for economic uncertainties.

#### 2024-25 Proposition 28 - Arts and Music in Schools Funding Annual Report

#### Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program(s) funded.

Building on last year's foundational investments in arts education equipment and staffing, Clovis Unified has deepened its commitment to expanding arts programming. Significant investments were made in new musical instruments, allowing schools to grow their instrumental music programs and provide students with high-quality tools for both instruction and performance. These instruments are not only enhancing technical skill development but also fostering deeper student engagement in musical expression and ensemble participation.

To support visual arts, schools equipped photography classes with computers tailored for digital editing and instruction. In ceramics, specialized tools and equipment enabled hands-on, three-dimensional artistic experiences, broadening the scope of creative learning opportunities. Movement arts also saw a strong boost. Schools acquired dedicated dance equipment and supplies, expanding dance curricula and acknowledging the value of movement in both artistic and physical development. Notably, sites increased staff time specifically for dance physical education, highlighting the growing recognition of the arts' role in student wellness.

Staffing expansion continues to be a key strategy for fulfilling Prop 28 requirements. Building on prior years' progress, schools are planning to add both certificated and classified staff in 2025–26 to ensure all students have access to high-quality, comprehensive arts instruction. These staffing increases are already resulting in more individualized and specialized instruction. The investments in music, photography, ceramics, and dance have not only broadened program offerings but also boosted student participation and appreciation for the arts. These efforts reflect Clovis Unified's thoughtful use of Prop 28 funds to build sustainable, inclusive programming that honors the district's diverse student population.

With 2024–25 serving as a foundation year, Clovis Unified is positioning its arts programs for continued growth. The focus on cultural authenticity and movement arts underscores the district's vision to foster meaningful, community-rooted arts education for years to come.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt Resolution No. 4055 approving the District's School Facilities Needs Analysis (SFNA) to maintain a Level II Alternative School Facilities (Developer) Fee of \$5.86 per square foot, effective July 1, 2025, and adopt a California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Notice of Exemption, as submitted.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Since January 1987, school districts have had the authority to levy developer fees for all new construction within the school district including residential, commercial, and industrial development. The current maximum Level I fees school districts are authorized to levy are \$5.17 per square foot for residential development and \$0.84 per square foot for commercial and industrial development. At the current time, the District uses the Level II residential development fee of \$5.86 per square foot.

With the adoption of Senate Bill 50 (Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998), school districts are authorized to levy a fee in excess of the amount identified above for new residential development with said fee to be based on State guidelines and the adoption of a school facilities needs analysis.

Based on State guidelines related to student generation rates from new development, projected new development during the upcoming five (5) years, State building costs, State approved school site acreage, estimated infrastructure costs for off-site, service-site, and utility improvements, the District's Level II alternative fee has been determined to be \$5.86 per square foot, which represents fifty percent (50%) of the facilities cost. It should be kept in mind that the costs included in the SFNA report reflect State guidelines and are not the "true" cost of building and occupying new schools in the District.

The report was delivered to representatives of the City of Clovis, City of Fresno, County of Fresno, and the Building Industry Association in accordance with legal requirements. A copy was made available for review on the District website and through the District's Facility Services office.

It is recommended that the Governing Board adopt the attached Resolution No. 4055 that approves the District's SFNA and authorizes the implementation of the Level II fee of \$5.86 per square foot for all new residential development effective July 1, 2025.

Provisions of the California Education and Government Codes allow for the adoption of an SFNA, and the establishment of Level II fees to be found exempt from the CEQA. Accordingly, Resolution No. 4055 also authorizes the District Superintendent or designee to file a Notice of Exemption from CEQA.

# RESOLUTION NO. 4055 BEFORE THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FRESNO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

# IN THE MATTER OF THE ADOPTION OF A SCHOOL FACILITIES NEEDS ANALYSIS AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF ALTERNATIVE LEVEL II SCHOOL FACILITIES (DEVELOPER) FEES, ADOPTION OF CEQA NOTICE OF EXEMPTION

**WHEREAS,** Education Code section 17620 authorizes school districts to impose certain fees as set forth in Government Code section 65995 et seq. to finance the construction and reconstruction of school facilities; and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to Government Code section 65995 the District is currently levying its Level I fee at \$5.17 per square foot of assessable residential construction; and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to Government Code section 65995.5, the District is currently levying a Level II fee of \$5.86 per square foot of assessable residential construction; and

