RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt Resolution No. 4112 to recalculate the 2025-26 Gann Limit Appropriation and estimate the 2026-27 Gann Limit Appropriation.

DISCUSSION:

The Gann Limit, named for Paul Gann, the author of Proposition 4 which amended the State Constitution to establish this limit, is intended to constrain the growth in State and local government spending by linking year-to-year changes in expenditures to changes in inflation (represented by per capita personal income) and population (represented by average daily attendance (ADA) for schools). Established in 1979 following the enactment of Proposition 13 and subsequently amended by Proposition 111, the Gann Limit has become a largely pro forma calculation that no longer constrains governmental expenditures. This is because the limit has grown significantly faster than appropriations subject to the limit.

Education Code section 42132 requires that on or before September 15 of each year, governing boards adopt a resolution to identify the recalculated appropriations limit for the previous fiscal year and the estimated appropriations limit for the current fiscal year.

Clovis Unified is required to perform Gann Limit calculations by the State Constitution, but it is also important for the District to complete these calculations to identify how much state aid counts toward its Gann Limit and, ultimately, the State's own Gann Limit.

The attached worksheet reflects the recalculated 2025-26 Gann Limit Appropriation for the District which is \$430,021,988.72 and the estimated Gann Limit Appropriation for 2026-27 which is \$450,450,591.82.

Approve the Provisional Internship Permits (PIP) for the recommended teaching candidates, as submitted.

DISCUSSION:

The PIP is available when the employing agency knows that there will be a teacher vacancy yet is unable to recruit a suitable candidate. The expectations of the employer and the employee are higher since this individual will be the teacher of record and should be on a credential track. The focus of the document is meeting subject matter competency. Once a candidate completes subject matter competency, the candidate can be employed on a document such as a District Internship Credential. Candidate requirements include the following: (1) Bachelor's degree or higher; (2) passage of the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST); and (3) specific course work or experience, explained in detail on the PIP information leaflet.

As required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC), employing agencies offering employment to a candidate on a PIP are required to: (1) conduct a diligent search for a suitable credentialed teacher or qualified internship teacher; (2) provide the PIP holder with orientation, guidance, and assistance as specified in Title 5 Section 80026.5 of the California Code of Regulations; (3) assist the PIP holder in developing a personalized plan (kept on file at the local level) through an agency-defined assessment leading to completion of subject matter competence; and (4) counsel the PIP holder to enroll in subject matter training. Clovis Unified School District administration hereby declares that a diligent search was conducted for suitable credentialed teachers or qualified internship teachers. Upon Board approval, District administration asserts that steps 2-4, as outlined above, will be completed.

School districts submitting PIP requests must include verification that a notice of intent to employ the applicant(s) in the identified positions was made public. The public notice must include the following information: (1) the name of the applicant(s); (2) the assignment in which the applicant(s) will be employed including subject(s), grade level(s), and school site; and (3) a statement that the applicant(s) will be employed on the basis of a PIP. Clovis Unified intends to submit a PIP request for the following teacher candidates, contingent upon administration and Board approval:

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the updated School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA) and the categorical budget for new Title I schools for the 2026-27 school year and authorize each school to implement its categorical programs.

DISCUSSION:

Due to changing demographics and an increase in Title I funds, five new schools qualify for Title I funding and services. This includes Orazo, Freedom, Liberty, Maple Creek, and Young elementary sites.

The purpose of the SPSA is to create a cycle of continuous improvement of student academic performance, as measured by State and District assessments. The goal is for all students to illustrate growth and achieve at rigorous levels.

Annually, Clovis Unified schools work in collaboration with their School Site Councils and English Language Advisory Committees to develop their school site SPSA. These groups of parents and school staff collect and analyze students' performance data, set priorities for program improvement, use rigorous research-based strategies, conduct ongoing monitoring of results, and review budgets. SPSAs are approved annually by the site's School Site Council in the spring and are then reviewed and approved by the CUSD Governing Board in May/June of each school year. SPSAs for these newly identified Title I schools were reviewed at special meetings of School Site Councils and English Language Advisory Committees held between the start of the 2026-27 school year and this September 9, 2026, Governing Board meeting.

The 2026-27 SPSA is based on the State's funding allocations. A copy of each school's SPSA is currently available to interested parties for review at the school site, and upon approval, will be posted to the CUSD website.

The term of this agreement expires on June 30, 2027.

