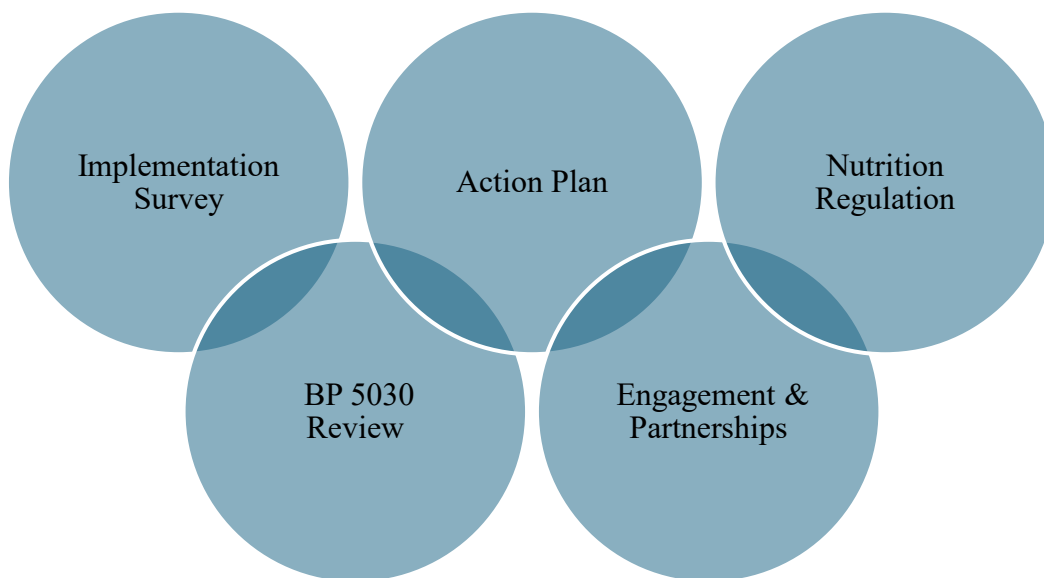
Executive Summary

The Campus Catering Department is pleased to present the results and progress of the Coordinated School Health Committee (CSHC). This report summarizes the district's efforts to align with Board Policy No. 5030 Student Wellness through enhanced nutrition standards, increased access to fresh produce, and the integration of scratch cooking elements.

Purpose and Policy

Local Educational Agencies (LEA) that participate in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), and the School Breakfast Program (SBP), are required to establish a Local School Wellness Policy (LSWP). LSWPs are an important tool for parents, and LEAs in promoting student wellness, preventing and reducing childhood obesity, and providing assurance that school meal nutrition guidelines meet the minimum federal school meal standards. The Coordinated School Health Committee:

- Meets twice a year to review Board Policy No. 5030 and evaluate progress on the established action plans. During the most recent meeting, the committee also conducted a survey to monitor implementation outcomes, assess action plan effectiveness, and review Board Policy No. 5030 compliance.
- Fosters engagement and partnerships to enhance collaboration among families, schools, and community organizations in support of student wellness.





Action Plan Highlights

The district focused on five core goals to improve student wellness and nutrition awareness:

- **Goal 1: Smart Snacks Awareness:** Created a comprehensive "Smart Snacks in School Guide" in partnership with CSU Fresno and conducted three targeted training sessions for 95 site leaders and Parent Teacher Club (PTC) members.
- **Goal 2: Fresh Produce Access:** Leveraged the Department of Defense (DOD) Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program and local farmer partnerships to bring fresh local produce to student meals.
- **Goal 3: Non-Food Celebrations:** Encouraged a transition toward non-food-based celebrations in the classroom to promote healthier environments.
- **Goal 4: Meal Access & Education:** Utilized student-focused taste tests, menu feedback, and food recovery programs to increase student engagement with meal programs.
- **Goal 5: Scratch Cooking:** Successfully introduced house-made elements including enchilada sauce, scratch cinnamon rolls, fresh-baked muffins, and deli rolls.

