The District continues to research the best available curriculum to meet the needs of its students. The Curriculum, Instruction, and Accountability division works with school site administrators and teachers to gather input to help provide the very best and user-friendly curriculum resources for teachers and students to use in the classroom. A needs assessment is given to help maintain an equitable refresh cycle of materials based on need, timeline of the release of new state frameworks, and available funding. Textbooks are periodically piloted in our schools and teacher committees are able to provide feedback during adoption cycles. Educational partners are also invited to review materials being considered for adoption as well as already adopted materials. The District also works closely with curriculum providers to make sure we are able to access the most up to date resources within our adopted textbook materials.

Parental Involvement and Family Engagement (LCFF Priority 3)

Introduction

Family engagement is an essential strategy for building pathways to college and career readiness for all students and is an essential component of a systems approach to improving outcomes for all students. CUSD is effective at building relationships between school staff and families as indicated by parents in the annual parent survey. This year 93% of parents indicated that there are adults on campus that care for their students. Furthermore, 82% of parents also responded that their school communicates the importance of respecting all cultural beliefs and practices.

While 83% of parents have indicated they know how to access additional help for their students, Clovis Unified will continue its outreach efforts so that all families are aware of the many intervention opportunities that exist at their child's school site as well as additional resources to all students outside of school hours. Clovis Unified has tutoring access available to all students at any time of the day through an online resource.

Clovis Unified will continue to provide services and supports through the feeder school IMPACT teams. These teams provide mentorship and academic support to students as well as many parent outreach events.

CUSD is effective at building partnerships for student outcomes as indicated by parents in the annual parent survey. This year, 95% of parents indicated that their school provides a quality education for their child. Also, 91% of parents indicated that their child's reading skills are improving while 90% indicated their child's math skills are improving. Furthermore, 83% of parents stated that they know how to get help for their child if they are struggling in school while 80% of students indicated they could get additional help from their teachers.

The District's parent survey indicates that many of our parent community have attended or been involved in some form of school or District community meeting; however, several parents at our Title 1 schools indicated they have not been as involved. CUSD will focus on further outreach to parents at our Title 1 schools by continuing monthly parent engagement nights at the District level to welcome families from all schools. These meetings will continue to be devoted to relevant topics affecting students, parents and our community and will also help provide tools and resources for our parents to help their students be the best they can be in mind, body and spirit. Meetings are provided at both the school and District level.

CUSD uses its Clovis Assessment System for Sustained Improvement (CLASSI) model to ensure there is diverse representation at various parent outreach meetings. Principals connect with key educational partners within their school communities to continue to build diverse representation at meetings such as School Assessment Review Team (SART) meetings and Intercultural Diversity Advisory Committee (IDAC) meetings. At the District level Parent Advisory Committee Meetings and District English Learner Advisory Committee meetings are held in partnership

with all schools within the District. CUSD will continue to expand its IDAC site visits each year, where each school will get to demonstrate how they are meeting the diverse needs of their student body.

CUSD is effective at seeking input from educational partners for decision making. All of CUSD's school sites conducted educational partner meetings for parents, guardians, teachers, classified personnel, and students. This year, 92% of parents indicated that they attended one or more meetings conducted by their child's school. At these meetings, plus two larger, District-wide LCAP parent meetings, feedback was collected and analyzed through the Thought Exchange tool. The feedback collected helps the District to understand what the community perceives as the needs of students. From this input, the District is able to modify, enhance, and add appropriate actions and services in the LCAP to meet the needs of students.

The District will continue to utilize its current parent meeting structure along with the Thought Exchange tool to gather feedback. The District implemented a new survey tool in Thought Exchange to gather additional parent feedback by upgrading and modifying its current parent and student surveys.

The District will be improving engagement of underrepresented families by increasing the access to translation tools to provide better communication opportunities with families in need of translation services. The District will continue to provide readily accessible communication to families through multiple modalities and languages. The District migrated communication to one universal online platform accessible to all parents this past year, through Parent Square.

School safety is an ongoing focus in CUSD. The District is part of a multi-agency coalition that works together to implement best practices for maintaining safe schools. Additional systems to support communication and classroom safety have been implemented. Safety and alert systems have been enhanced each year to keep staff, students, and families safe and informed.

Ongoing academic and social-emotional learning interventions continue to be at the forefront of providing students a myriad of opportunities to have increased help during and outside of school hours. The LCAP continues to address the academic and social-emotional learning intervention supports needed for our students.

Every year, CUSD reviews the California Dashboard. Clovis Online School continually researches and evaluates the most effective curriculum options to meet the diverse needs of its students. The Curriculum, Instruction, and Accountability division collaborates with site administrators and teachers to gather input and identify high-quality, user-friendly instructional resources for use in the classroom.

A formal needs assessment is conducted to support an equitable refresh cycle for instructional materials taking into account program needs, the release of updated state frameworks, and available funding. Textbooks and instructional resources are periodically piloted across school sites, with teacher committees providing valuable feedback during adoption cycles. Educational partners are also invited to review both potential new adoptions and currently used materials.

In addition, Clovis Online School works closely with curriculum providers to ensure ongoing access to the most current updates and resources within adopted instructional programs.

This year's results show full parent participation in school meetings and complete student engagement in school events. With enrollment increasing, the school is committed to expanding opportunities to meet the diverse needs of both students and families.

Additionally, survey data indicate that 95% of students feel Clovis Online Charter School is a safe learning environment. These findings are further supported by positive feedback, highlighting that teachers treat students with respect and value the diversity within the school community.

Students at Clovis Online Charter School report a strong sense of safety and belonging within the school community. They express feeling supported both academically and socially, noting that their teachers are attentive and responsive to their needs. While students value the support they receive, they have also identified an opportunity for growth in the area of cultural awareness. Enhancing educators' understanding in this area could further strengthen the school environment and ensure that all students feel respected, valued, and understood, regardless of their backgrounds.

Clovis Online Charter School utilizes multiple strategies to ensure that all students have equitable access to a wide range of courses aligned with their grade levels, individual needs, and student demographics, including those requiring additional support. Across all K–12 campuses, the Q Web system is used to develop student schedules and ensure access to a comprehensive course of study.

School counselors and IMPACT Team (formerly Transition Team) members work collaboratively with students to increase awareness of available courses and support the enrollment process. IMPACT Team members specifically provide targeted support for unduplicated student groups to help ensure equitable access to educational opportunities. In addition, master schedule reviews are conducted to verify that all student populations, including those with exceptional needs, are appropriately represented in a broad and balanced curriculum.

Annual master schedule audits and Board Policy No. 3403, Placement in Ninth Grade Mathematics Course, establish protocols and identify any differences across school sites and student groups with access to, and enrollment in, a broad course of study. Placement concerns are addressed and corrected annually. Clovis Online Charter School is committed to expanding equitable opportunities for all students to have access to Advanced Placement courses at the high school level.

Current barriers include minimal access to Career Technical Education and AP classes for students. Clovis Online Charter School is improving on its course offerings each year with AP classes and other specialty classes offered at comprehensive sites.