WHEREAS, the Education Code established multiple programs to be administered by the Department of General Services (DGS) as staff to the State Allocation Board (SAB); and

WHEREAS, the Clovis Unified School District intends to file applications for eligibility determination, file applications for funding, and/or certify information under one or more SAB-administered program(s); and

WHEREAS, a condition of processing the various applications under the SAB- and DGS-administered programs is a resolution in support of those applications from a school district's governing board; and

WHEREAS, the District is aware that all application submittals on or after October 31, 2024, are subject to section 17070.54 of the Education Code and School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation section 1859.18; and

WHEREAS, the District is aware of the minimum requirements for the five-year school facilities master plan as outlined in section 17070.54 of the Education Code and SFP Regulation section 1859.18; and

WHEREAS, on March 5, 2025, the Governing Board adopted Resolution No. 4035 acknowledging the five-year school facilities master plan requirement for the SFP funding applications, and the Governing Board now desires to adopt this Resolution to acknowledge the master plan submittal time frame specified in SFP Regulation section 1859.18.1(c) as it applies to the District's Career Technical Education Facilities Program (CTEFP) funding applications; and

WHEREAS, nothing in this Resolution is intended to rescind, limit, or otherwise modify Resolution No. 4035 with respect to any funding application other than the District's CTEFP funding applications;

WHEREAS, as a condition of participating in the CTEFP, as administered by the SAB, the Clovis Unified School District shall submit to the DGS a five-year school facilities master plan,

an updated five-year school facilities master plan, or a governing board resolution updating the required components of the master plan that were materially affected, and a description of what changed approved by the governing board of the Clovis Unified School District for all applications for Career Technical Education Facilities Funding (Form SAB 50-10) submittals on or after October 31, 2024, pursuant to SFP Regulation section 1859.18; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to SFP Regulation section 1859.18.1(c)(1), the Clovis Unified School District, as a condition of SFP funding, must submit a five-year school facilities master plan within 18 months of fund release, or concurrently with submittal of the 100 percent complete Expenditure Report (Form SAB 50-06) if submitted less than 18 months following fund release; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to SFP Regulation section 1859.18.1(c)(2), the Clovis Unified School District acknowledges that the Apportionment may be rescinded for failure to submit a complete and valid master plan within the timeline specified in section (c)(1).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the foregoing acknowledgements apply to the District's CTEFP funding applications and to any additional CTEFP funding applications submitted by the District on or after October 31, 2024.

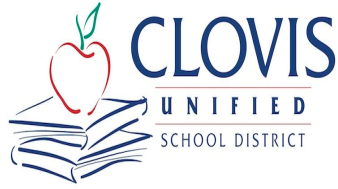

RECOMMENDATION:

Receive bond cost information as required by State law. This item is for information only. No action is required.

DISCUSSION:

Pursuant to Resolution No. 4089 adopted on May 6, 2026, the District has sold its Series B bonds for \$100 million from Measure A of 2024. The sale was conducted with the assistance of the District's financial advisor, Keygent LLC, and underwritten by the investment banking firm of Stifel Nicolaus.

The bonds were successfully sold on August 18, 2026. The sale resulted in \$194 million in orders from 39 unique investor accounts, with some orders overlapping. Although there were some unsold balances at the end of the order period, Stifel Nicolaus stepped in to purchase the remaining balances on the District's behalf. The final costs came in lower than the estimates shared with the Governing Board in May. The estimated cost for the \$100 million Series B bonds was \$199 million (4.8% interest rate); the final outcome was \$173 million (4.5% interest rate). The financing closed on September 2, 2026.

The Governing Board also approved Resolution No. 4090 on May 6, 2026, to refinance outstanding Election of 2012 bonds for taxpayer savings. However, due to rising interest rates, the refinancing was not completed. District administration and the District's finance team will continue to monitor for future bond refinancing opportunities.

Pursuant to Education Code section 15146(d), the District is required to present the actual cost information for the sale of the Bonds to the Board of Education as an informational item at its next scheduled meeting following the sale of the Bonds. A summary of the financing costs is attached.

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt Resolution No. 4118 authorizing the Superintendent or designee to submit an application to the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District (SJVAPCD) to participate in the New Alternative-Fuel Vehicle Grant Program.

DISCUSSION:

Clovis Unified has the opportunity to participate in the SJVAPCD New Alternative-Fuel Grant Program to purchase alternative-fuel vehicles. The grant will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. If awarded, the grant will provide funding up to \$100,000 per agency, per calendar year.

The District is requesting approval to submit an application to replace seven (7) electric utility carts. The utility carts will be purchased for the Custodial and Grounds departments at a cost of \$15,550.09 each, for a total of \$108,850.63.

FISCAL IMPACT:

If awarded, the grant will fund \$100,000 of the purchase. The remaining \$8,850.63 will be funded with the General Fund budget allocated to equipment replacement.

Applicants must obtain approval and have a signed, executed contract from the SJVAPCD prior to the purchase of a vehicle. Any vehicle purchased prior to contract execution is ineligible; and

WHEREAS, the District is applying for seven (7) electric utility carts under this grant.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Clovis Unified School District's Governing Board authorizes said District to participate in the Public Benefit Grants Program – New Alternative-Fuel Vehicle Purchase and enter into a contract with SJVAPCD.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that Susan Rutledge, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services for Clovis Unified School District, is hereby authorized and empowered to execute in the name of Clovis Unified School District all necessary documents to implement and carry out the purpose of this resolution.