WHEREAS, under Senate Bill 50 (SB 50), the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 407, Statutes of 1998), Government Code section 65995.5 provides that in lieu of a residential fee imposed under Government Code section 65995, subdivision (b)(1), a school district may impose alternative fees on new residential construction in amounts calculated pursuant to Section 65995.5, subdivision (c), and 65995.7; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code section 65995.5, subdivision (b), in order to be eligible to impose fees in these alternative amounts, the school district is required to do all of the following: (1) make a timely application to the State Allocation Board (SAB) for new construction funding and be deemed by the SAB to meet the eligibility requirements for new construction funding; (2) conduct and adopt a School Facilities Needs Analysis (SFNA) pursuant to Government Code section 65995.6; and (3) until January 1, 2000, satisfy at least one of the requirements set forth in subparagraphs (A) to (D) inclusive of Government Code section 65995.5, subdivision (b)(3), and after January 1, 2000, satisfy at least two of said requirements; and

**WHEREAS**, Education Code section 17621 specifically exempts the adoption, increase, or imposition of any fee, charge, dedication or other requirement pursuant to Education Code section 17620 from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") (Pub. Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.); and

**WHEREAS,** upon a determination that the imposition of school facilities fees under Education Code section 17620 is exempt from CEQA, the District is entitled to file a Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk pursuant to California Code of Regulations, Title 14, section 15062.

#### **THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board makes the following findings:

- 1. The District has been determined by the State Allocation Board to meet the eligibility requirements for new construction funding.
- 2. The District has satisfied the requirements of Government Code section 65995.5, subdivision (b)(3)(C), in that the District has issued debt or incurred obligations for capital outlay in an amount equivalent to 15 percent of its local bonding capacity. The District has further satisfied the requirements of Government Code section 65995.5, subdivision (b)(3)(D), in that the District has placed a local general obligation bond measure for school facilities on the ballot in the last four years that received at least 50 percent plus one vote.
  - 3. The District has conducted a SFNA consistent with the requirements of Government Code section 65995.6 whereby the District has determined the need for school facilities to accommodate un-housed pupils that are attributable to projected enrollment growth from the development of new residential units over the next five years.
  - 4. The District's SFNA projects that over the next five years new residential construction will generate a total of approximately 2,450 students in grades TK-6; 568 students in grades 7-8; 990 students in grades 9-12; and 137 Special Day Class (SDC) students that must be housed at a total allowable cost calculated pursuant to the requirements of Government Code section 65995.5, subdivision (c) for facilities, site acquisition and development of \$100,543,448 which when divided by the projected square footage of new residential units anticipated to be constructed over the next five years' results in a maximum alternative residential fee of \$5.86 square foot of assessable residential construction (Level II Fee).

- 5. The purpose of the alternative Level II fee is to provide school facilities for unhoused students who will be generated as a result of the construction of new residential units in the District over the next five years.
- 6. The alternative Level II fees are to be used exclusively for the school facilities identified in the District's SFNA consistent with Government Code section 65995.5, subdivision (f).
- 7. There is a reasonable relationship between the need for school facilities and the type of development on which the fees are imposed because, as set forth in the District's School Facilities Needs Analysis, the construction of new residential units generates students that cannot be housed without additional facilities.
- 8. There is reasonable relationship between the use of the fees and the types of development projects on which the fees are imposed in that new residential units will generate students who will attend the District schools, these students cannot be housed by the District without the construction of additional facilities, and the fees will be solely expended to finance these new additional facilities.
- 9. There is a reasonable relationship between the amount of the fees and the cost of the facilities attributable to the construction of new residential units on which the fees are imposed in that the square footage of these types of units has a direct relationship to the number of students generated and, thus, to the facilities which the District must add to accommodate those students.
- **BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that the Board conducted a noticed of public hearing at its regular meeting of June 11, 2025, at which time information contained in the District's School Facilities Needs Analysis was presented, together with the District's responses to all written comments received regarding the School Facilities Needs Analysis. The Board hereby adopts the School Facilities Needs Analysis and incorporates its School Facilities Needs Analysis herein by reference.
- **BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that the Board hereby establishes an alternative Level II fee in the amount of \$5.86 per square foot of assessable residential construction and the alternative Level II fees will take effect on July 1, 2025.
- **BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that the District has established a separate account in which all Level II fees collected pursuant to this Resolution, along with any interest income earned therein, shall be deposited in order to avoid any commingling of the fees with other fees,

revenues and funds of the District, except for temporary investments, and that the District is authorized to make expenditures or to incur obligations solely for the purposes for which the fees are collected, which the Governing Board hereby designates to be those purposes permitted by any applicable law.

**BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that if the District has unexpended or uncommitted fees within five (5) years of collection, the District will make required findings or refund the fees as set forth in Education Code section 17624.

**BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that the Level II fees established pursuant to this Resolution are not subject to the restriction contained in subdivision (a) of Government Code section 66007, and that no building permit shall be issued for any development absent certification of compliance by the development project with the fees imposed pursuant to this Resolution.

**BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that the Superintendent or her designee give notice to all cities and counties with jurisdiction over the territory of the District of the Board's action by serving a copy of this Resolution, the supporting documentation and a map indicating the areas subject to the Level II fees on each agency and requesting that no building permits or, for manufactured homes and mobile homes, Certificates of Occupancy, be issued on or after the date of this Resolution without certification from the District that the Level II fees specified herein have been paid.

**BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that the Board hereby finds that the adoption of fees hereunder is statutorily exempt from the requirements of CEQA pursuant to Education Code section 17621.

**BE IT ALSO RESOLVED** that this Board hereby approves the CEQA Notice of Exemption regarding the imposition of fees and directs the Superintendent, or her designee, to file the CEQA Notice of Exemption, together with a certified copy of this Resolution with the County Clerk pursuant to Education Code section 17621.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

At the October 6, 2021, CUSD Governing Board meeting, the Board approved Harris Construction to be the District's lease-leaseback contractor for the new seven-12 educational center and instructed the District to prepare the lease-leaseback agreement, site lease agreement and sublease agreements. Harris was also authorized to begin performing designated pre-construction services for the new educational center.

Following the October 6, 2021, Board meeting, Harris worked with the District and the project architect to perform pre-construction services including site evaluation, constructability review, design meetings, scheduling, cost estimates and construction planning.

On May 20, 2025, Harris received bids from subcontractors to construct increment six of the Terry P. Bradley Educational Center. The District participated in the bid process and pre-qualification of all the subcontractors to ensure that the best value is received. Following the bid opening, a two-week review by Harris Construction was conducted to evaluate best value in accordance with Education Code section 17406. A final review by Harris Construction and CUSD was conducted on June 5, 2025. The sum of the subcontractors' bids is considered the "Total Sublease Amount" under the terms of the District lease-leaseback agreement with Harris Construction and will be set out in the schedule of sublease payments.

# RESOLUTION NO. 4051 BEFORE THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FRESNO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

### MAKING FINDINGS, AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING ENERGY SERVICES AGREEMENTS, AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF OTHER DOCUMENTS AND OTHER ACTIONS REQUIRED IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State of California and the intent of the State Legislature to promote all feasible means of energy conservation and all feasible uses of alternative energy supply sources; and

WHEREAS, Clovis Unified School District ("District") desires to reduce the steadily rising costs of meeting the energy needs at its facilities; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to enter into an energy services agreement to install solar facilities for Terry P. Bradley Educational Center and Hirayama Elementary School (referred to individually as "School" and collectively as "Schools") to reduce rising energy costs. The District owns the real properties on which the Schools are located; and

WHEREAS, the District previously entered into energy services agreements that were terminated by the selected energy services providers. At this time, the District intends to engage Holt Renewables ("Company") to complete the energy conservation measures using the existing plans; and

**WHEREAS,** TerraVerde Energy, LLC ("TerraVerde") has provided the District with an analysis showing the benefits of implementing certain energy conservation measures through the installation of certain solar energy and battery power facilities ("Project") at each School, and TerraVerde's analysis ("Analysis") is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> and made part hereof by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the Analysis includes data showing that the anticipated cost to the District for the Project will be less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of electrical energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the District proposes to enter into an energy services agreements and related contract documents with Company relating to the solar energy and battery power facilities at the

Schools. Company will design, construct, and install at each School certain solar energy and battery power facilities and arrange with the local utility for interconnection of the facilities, which will generate energy for the School; and

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to Government Code section 4217.12, the Board has held a public hearing, public notice of which was given at least two weeks in advance, to receive public comment; and

WHEREAS, the District's proposed approval of each energy services agreement whereby Company is required to perform the Project is a project for purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"); and