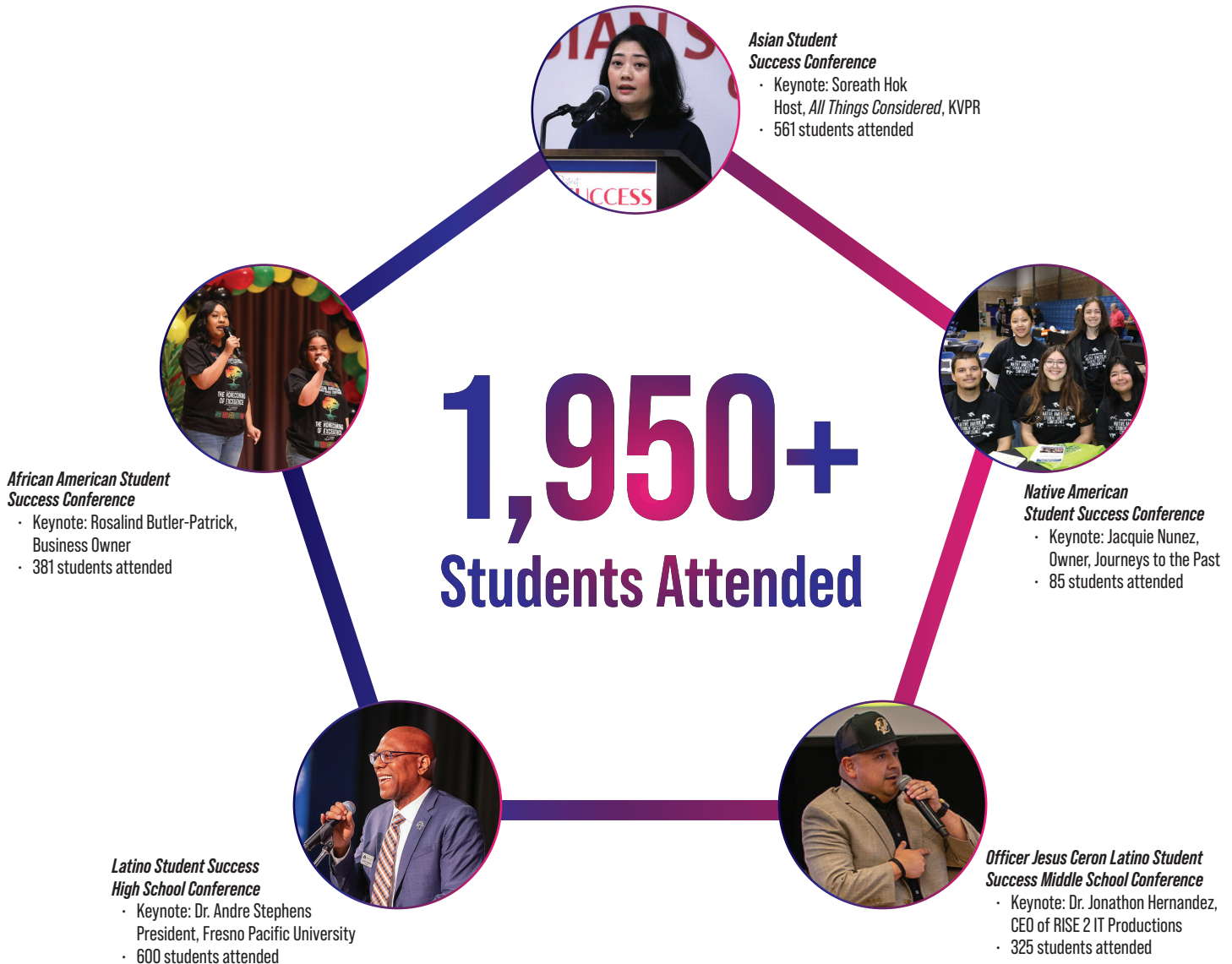

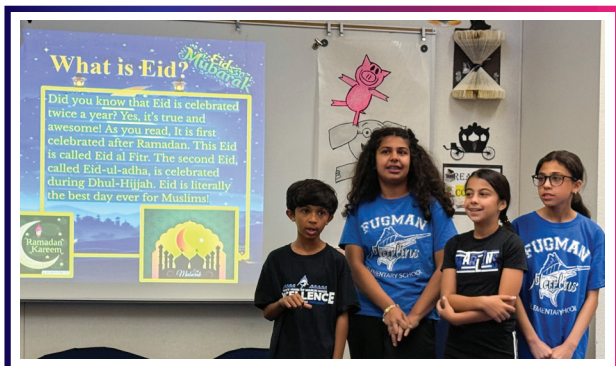

The IDAC internal accountability model enhances our students' Mind, Body, and Spirit promoting a more positive experience while increasing academic achievement and social-emotional wellness.

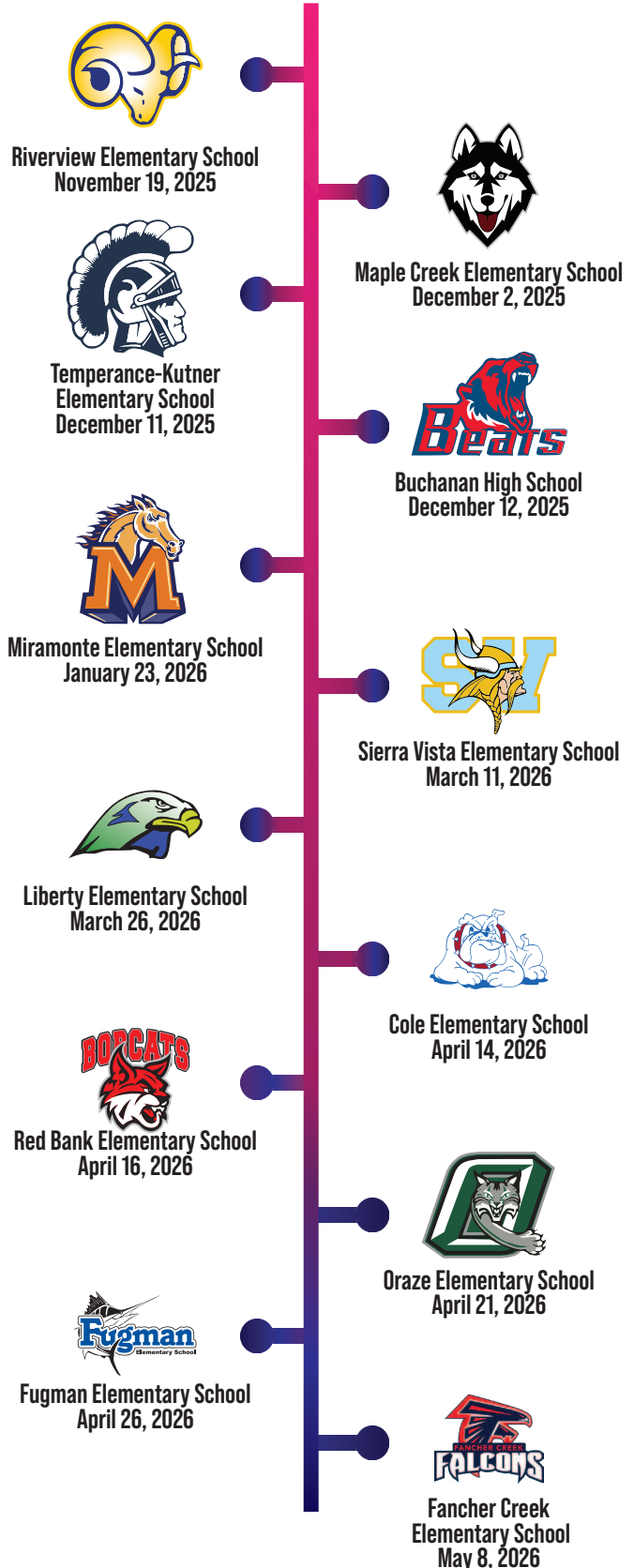
We take pride that each CUSD site held several IDAC site-level parent and student meetings in 2025-26. With the addition of the Clovis South area, two new IDAC visits were added to this year's schedule, for a total of 12 visits.