Survey Results & Implementation Feedback

After surveying the committee, which included staff, parents, and nurses, members reported progress in several areas. Progress included increasing awareness of Smart Snacks and competitive food standards through training and communications; expanding access to fresh fruits and vegetables using Department of Defense Produce funding; encouraging non-food classroom celebrations following adopted policy revisions; and promoting school meal programs through nutrition education, food recovery efforts, and student engagement activities.



Implementation Ratings and Feedback (Out of 5.0):

- **Goal 1: Smart Snacks & School Resource Guide** — 4.5/5
Respondents noted that school sites may need additional support to implement the guide effectively.
- **Goal 2: Fresh Produce** — 4.8/5
Respondents appreciate the focus on healthy foods and the availability of fresh produce.
- **Goal 3: Non-Food Based Classroom Celebrations** — 3.8/5
Respondents reported inconsistent implementation across sites and highlighted the need for continued education and additional focus at school sites.
- **Goal 4: School Meal Promotion & Nutrition Education** — 5/5
Respondents appreciated student involvement through taste tests, the introduction of new foods, and the nutrition education provided.
- **Goal 5: Scratch Cooking Elements** — 4.4/5
Respondents support scratch cooking efforts and the emphasis on healthier meals.

Committee Support to Continue:

- **100% Support:** Goals 1, 3, 4, and 5
- **80% Support:** Goal 2

Key Findings & Next Steps

While overall feedback was highly positive, particularly regarding student involvement in taste tests and the increase in fresh produce, the committee identified specific areas for growth:

- **Site Consistency:** Respondents noted that implementation of non-food celebrations remains inconsistent and requires more site-level focus and parent education.
- **Expanded Support:** Some sites may need additional assistance to fully implement Smart Snacks standards.

Moving forward, the committee's future roadmap will focus on strengthening partnerships by increasing engagement with community and committee stakeholders, monitoring upcoming school nutrition regulations to ensure ongoing compliance, preparing for the 2026–2027 Triennial Wellness Assessment, and continuing the implementation of established action plans.

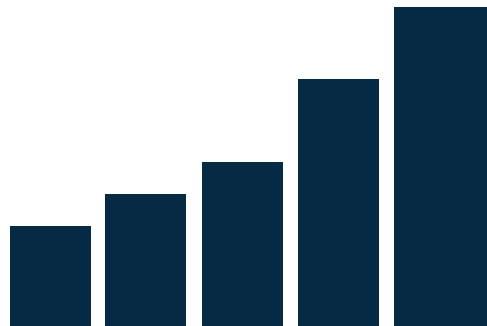

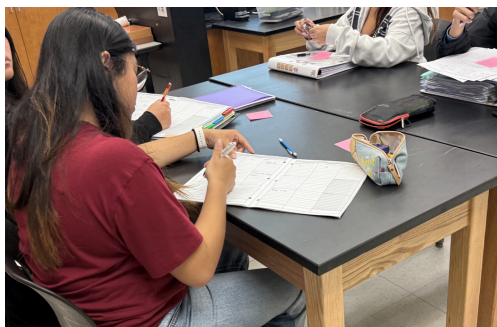

- **Problem-Solving:** Working collectively to master rigorous curriculum.

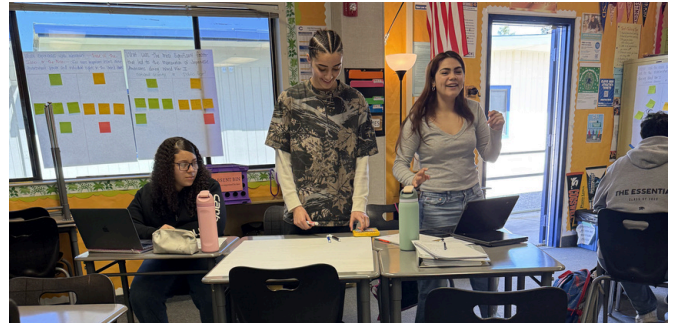

Growing AVID Capacity

In 2025-26, we have increased the percent of AVID - trained elementary teachers by 7% .