WHEREAS, the Guidelines for CEQA, California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 13 ("State CEQA Guidelines"), exempt certain projects from further CEQA evaluation, including the following: (1) projects consisting of the new construction or conversion of small structures ("Class 3 Exemption"; Cal. Code Regs., Title 14, § 15303); (2) projects consisting of the construction or placement of minor accessory structures to existing facilities ("Class 11 Exemption"; Cal. Code Regs., Title 14, § 15311); and (3) projects consisting of minor additions to existing schools ("Class 14 Exemption"; Cal. Code Regs., Title 14, § 15314), and the Project is categorically exempt under one or more of such exemptions; and

**WHEREAS,** the Project does not involve any of the following and so is eligible for a categorical exemption as described above under State CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2:

- (a) the cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, which over time are significant;
- (b) an activity where there is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances;
- (c) a project which may result in damage to scenic resources, including but not limited to, trees, historic buildings, rock outcroppings, or similar resources, within a highway officially designated as a state scenic highway;
- (d) a hazardous waste site which is included on any list compiled pursuant to Government Code section 65962.5; and
- (e) a project which may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.

WHEREAS, Public Resources Code section 21080.35 exempts from CEQA evaluation

the installation of a solar energy system, including associated equipment, on the roof of an existing building or at an existing parking lot; and

WHEREAS, the portions of the Project to be installed at an existing parking lot do not involve either of the following and so are eligible for the statutory exemption of Public Resources Code section 21080.35: (a) the removal of a tree required to be planted, maintained, or protected pursuant to local, state, or federal requirements, unless the tree dies and there is no requirement to replace the tree; or (b) the removal of a native tree over 25 years old.

The Board hereby approves each energy services agreement and authorizes and directs the Superintendent or designee to negotiate the terms and conditions of the agreements as he/she reasonably deems necessary, and thereafter to execute and deliver the agreements following the Board's adoption of this Resolution. The District's Superintendent or designee is further authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all papers, instruments, opinions, certificates, affidavits and other documents and to do or cause to be done any and all other acts and things necessary or proper for carrying out this Resolution.
- 4. The Project is hereby found to be exempt from the requirements of CEQA pursuant to Class 3, Class 11, and Class 14 exemptions, as described above.
- 5. The Project is hereby found to be exempt from the requirements of CEQA pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21080.35 as described above.
- 6. District staff is hereby authorized and directed to file and process a Notice of CEQA Exemption for the Project in accordance with CEQA and the State CEQA Guidelines, and the findings set forth in this Resolution.

# RESOLUTION NO. 4060 BEFORE THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE CLOVIS UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FRESNO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

### MAKING FINDINGS, AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING ENERGY SERVICES AGREEMENTS, AND AUTHORIZING EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF OTHER DOCUMENTS AND OTHER ACTIONS REQUIRED IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State of California and the intent of the State Legislature to promote all feasible means of energy conservation and all feasible uses of alternative energy supply sources; and

WHEREAS, Clovis Unified School District ("District") desires to reduce the steadily rising costs of meeting the energy needs at its facilities; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to enter into an energy services agreement to install window film in school sites across the District (referred to individually as "School" and collectively as "Schools") to reduce rising energy costs. The District owns the real properties on which the Schools are located; and

WHEREAS, the District intends to engage Pro Screen ("Company") to install the window film across the District to reduce solar heat gain ("Project"). The District's analysis showing the anticipated cost savings ("Analysis") is attached hereto as <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> and made part hereof by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the Analysis includes data showing that the anticipated cost to the District for the Project will be less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of electrical energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of the Project; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Government Code section 4217.12, the Board has held a public hearing, public notice of which was given at least two weeks in advance, to receive public comment; and

WHEREAS, the District's proposed approval of energy services agreements whereby Company is required to perform the Project is a project for purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"); and

WHEREAS, the Guidelines for CEQA, California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter

13 ("State CEQA Guidelines"), exempt certain projects from further CEQA evaluation, including the following: (1) projects consisting of the new construction or conversion of small structures ("Class 3 Exemption"; Cal. Code Regs., Title 14, § 15303); (2) projects consisting of the construction or placement of minor accessory structures to existing facilities ("Class 11 Exemption"; Cal. Code Regs., Title 14, § 15311); and (3) projects consisting of minor additions to existing schools ("Class 14 Exemption"; Cal. Code Regs., Title 14, § 15314), and the Project is categorically exempt under one or more of such exemptions; and

- (d) a hazardous waste site which is included on any list compiled pursuant to Government Code section 65962.5; and
- (e) a project which may cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.