Members of our CUSD Governing Board, Executive Cabinet, the Curriculum, Instruction, and Accountability department, students, and parents from the Superintendent's Parent IDAC composed the visitation team. The goals of the IDAC site visits are to validate efforts to increase cultural awareness and share activities which have an impact on academic achievement, school culture, and school climate.

IDAC encompasses our internal growth model of simply striving to be better. Student input, parent partnerships, inclusive activities, and appropriate training are a few strategies that can positively influence student achievement outcomes.

Curriculum Update: Supplemental Literature and Ethnic Studies

Curriculum

Clovis Assessment System for Sustained Improvement (CLASSI) III states that the District-adopted curriculum reflecting the diversity of the District, State, and Nation will be used in all classrooms. A systematic approach to designing relevant lesson plans and professional learning opportunities supports this goal. Our Curriculum Design Teams ensure teachers have the necessary resources to support students. Professional learning opportunities are designed for administrators and teachers to foster equitable and engaging classrooms to maximize student achievement for ALL students.

The Curriculum, Instruction, and Accountability department created a systematic professional learning plan with a prioritized focus on positive school culture across campuses. School site leaders identified specific focus areas to maximize continuous growth and improvement in creating and maintaining a positive and safe learning environment for all students. In the domain of school culture, an emphasis on teaching and learning has been placed on equity awareness and cultural proficiency as well as positive social-emotional and behavioral supports.

Equitable and Engaging Classrooms

CIA supports the CLASSI goal of integrating multicultural education into curriculum and classroom instruction for all grades. Resources are available for teachers in grades TK-12 and are integrated into the core curriculum. All resources are evaluated for accuracy, quality, and age appropriateness.

Professional learning has been provided for administrators, teachers, and support staff systematically throughout the year. Over 200 administrators and employees attended 50-plus trainings. Tiered support and learning are available through a series of trainings that build competence with each session. Specific training and learning opportunities include leadership practices and planning for equitable and engaging classrooms and schools, Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) strategies, implicit bias, and many social-emotional/behavioral support frameworks and resources. The focus on professional learning will continue for the 2026-27 school year with equity awareness and cultural proficiency as a priority.

The Progress of Ethnic Studies

Ethnic and Cultural Studies has made a meaningful impact on both students and teachers in its first year of implementation. The course was designed to help students deepen their understanding of themselves and of the peers they learn alongside each day. Looking ahead, we will continue offering Ethnic and Cultural Studies across the District while supporting teachers through an ongoing Curriculum Design Team, where they will refine the curriculum, share best practices, and continue to develop meaningful community-based activities that promote student connection.



>>> AIM 2 – Operate with Increasing Efficiency and Effectiveness



School Site IDAC and Evaluation: Site and Area IDAC meetings were held regularly during the 2025-26 school year. Positive feedback was received through numerous platforms. Site leaders were able to display and explain the wonderful work occurring at their respective sites in an attempt to reach all students.



Superintendent’s Parent and Community IDAC: In 2017 these meetings were initiated through the Superintendent’s office to create connectivity at the highest level of the organization. During the 2025-26 school year, four District-wide parent IDAC meetings were held to share with all school site leaders and parents, the equity work that is occurring at the District level around our 13 cultural competencies (e.g. Human Resources, School Leadership, and Curriculum and Instruction). Dr. Folmer will continue to use her existing partnerships with the committee members to establish a District-wide parent IDAC meeting schedule for 2026-27. Members from this group will also continue to serve on the IDAC visitation teams.

Superintendent’s Student IDAC: Dr. Folmer held four meetings with this important student group. Twenty-three students from each District area came together with Dr. Folmer, Governing Board Member Dr. Fogg, Associate Superintendent Dr. Hammack, and Coordinator Dr. Salinas to share best practices, concerns, and to offer support. Students report on events and equity structures at their school. In addition, they take knowledge and insight back to their Human Relations Council and Principal Advisory for Student Affairs groups at their respective schools. The goal is to provide a space where students can share and learn from one another.



IDAC on Instagram: The CUSD IDAC Instagram account was established within the District’s official social media platform in response to student recommendations with the goal of promoting events and increasing engagement across Clovis Unified schools by students. In January 2026, Dr. Saul Salinas was added as a co-administrator to enhance the timeliness and responsiveness of content delivery. In addition to engaging with posts through likes, comments, and story sharing, Dr. Salinas introduced the creation of Instagram Reels, which quickly generated increased interest and enthusiasm among the student body. Since January, the account has gained 295 new followers and achieved over 191,000 views. This dynamic and revitalized platform has significantly strengthened the District’s ability to highlight IDAC initiatives, showcase school site efforts, and expand outreach to both the broader school community and the public. **Follow us @cUSD_idac**

>>> **AIM 3 – Hire, Develop, Sustain, and Value a High Quality Diverse Workforce**

Hiring

Hiring remains the **MOST important thing that we do** in Clovis Unified! We do not compromise the hiring process. We make every effort to recruit, attract, retain, and develop high-quality, diverse candidates for our certificated and classified open positions. The diversity of our student demographics is growing, and we will continue to pursue high-quality, diverse employees to fill our open positions. Our District diversity advisory boards and equity groups will play a crucial role in recruitment, job fair participation, leadership roles, and mentorship.

Continued work with our **Quality Improvement Teams (QIT)** process to reinforce and reflect on our hiring practices includes:



Interview Panel Process – reflects our District’s needs and desire to hire the most qualified candidates, maintains confidentiality, and integrity of the CUSD hiring process.



Marketing and Outreach – we continue to utilize a variety of strategies to reach the best candidates. These efforts include but are not limited to job fairs, recruitment, partnerships with local universities, social media presence, print media, and search engines (Indeed, LinkedIn, California Association of School Business Officials [CASBO], Association of School Business Officials International [ASBO], Better Team, Monster, Glassdoor, and Career Builder).



Internal Recruiting via Career Technical Education Programs and Teaching Cohorts – Careers in Education courses offered through Clovis Unified and partnerships with Human Resources to recruit, offer insight into the hiring process, provide mock interview panels, as well as review resumes, and share an Edjoin overview. Special Education teaching cohorts partnered with California State University, Fresno, and CUSD, and additional opportunities provided to our students include:

- Involvement in job fairs and breakout sessions for employment opportunities
- Classified career workshop and classified job fairs
- Certificated pathways offer potential opportunities for those students interested in employment in CUSD after finishing their high school journey and planning for career or college readiness. These opportunities include: Paraprofessionals, Student Relations Liaisons, positions in Child Development and Expanded Learning Club, and walk-on coaching positions

Equity Groups

The establishment of Clovis Unified’s Equity Groups has provided the District with tremendous insight as we partner with our employee groups to listen, learn, plan, and collaborate. This year, 2025-26, the District continues the work directed by the Employee Equity Leadership (EEL). The EEL consists of District leaders from advisory groups that have worked in collaboration to be outcome-oriented on areas related to hiring, recruitment, retention, professional development, and supporting our District’s core values. The equity-focused groups that continue to engage in targeted initiatives emphasizing recruitment and hiring are:

African American Advisory Board (AAAB)

Latino Advisory Board (LAB)

Asian American/Pacific Islander Advisory Board (AAPIAB)

Initially the mission, vision, and aim of our Equity Groups was to support AIM III of the District's Strategic Plan: to hire, develop, sustain, and value a high-quality diverse workforce.