Clovis Unified is expanding its AVID capacity by onboarding more elementary schools. All secondary schools offer the AVID elective and implement AVID strategies across various content areas. Philip V. Sanchez Intermediate is an additional AVID site this year. They provide the AVID elective along with training additional teachers and staff at the AVID Summer Institute and through AVID District Pathway training. These AVID trainings support rigorous lesson planning, enhance college and career readiness skills, and promote student achievement for all learners.

By 2026-27, Clovis Unified will have expanded its AVID-Certified sites to include the following:

- 24 Elementary
- 6 Intermediate
- 6 High School

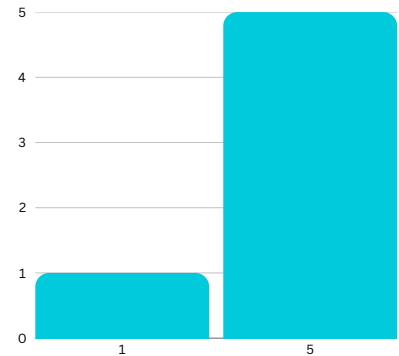

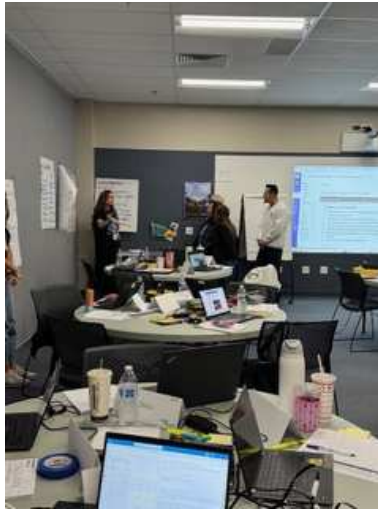
AVID Excel Elective is growing in CUSD

The Intermediate AVID Excel Elective for LTELS is offered at Clark, Kastner, Alta Sierra, Reyburn, and Sanchez intermediate schools.

The AVID Excel Elective is an intermediate program designed to support underrepresented students, particularly English learners, in developing academic skills and preparing for college and career readiness. The program focuses on building strong organizational habits, critical thinking, and effective study skills while providing a safe and supportive environment. The AVID Excel elective has been very successful at Reyburn for several years and due to that success, Kastner, Alta Sierra, Clark and Sanchez began to offer the AVID Excel elective in the 2025-26 school year. ELL students are classified as LTEL after being designated as an ELL for over six years.

The course emphasizes writing, reading, inquiry, and collaboration to enhance overall academic performance and includes a pathway of courses with AVID-trained teachers. Through the AVID Excel elective program, students gain the confidence and skills necessary to succeed in high school and beyond. Various strategies, including Collaborative Scholar Groups, are employed with an intentional focus on language acquisition. This supports a bridge to closing the achievement gap, assists students in passing the ELPAC, provides academic strategies for all core classes, and fosters confidence in their college and career readiness.

AVID with English Language Learners



AVID Emerge Teacher Training

AVID Emerge is a professional learning program designed for educators to support multilingual learners in all grades by providing research-backed instructional strategies to accelerate language acquisition and engagement. It provides 12 hours of professional learning, actionable tools, and scaffolding techniques for teachers.

The Curriculum Instruction and Accountability (CI&A) department has offered these professional development opportunities multiple times over the last two school years. We have trained 60 elementary and 87 secondary teachers.

AVID Summer Programs

Summer School incorporated AVID by using the AVID STEM academy curriculum for our Elementary Summer School and with the use of AVID Summer Bridge curriculum at the middle school level.