As the work related to AIM III has continued, the Equity Groups have played an important role in:

- Hiring and job fairs
- CLASSI III
- Curriculum and supplemental reading lists
- Trainings, including: Cultural Equity in the Workplace, Safe Zone, and Individualized Education Program (IEP) enhancements for Spanish-speaking families
- Leadership training for both certificated and classified employees

The growth of our Equity Groups has afforded us a partnership to be proactive in our District's work with a lens that will:

- Develop an Employee Equity Leadership component
- Ensure every employee (classified and certificated) completes annual acknowledgment of expectations around cultural proficiency
- Review and refine Component III of the Clovis Assessment System for Sustained Improvement (CLASSI III)
- Refine and expand the existing Hiring Task Force focused on developing a workforce reflective of our student population
- Research, analyze, communicate, and evaluate effective marketing and outreach efforts that create an employee pool of high-quality candidates reflecting the diversity of our community for consideration for classified and certificated employment

Conclusion

We look forward to the 2026-27 school year, where we will continue to build cultural proficiency through meaningful and intentional District work. The ongoing engagement of our students, employees, and community members supports Clovis Unified's AIMS and focuses on providing a diverse, high-quality learning and working environment aligned with our District's vision and mission.

Proposition 30, the Schools and Local Public Safety Protection Act of 2012, approved by the voters on November 6, 2012, temporarily increased the State sales tax rate for all taxpayers and the personal income tax rates for upper-income taxpayers. The temporary sales tax expired at the end of the 2016 calendar year. The personal income tax rates for upper-income taxpayers was due to expire at the end of the 2018 calendar year. On the November 2016 ballot, California voters approved Proposition 55, extending the Proposition 30 income tax increase for upper-income taxpayers through 2030.

The District's Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) revenue is comprised of three funding sources: State aid, EPA and property taxes. The funding received as a result of Proposition 55 does not increase the District's LCFF revenue because the State aid revenue is decreased according to the amount of EPA funds received. At the beginning of each year, the Department of Finance estimates the amount to be transferred into the EPA for districts. EPA revenue funds for Clovis Unified will be deposited into restricted resource 1400. These funds must, therefore, be accounted for under the following reporting requirements:

1. Each year, the Governing Board must approve a spending plan for the EPA money.
2. The EPA funds cannot be used for the salaries or benefits of administrators or for administrative costs.
3. The District must publish on its website the amount of EPA money received and how it was spent.
4. An annual audit will be required to verify that EPA funds were spent in accordance with the requirements of Proposition 55.
5. The spending plan must be approved at the time the District's annual budget is adopted.

REGARDING THE EDUCATION PROTECTION ACCOUNT (EPA)

WHEREAS, the voters approved Proposition 55 on November 8, 2016; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 55 amended Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution effective November 8, 2016, and commencing on January 1, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of Article XIII, Section 36(e) create in the state General Fund an Education Protection Account (EPA) to receive and disburse the revenues derived from the incremental increases in taxes imposed by Article XIII, Section 36(f); and

WHEREAS, before June 30th of each year, the District shall estimate the total amount of additional revenues, less refunds that will be derived from the incremental increases in tax rates made pursuant to Article XIII, Section 36(f) that will be available for transfer into the EPA during the next fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, if the sum determined by the State Controller is positive, the State Controller shall transfer the amount calculated into the EPA within ten days preceding the end of the fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, all monies in the EPA are hereby continuously appropriated for the support of school districts, county offices of education, charter schools, and community college districts; and

WHEREAS, monies deposited in the EPA shall not be used to pay any costs incurred by the Legislature, the Governor, or any agency of state government; and

WHEREAS, a community college district, county office of education, school district, or charter school shall have the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the EPA are spent in the school, or schools, within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of the District shall make the spending determinations with respect to monies received from the EPA in open session of a public meeting of the Governing Board; and

WHEREAS, the monies received from the EPA shall not be used for salaries or benefits for administrators, or any other administrative cost; and

WHEREAS, each community college district, county office of education, school district, and charter school shall annually publish on its website an accounting of how much money was received from the EPA and how that money was spent; and

WHEREAS, the annual independent financial and compliance audit required of community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools shall ascertain and verify whether the funds provided from the EPA have been properly disbursed and expended as required by Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution; and

WHEREAS, expenses incurred by community college districts, county offices of education, school districts, and charter schools must comply with the additional audit requirements of Article XIII, Section 36, and may be paid with funding from the EPA, and shall not be considered administrative costs for purposes of Article XIII, Section 36.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the monies received from the EPA shall be spent as required by Article XIII, Section 36, and the determinations on how the money will be spent shall be made in open session of a public meeting of the Governing Board of Clovis Unified School District.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that to be in compliance with Article XIII, Section 36(e), with the California Constitution, the Governing Board of the Clovis Unified School District has determined to spend the monies received from the EPA as attached.

2025-26 Proposition 28 – Arts and Music in Schools Funding Annual Report

Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program(s) funded.

In the 2025–26 school year, Clovis Online Charter School fully expended its Prop 28 apportionment for fiscal years 2023–24, 2024–25, and 2025–26. Clovis Online strategically planned and implemented an Arts, Media, and Entertainment course available to all students. Prop 28 funds enabled the school to hire a certificated teacher to develop and teach an arts education program designed to provide a high-quality experience for its diverse student population. Previously, Clovis Online did not offer an arts program taught by a certificated art teacher that included instructional, hands-on, in-person, and virtual lab components to further engage students in the arts. This need prompted the development of a relevant program in the 2025–26 fiscal year, beginning with the hiring of a certificated art teacher.

To support visual arts instruction, Clovis Online equipped the Arts, Media, and Entertainment class with high-resolution cameras capable of both photography and video recording for filmmaking. Computers designed for digital editing and instruction were also purchased to provide a comprehensive, high-quality arts experience. These investments reflect Clovis Online’s deliberate and intentional use of Prop 28 funds to build a sustainable and inclusive arts program.

Clovis Online Charter’s dedication to fostering creativity, talent, and a passion for the arts is evident through its commitment to strengthening arts education with the support of Prop 28 funding.

2025-26 Proposition 28 – Arts and Music in Schools Funding Annual Report

Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program(s) funded.

In 2025-26, Clovis Unified continued building on Prop 28's foundation by expanding arts access and deepening program quality across all grade levels. Total staffing grew to 15.35 FTE, driven largely by a near-doubling of Instructional and VAPA Assistants from 4.23 to 8.12, reflecting a deliberate investment in removing barriers so more students can meaningfully participate in the arts.

Spending spanned every arts discipline. Music programs received new instruments, sheet music, and sound system upgrades at multiple campuses, while software investments supported composition and music theory instruction. Visual arts classrooms were equipped with ceramics supplies, photography equipment, digital editing computers, and professional-grade art materials. Drama and theater programs invested in costumes, choreographers, set designers, and theatrical licensing, bringing productions to life at both the elementary and secondary levels.

Cultural authenticity remained a cornerstone of the District's approach. Folklorico, Hmong, Bhangra, and African drum programs received dedicated funding for costumes, cultural artists, and community performances, honoring the diverse backgrounds of Clovis Unified students. Dance and movement programs expanded through new equipment, uniforms, and professional instruction.

Now in its third year, Prop 28 funding continues to strengthen a comprehensive, inclusive arts ecosystem — one that meets students where they are and prepares them to engage with the world creatively and confidently.

This includes alternative schools, charter schools, opportunity schools and classes, the community day school operated by the Fresno County Superintendent of Schools, the juvenile court school, and county jails.

The ASP demonstrates that all individuals with exceptional needs have access to services and instructions appropriate to meet their needs as specified in their Individualized Education Program (IEP). The 2026-27 Special Education ASP was derived from the October 1, 2025, pupil count which was extracted from the Special Education Information System (SEIS).

The ABP reflects allocations of funds that align with the services and instruction outlined in the ASP.

SUMMARY

Coordinates and audits District-wide attendance accounting processes to maximize State reimbursement and ensure compliance with California Education Code, California Department of Education (CDE), and related State attendance accounting requirements. Provides training, technical support, and guidance to school site personnel regarding District procedures involving attendance coding and attendance recovery efforts including site-based independent study, Saturday School, and Academic Intervention and Recovery (AIR) Time. Assists with the preparation, analysis, and auditing of District-wide Average Daily Attendance (ADA) reports and related statistical data to ensure accurate reporting, data integrity, and adherence to District and State attendance accounting guidelines and regulations.

DISTINGUISHING CAREER FEATURES

The District Attendance Coordinator serves as a technical resource for the coordination, auditing, consolidation, and reporting of student attendance data to ensure accuracy, compliance, and maximization of Average Daily Attendance (ADA) revenue and decreased chronic absenteeism as a key metric for measuring pupil engagement mandated by California's Local Control Funding Formula. This position works collaboratively with District departments, school administrators, and site staff to verify attendance accounting practices, resolve data discrepancies, and ensure compliance with California Education Code requirements. Distinguishing career features include the ability to integrate District-wide attendance data, optimize ADA reporting, troubleshoot student data systems, and provide training and technical support to school site personnel.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provides in-service training to site personnel on attendance recording and reporting.

SUMMARY

Under general supervision, the purpose of the job is to perform a variety of accounting, budgetary, and compliance support duties to assist in the financial operations of the Budget and Finance Department. Employees in this job classification function at a paraprofessional level, carrying out assigned tasks according to established procedures, calendars, and department workflows. Work includes supporting budget transfer processing, time and effort reporting, grant and program compliance, and coordination with State and federally funded program staff.

DISTINGUISHING CAREER FEATURES

The Financial Specialist is generally regarded as a support-level position within the Budget and Finance Department, working below the Financial Analyst classification. Positions in this classification apply working knowledge of governmental accounting principles, budget processes, and categorical program compliance. The Financial Specialist exercises sound judgment and attention to detail in processing financial transactions, maintaining documentation for audit readiness, and communicating with program staff. Problem challenges are procedural and transactional in nature; human relations challenges involve the routine exchange of information and coordination with site and program contacts.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Processes budget transfer requests and expense transfer journal entries for assigned District funds and programs. Verifies appropriate account coding, fund availability, and authorization in accordance with department procedures and District policies.
- Supports the time and effort reporting function for federally funded and restricted fund employees; and collects, reviews, and maintains semi-annual certifications and periodic activity records to ensure compliance with federal and State audit requirements.
- Assists with financial and administrative functions of the Medi-Cal LEA Billing Option Program, including maintaining documentation for audit compliance, tracking billing activity, and supporting communications with program staff and the Financial Analyst.
- Assists with financial and administrative functions of the Child Youth Behavioral Health Initiative (CYBHI) program; maintains supporting documentation; monitors expenditure activity, and coordinates compliance-related communications under the direction of the Financial Analyst and Assistant Director.

- Manages assigned fee-based and self-contained grants; monitors revenue and expenditure activity; maintains accurate records; prepares periodic budget status updates; and ensures compliance with applicable grant requirements and District policies.
- Prepares, audits, and maintains a variety of financial and administrative records, reports, and supporting documentation related to assigned programs and funds; and ensures files are organized and audit-ready at all times.
- Communicates with site administrators, program coordinators, and department staff regarding budget balances, transfer requests, reporting deadlines, and documentation requirements; provides clear and accurate information in response to inquiries.
- Assists in preparing instructional materials and reference documents for program staff regarding fiscal compliance, documentation requirements, and reporting timelines.
- Reviews and processes a variety of financial transactions in the District's financial system; and verifies coding accuracy and maintains supporting documentation consistent with internal controls.
- Performs other duties as required to accomplish the objectives of the position.

QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge and Skills:

- Working knowledge of governmental accounting principles and practices, including fund accounting and categorical program compliance.
- Working knowledge of budget transfer processes, journal entries, and expenditure tracking in an automated accounting/ERP system.
- Familiarity with federal and State grant compliance requirements, including time and effort reporting for federally funded positions.
- Working knowledge of records management practices and audit documentation requirements.
- Well-developed written and oral communication skills; and possesses the ability to prepare clear reports, correspondence, and procedural documentation.

Title: Biennial Review of the Conflict of Interest Code - Board Bylaws and Exhibits No. 9270

RECOMMENDATION:

Conduct a biennial review of the Conflict of Interest (COI) Code - Board Bylaws and Exhibits No. 9270, as submitted.

DISCUSSION:

The Political Reform Act requires that every local agency review its COI Code every even-numbered year and, if a change in its COI Code is necessitated, submit an amended COI Code to the local agency's code reviewing body (Government Code section 87306.5). The Fresno County Board of Supervisors is the reviewing body for the District's COI Code.

The District's COI Code consists of the following:

1. Board Bylaw No. 9270 - The Board approved amendments to Board Bylaw No. 9270 on July 17, 2024. Staff recommends changes to reflect new state laws (SB 1181, SB 1243 & AB 2158).
2. Exhibit No. 9270(1) - Exhibit No. 9270(1) was reviewed by the Board on July 17, 2024, with no changes being made. Staff is not recommending any modifications to Exhibit No. 9270(1).
3. Exhibit No. 9270(2) - Exhibit No. 9270(2) was reviewed by the Board on July 17, 2024, with no change being made. Staff is not recommending any modifications to Exhibit No. 9270(2).

Staff recommends that the Board conduct a review of the District's COI Code, adopt the attached amended Board Bylaw No. 9270, as submitted, and make a determination that no additional changes are necessary as to Exhibits No. 9270(1) and (2). The proposed revisions were reviewed with the Administrative Services/Human Resources Board Subcommittee.

Upon the Board's review, the COI Code will be submitted to the Fresno County Board of Supervisors as required in connection with the biennial review. Staff also recommends that the Board authorize the Superintendent or designee to make such changes to the COI Code as may be required by the Fresno County Board of Supervisors. Such additional changes, if made, would be effective June 10, 2026.