DISCUSSION:

The AVID College and Career Readiness System is dedicated to closing the achievement gap for all students by preparing them for success in secondary school, college, and career. The focus is on meeting the needs of students who have traditionally been under-represented in higher education.

Contracts with AVID provide teachers with research-based strategies and curriculum as well as Academic Language and Literacy resources at all secondary sites for grades 7-12, as well as Boris, Century, Cole, Copper Hills, Dry Creek, Fancher Creek, Fort Washington, Freedom, Fugman, Hirayama, Jefferson, Miramonte, Mountain View, Orazo, Pinedale, Reagan, Riverview, Sierra Vista, Tarpey, Temperance-Kutner, Valley Oak, Weldon, Woods, and Young elementary schools.

Contracts provide annual membership, with the addition of the AVID Excel elective at Clark, Kastner, Alta Sierra, Reyburn, and Sanchez intermediate schools, including staff training, pathway training, and summer institute opportunities. AVID's impact goes beyond the AVID elective and uses academic strategies across curriculum, grade-levels, and schools. The Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading (WICOR) strategies support rigorous and equitable learning experiences for all students. AVID-trained teachers used AVID materials and methodology in their specialized content and grade-specific areas. AVID Excel staff development is an addition to support Long-Term English Language (LTEL) students.

Staff development funds and membership fees not to exceed: \$500,000. Funded through LCAP.

DISCUSSION:

DISCUSSION:

At the October 6, 2021, Clovis Unified School District Governing Board meeting, the Board approved Harris Construction to be the District's lease-leaseback contractor for the new 7-12 educational center and instructed the District to prepare the lease-leaseback agreement, site lease agreement, and sublease agreements. Harris was also authorized to begin performing designated pre-construction services for the new educational center.

Following the October 6, 2021, Board meeting, Harris worked with the District and the project architect to perform pre-construction services including site evaluation, constructability review, design meetings, scheduling, cost estimates, and construction planning.

On March 10, 2026, Harris received bids from subcontractors to construct increment seven of the Terry P. Bradley Educational Center. The District participated in the bid process and pre-qualification of all the subcontractors to ensure that the best value is received. Following the bid opening, a two-week review by Harris Construction was conducted to evaluate best value in accordance with Education Code section 17406. A final review by Harris Construction and CUSD was conducted on March 30, 2026. The sum of the subcontractors' bids is considered the "Total Sublease Amount" under the terms of the District lease-leaseback agreement with Harris Construction and will be set out in the schedule of sublease payments.

The project bid is \$22,442,043 under the estimated budget.

In the spring of each school year, the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing requires the Governing Board of every school district statewide to adopt a declaration specifying if there may be a need to hire individuals on an Emergency Permit basis due to a possible insufficient number of certificated candidates who meet the District's employment criteria. This Declaration of Need serves the purpose of providing additional time for current certificated employees, as well as newly hired certificated employees, to do the following: (1) await final credentialing documentation; (2) complete necessary coursework; and/or (3) complete service in other assignments. The number of employees indicated on the Declaration of Need is simply an estimate and does not reflect the District's intent to hire certificated teachers who are less than highly qualified.

Authorize the Superintendent or designee to approve the lease agreement between Clovis Unified School District and Cook Land Company for the property located at 1280 N. Walling, Fresno, California 93727.

DISCUSSION:

The District has identified a need for a temporary maintenance repair building to support transportation operations while the primary facility undergoes renovation. Following negotiations with Cook Land Company, a Letter of Intent (LOI) was signed on March 12, 2026, to lease approximately 15,000 square feet of space at 1280 N. Walling Avenue with an estimated move-in date of July 1, 2026.

The proposed lease features an initial term of two years, with a one-year extension option. The facility is currently in good condition. This lease ensures the Transportation Department has adequate facilities to maintain District fleet operations during the modernization of the current facility.

This lease is a triple-net lease at \$1.50 per square foot with a 4% annual increase on each anniversary date funded with Transportation AB 181 funds.