BOARD BYLAWS CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

PURPOSE: To adopt a Conflict of Interest Code for the District and set forth requirements for disclosure statements.

A. CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The District's Conflict of Interest Code shall be comprised of the terms of the California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18730, together with attachments specifying designated positions and the specific types of disclosure statements required for each position. (Government Code 87303)

1. Review. Pursuant to law, upon direction of the Fresno County Board of Supervisors, the code reviewing body, the Board shall review the Conflict of Interest Code in even-numbered years. If no change in the code is required, the District shall notify the code reviewing body by October 1 by submitting a written statement to that effect. (Government Code 87306.5)
2. Revisions. When a change in the District's Conflict of Interest Code is necessitated by changed circumstances, such as the creation of new Designated Positions, amendments or revisions, the changed code shall be submitted to the code reviewing body within 90 days of the changed circumstances necessitating the amendments have become apparent. (Government Code 87306)

When reviewing and preparing the District's Conflict of Interest Code, the Superintendent or designee shall provide officers, employees, consultants and members of the community adequate notice and a fair opportunity to present their views. (Government Code 87311)

B. DESIGNATED POSITIONS

Unless otherwise required by law, the positions listed in Exhibit No. 9270(1) shall be Designated Positions.

C. DISCLOSURE STATEMENT – FILING

1. Persons Required to File. Persons holding Designated Positions shall file the appropriate statement listed below disclosing investments, interests in real property, business positions, and income required to be reported under the category or categories assigned in Exhibit No. 9270(1). (2 CCR 18730) An investment, interest in real property, business position, or income shall be reportable if the business entity in which the investment or business position is held, the interest in real property, or the income or source of income may foreseeably be affected materially by any decision made or participated in by the person holding a Designated Position. (Government Code 87302) The specific disclosure responsibilities assigned to each Designated Position are set forth in Exhibit No. 9270(2).

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2. Place of Filing. The statements for Designated Positions, other than the members of the Board and the Superintendent of the District, shall be filed with the Superintendent or designee. The members of the Board and the Superintendent are to file their original statements directly with the Clerk of the Board for the Fresno County Board of Supervisors (Board of Supervisors) using the electronic filing system. (2 CCR 18730)

The Superintendent or designee shall retain a copy of all electronically filed statements and the original statements of Designated Positions and shall make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction. (Government Code 81008)

3. Time of Filing.
- a. Initial Statement. An initial statement shall be filed by each person holding a Designated Position within 30 days after the effective date of this Conflict of Interest Code, disclosing reportable investments, interests in real property, and business positions held on the effective date of this Conflict of Interest Code, and income received during the 12 months prior to the effective date of this Conflict of Interest Code. (Government Code 87302, 2 CCR 18730)
 - b. Annual Statement. An annual statement shall be filed by April 1 disclosing reportable investments, interests in real property, business positions, and income held or received at any time during the previous calendar year or since the date the person in the Designated Position took office if during the calendar year. (Government Code 87302, 2 CCR 18730)
 - c. Assuming Office Statement. An Assuming Office Statement shall be filed by persons elected, appointed, promoted, or transferred to Designated Positions within 30 days after assuming the position, disclosing reportable investments, business positions, and interests in real property held on, and income received during the 12 months before, the date of assuming office or the date of being appointed or nominated, respectively. (Government Code 87302, 2 CCR 18730)
 - d. Leaving Office Statement. A Leaving Office Statement shall be filed by any person holding a Designated Position whose position with the District is terminated, voluntarily or involuntarily, within 30 days after termination, disclosing reportable investments, business positions, interests in real property and income held or received at any time during the period between the closing date of the previous Statement of Economic Interests required to be filed and the termination date. (Government Code 87302, 2 CCR 18730)
 - e. Statements for Persons Who Resign Prior to Assuming Office. Any person who resigns from a Designated Position within 12 months of initial appointment, or within 30 days of the date of notice provided by the filing officer of the person's filing obligation, whichever is earlier, is not deemed to "assume or leave office," provided that during the period between appointment and resignation, the person does not make, participate in making, or

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use the position to influence any decision of the District or to receive or become entitled to receive any form of payment as a result of his or her appointment. (2 CCR 18730)

Within 30 days of the date of a notice from the filing officer, the person shall do both of the following: (2 CCR 18730)

- (1) File a written resignation with the appointing power; and
- (2) File a written statement with the filing officer signed under penalty of perjury stating that during the period between appointment and resignation he or she did not make, participate in the making, or use the position to influence any decision of the District or receive, or become entitled to receive, any form of payment by virtue of being appointed to the position.

D. DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS – CONTENTS

Disclosure statements shall be made on forms (Form 700) prescribed by the California Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) and supplied by the FPPC. (2 CCR 18730)

1. Contents of Investment and Interest in Real Property Reports

When an investment or interest in real property is required to be disclosed, the statement shall contain the following: (2 CCR 18730)

- a. A statement of the nature of the investment or interest.
- b. The name of the business entity in which each investment is held and a general description of the business activity in which the business entity is engaged.
- c. The address or other precise location of the real property.
- d. A statement whether the fair market value of the real property or investment equals or exceeds two thousand dollars (\$2,000), but does not exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), exceeds ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), but does not exceed one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), exceeds one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) but does not exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000), or exceeds one million dollars (\$1,000,000). This information need not be provided with respect to an interest in real property that is the filer's principal residence.
- e. If the property or investment was partially or wholly acquired or disposed of during the period covered by the statement, the date of acquisition or disposal.
- f. Other information required by the FPPC (Fair Political Practices Commission) forms.

**CLOVIS UNIFIED
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- a. Personal Income. When personal income is required to be reported under this Conflict of Interest Code, the statement shall contain the following: (2 CCR 18730)

- (1) The name and address of each source of income aggregating five hundred dollars (\$500) or more in value and a general description of the business activity, if any, of each source. (Persons holding Designated Positions are not required to report salary, reimbursement for expenses or per diem, social security, disability, or other similar benefit payments received from a federal, state, or local government agency, including sums received as compensation for serving as Board Members as provided in the Education Code.)
- (2) A statement whether the aggregate value of income from each source or in the case of a loan reportable as income, the highest amount owed to each source, was one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or less, was greater than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), was greater than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), or was greater than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).
- (3) A description of the consideration, if any, for which the income was received.
- (4) In the case of a gift valued at fifty dollars (\$50) or more, the name, address, and business activity of the donor and any intermediary through which the gift was made; a description of the gift; the amount or value of the gift; and the date on which the gift was received.
- (5) In the case of a loan reportable as income, the annual interest rate and the security, if any, given for the loan, and the term of the loan.
- (6) Other information required by the FPPC forms.

- b. Business Entity Income. When income of a business entity, including income of a sole proprietorship, is required to be reported, the statement shall contain: (2 CCR 18730)

- (1) The name, address, and a general description of the business activity of the business entity.
- (2) The name of every person from whom the business entity received payments if the filer's pro rata share of gross receipts from such person was equal or greater than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) during a calendar year.
- (3) Other information required by the FPPC forms.

3. Contents of Business Position Reports

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When business positions are required to be reported, a person holding a Designated Position shall list the name and address of each business entity in which he/she is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or in which he/she holds any position of management, a description of the business activity in which the business entity is engaged, the designated employee's position with the business entity, and any other information required by the FPPC forms. (2 CCR 18730) A person holding a Designated Position shall not be required to list uncompensated positions held as part of his/her role as a representative of the District.

E. PROHIBITION ON RECEIPT OF HONORARIA

1. No person holding a Designated Position shall accept any honorarium from any source, if the person would be required to report the receipt of income or gifts from that source on his or her statement of economic interests. (2 CCR 18730)
2. Subdivisions (a), (b), and (c) of Government Code section 89501 shall apply to the prohibitions in this section. (2 CCR 18730)
3. This section shall not limit or prohibit payments, advances, or reimbursements for travel and related lodging and subsistence authorized by Government Code section 89506. (2 CCR 18730)

F. PROHIBITION ON RECEIPT OF GIFTS IN EXCESS OF GIFT LIMIT

1. Board members and persons holding Designated Positions may accept gifts only under the conditions and limitations specified in Government Code section 89503 and California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18730. (2 CCR 18730)
2. Subdivisions (e), (f), and (g) of Government Code section 8950-3 shall apply to the prohibitions in this section. (2 CCR 18730)
3. The limitations on gifts do not apply to wedding gifts and gifts exchanged between individuals on birthdays, holidays, and other similar occasions, provided that the gifts exchanged are not substantially disproportionate in value as described in Government Code section 89503. (Government Code 89503)
4. Gifts of travel and related lodging and subsistence shall be subject to the prevailing gift limitation except as described in Government Code section 89506. (Government Code 89506)
5. A gift of travel does not include travel provided by the District for Board members and persons holding Designated Positions. (Government Code 89506)

G. LOANS TO PUBLIC OFFICIALS

1. No member of the Board of the District shall, from the date of his or her election to office

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through the date that he or she vacates office, receive a personal loan from any officer, employee, member, or consultant of the District (including those of any public agency over which the District has direction and control). (2 CCR 18730)

2. No member of the Board of the District shall, from the date of his or her election to office through the date that he or she vacates office, receive a personal loan from any person who has a contract with the District (including those of any public agency over which the District has direction and control). This subdivision shall not apply to loans made by banks or other financial institutions or to any indebtedness created as part of a retail installment or credit card transaction, if the loan is made or the indebtedness created in the lender's regular course of business on terms available to members of the public without regard to the elected officer's official status. (2 CCR 18730)
3. Paragraphs G.1 and G.2 above shall not apply to the following: (2 CCR 18730)
 - a. Loans made to the campaign committee of an elected officer or candidate for elective office.
 - b. Loans made by a Board Member's spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, parent-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, nephew, niece, aunt, uncle, or first cousin, or the spouse of any such persons, provided that the person making the loan is not acting as an agent or intermediary for any person not otherwise exempted under this section.
 - c. Loans from a person who is an officer, employee, member, or consultant of the District (including those of any public agency over which the District has direction and control), or who has a contract with the District (including those of any public agency over which the District has direction and control) that, in the aggregate, do not exceed five hundred dollars (\$500) at any given time.
 - d. Loans made, or offered in writing, before January 1, 1998.
4. Loan Terms
 - a. Except as set forth in G.4.b. below, no Member of the Board of the District shall, from the date of his or her election to office through the date he or she vacates office, receive a personal loan of five hundred dollars (\$500) or more from a single lender, except when the loan is in writing and clearly states the terms of the loan, including the parties to the loan agreement, date of the loan, amount of the loan, term of the loan, date or dates when payments shall be due on the loan and the amount of the payments, and the rate of interest paid on the loan. (2 CCR 18730)
 - b. This section shall not apply to the following types of loans: (2 CCR 18730)

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- 1) Loans made to the campaign committee of the elected officer.
 - 2) Loans made by a Board member's spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, brother, sister, parent-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, nephew, niece, aunt, uncle, or first cousin, or the spouse of any such persons, provided that the person making the loan is not acting as an agent or intermediary for any person not otherwise exempted under Government Code section 87460.
 - 3) Loans made, or offered in writing, before January 1, 1998.
- c. Nothing in this section shall exempt any person from any other provision of Title 9 of the Government Code (the Political Reform Act of 1974). (2 CCR 18730)
5. Personal Loans
- a. Except as set forth in subdivision G.5.b. below, a personal loan received by any person holding a Designated Position shall become a gift to the designated employee for the purposes of this section in the following circumstances: (2 CCR 18730)
 - 1) If the loan has a defined date or dates for repayment, when the statute of limitations for filing an action for default has expired.
 - 2) If the loan has no defined date or dates for repayment, when one year has elapsed from the later of the following:
 - a) The date the loan was made.
 - b) The date the last payment of one hundred dollars (\$100) or more was made on the loan.
 - c) The date upon which the debtor has made payments on the loan aggregating to less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) during the previous 12 months.
 - b. This section shall not apply to the following types of loans: (2 CCR 18730)
 - 1) A loan made to the campaign committee of an elected officer or a candidate for elective office.
 - 2) A loan that would otherwise not be a gift as defined in Title 9 of the Government Code (the Political Reform Act of 1974).
 - 3) A loan that would otherwise be a gift as set forth under G.5.a. above, but on which the creditor has taken reasonable action to collect the balance due.

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- 4) A loan that would otherwise be a gift as set forth under G.5.a. above, but on which the creditor, based on reasonable business considerations, has not undertaken collection action. Except in a criminal action, a creditor who claims that a loan is not a gift on the basis of this paragraph has the burden of proving that the decision for not taking collection action was based on reasonable business considerations.
 - 5) A loan made to a debtor who has filed for bankruptcy and the loan is ultimately discharged in bankruptcy.
- c. Nothing in this section shall exempt any person from any other provisions of Title 9 of the Government Code (the Political Reform Act of 1974). (2 CCR 18730)

H. CONFLICT OF INTEREST FROM CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS

Prior to the District rendering a decision in a proceeding before the District involving a contract, license, permit, or other entitlement for use, as defined by Government Code section 84308, a Board member who received a contribution of more than five hundred dollars (\$500) from any party or participant to the proceeding, or from an agent of such a party or participant, in the prior 12 months, and the party who made such a contribution, shall both publicly disclose that fact on the record of the proceeding. Additionally, if a Board member willfully or knowingly received a contribution to the Board member's campaign committee of more than five hundred dollars (\$500) from any party or participant to such a proceeding, or from an agent of a party or participant, in the prior 12 months, and knows or has reason to know that the participant has a financial interest in the District's decision, the Board member shall not make, participate in making, or in any way attempt to use the Board member's official position to influence the District's decision in the proceeding. However, a Board member may make, participate in making, or attempt to use the Board member's official position to influence the decision if the contribution is returned within 30 days after the decision was made or after the Board member knows or should have known about the contribution and the proceeding, whichever is later.

All Board members and the Superintendent are prohibited from accepting, soliciting, or directing a contribution of more than five hundred dollars (\$500) from any party or participant to a proceeding before the District involving a contract, license, permit, or other entitlement for use, as defined by Government Code section 84308, or from an agent of a party or participant, while the proceeding is pending before the District and for 12 months following the date the District renders a final decision in the proceeding, if the Board member or Superintendent knows or has reason to know that the participant has a financial interest in the District's decision. However, if a Board member or the Superintendent does accept, solicit, or direct such a contribution during those 12 months but did not do so knowingly or willingly, the Board member or the Superintendent may cure the violation by ensuring that the contribution, or the portion exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500), is returned within 30 days of accepting, soliciting, or directing the contribution. The Board member or Superintendent shall maintain records of curing the violation. (Government Code 84308) ~~To avoid improper influence over the Board's decision-making involving the issuance of a~~

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~~license, permit, or other entitlements for use, including a contract, any District officer shall comply with Government Code section 84308, including the following: (Government Code 84308)~~

~~A District officer is prohibited from accepting, soliciting, or directing a contribution of more than \$250 from any party or participant to a proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use, including a contract, or from that person's agent, while the proceeding is pending before the Board and for 12 months following the date a final decision is rendered in the proceeding, if the District officer knows or has reason to know that the party or participant has a financial interest in the Board's decision.~~

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~~A District officer who received a contribution of more than \$250 from a party or participant in the proceeding 12 months shall disclose that fact on the record of the proceeding prior to the Board rendering a decision in the proceeding. If the District officer willfully or knowingly received the contribution and knows or has reason to know that the participant has a financial interest in the Board's decision, he/she shall not make, not participate in making, or in any way attempt to use the official position to influence the Board's decision.~~

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~~A District officer who receives a contribution that would otherwise require disqualification as described in H.2. above may participate in the proceeding if the contribution is returned within 30 days from the time he/she knows or should have known about the contribution and the proceeding.~~

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~~A District officer who unknowingly accepts, solicits, or directs a contribution of more than \$250 during the 12 months after the date of the Board's final decision on the proceeding may cure the violation by returning the contribution, or the portion exceeding \$250, within 14 days of accepting, soliciting, or directing the contribution, provided the District officer did not knowingly or willfully accept, solicit, or direct the prohibited contribution. The District officer shall maintain records of curing the violation.~~

The provisions in Government Code section 84308 as specified above do not apply to labor contracts, competitively bid contracts, ~~and~~ personal employment contracts, contracts valued under \$50,000, contracts where no party receives financial compensation, or contracts with another governmental agency. (Government Code 84308)

I. DISQUALIFICATION

1. Disqualifying Financial Interests. Persons holding Designated Positions must disqualify themselves from making or participating in the making of any decisions or using their official positions to influence the making of any decision which will have a reasonably foreseeable material financial effect, distinguishable from its effect on the public generally on the official or a member of his or her immediate family or on: (2 CCR 18730)
 - a. Any business entity in which the designated person has a direct or indirect investment worth two thousand dollars (\$2,000) or more;

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- b. Any real property in which the designated person has a direct or indirect interest worth two thousand dollars (\$2,000) or more;
 - c. Any source of income, other than gifts and other than loans by a commercial lending institution in the regular course of business on terms available to the public without regard to official status, aggregating five hundred dollars (\$500) or more in value provided to, received by or promised to the designated person within 12 months prior to the time when the decision is made;
 - d. Any business entity in which the designated person is a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or holds any position of management; or
 - e. Any donor of, or any intermediary or agent for a donor of, a gift or gifts aggregating exceeding the limitation specified in Government Code section 89503 and California Code of Regulations, Title 2, section 18730, provided to, received by, or promised to the designated person within 12 months prior to the time when the decision is made.
2. Legally Required Participation. No person holding a Designated Position shall be prevented from making or participating in the making of any decision to the extent his or her participation is legally required for the decision to be made. (2 CCR 18730) The fact that the vote of a designated person who is on a voting body is needed to break a tie does not make his or her participation legally required for purposes of this section. (2 CCR 18730)
3. Disclosure of Disqualifying Financial Interest. When a person in a Designated Position determines that he/she should not make a governmental decision because the employee has a disqualifying interest in it, the determination not to act may be accompanied by disclosure of the disqualifying interest. (2 CCR 18730)

J. DEFINITION OF TERMS

Except as otherwise provided in this board bylaw, the definitions contained in the Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code section 81000, et seq., and any regulations adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission (2 CCR 18110, et seq.) pursuant to the Act, are incorporated herein and this Conflict of Interest Code shall be interpreted in a manner consistent therewith. (2 CCR 18730)

K. ASSISTANCE OF THE COMMISSION AND COUNSEL

Any person in a Designated Position who is unsure of the duties under this Conflict of Interest Code may request assistance from the FPPC pursuant to Government Code section 83114 and Sections 18329 and 18329.5, Title 2, California Code of Regulations or the District's legal counsel, provided that nothing in this section requires the District's legal counsel to issue any formal or informal opinion. (2 CCR 18730)

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L. VIOLATIONS

This Conflict of Interest Code has the force and effect of law. Persons in Designated Positions who violate any provision of this Conflict of Interest Code are subject to the administrative, criminal, and civil sanctions provided in the Political Reform Act, Sections 81000-91014. In addition, a decision in relation to which a violation of the disqualification provisions of this Conflict of Interest Code or of Government Code section 87100 has occurred may be set aside as void pursuant to Government Code section 91003. (2 CCR 18730)

M. TRAINING

Unless a Board member's term expires prior to January 1, 2026, each Board member shall complete ethics training in accordance with Government Code 53234-53235.2 by January 1, 2026, and at least once every two years thereafter.

3. The Governing Board hereof hereby orders and consents to a consolidated election pursuant to and in accordance with Elections Code section 10400, et seq., and Education Code sections 5323, 5340, and 5342.
4. The election shall be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2026. The electorate in the District votes by trustee area. The purpose of the election is to choose members of the Governing Board for the following seats:

DISCUSSION:

Government Code Section 3547.5 requires a public disclosure of any Collective Bargaining Agreement to ensure that members of the public are informed of the major provisions of the agreement before it becomes binding upon the District.

Before a public school employer enters into a written agreement with an exclusive representative covering matters within the scope of representation, the major provisions of the agreement including, but not limited to, the costs that would be incurred by the public school employer under the agreement for the current and subsequent fiscal years, shall be discussed at a public meeting of the public school employer in a format established for this purpose by the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

The Superintendent, Associate Superintendent of Administrative Services, and the Assistant Superintendent of Business Services shall certify in writing that the costs incurred by the school district under the agreement can be met by the District during the term of the agreement.

For 2026-27 the projected operating deficit after the agreement would be \$27,149,683 with a reserve of 14.21%, in 2027-28 \$20,861,273 with a reserve of 12.99%, in 2028-29 \$11,278,737 with a reserve of 11.35%, in 2029-30 \$478,400 with a reserve of 11.11%, and finally in 2030-31 a surplus of \$10,610,747 with a reserve of 12.26%.

WHEREAS, the District desires to provide workers' compensation coverage for individuals in their capacity as volunteers to the District while they are performing services for the District in accordance with District regulations and policy.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Board has reviewed and approved that Clovis Unified School District adopt the policy for purposes of workers' compensation benefits that an unsalaried person(s) authorized by the Superintendent/Governing Board to perform volunteer services for the District shall be deemed to be an employee of the School District should he/she sustain an injury while engaged in the services of the District under the direction and control of the District Superintendent or Governing Board.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that for the purposes of extending this coverage to official volunteers of the District, all individuals who directly volunteer to provide services in the District, and whose volunteer services are accepted in accordance with District regulations and policy shall be covered. The type of approved volunteer service shall be on file in the appropriate District or local school site office prior to commencing volunteer services.
