2026 Summer School



Multilingual Learner Supports

Elementary English Learner (EL) students attended summer school at the designated site for their area. Each elementary location was supported by three EL Teachers on Special Assignment (TOSAs), who provided targeted language acquisition instruction in leveled small groups to complement students' participation in their grade-level Language Acquisition Block (LAB). In addition to working directly with students, EL TOSAs collaborated with summer school teachers by extending their understanding of LAB and sharing effective instructional strategies to support EL students.

EL students in grades 6-8 participated in the Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) Summer Bridge Academy at Sierra Vista.

At the high school-level, each summer school site had a teacher dedicated to supporting newcomer and EL students. These teachers provided targeted language assistance while also helping students meet the academic demands of their credit recovery coursework.

Extended School Year

This year's Extended School Year (ESY) program for Special Education students was a great success, serving 1,012 students. Dry Creek and Century hosted the elementary students, Woods offered all Special Education pre-school programs, Alta Sierra held all secondary programs, Adult Transition Program and Therapeutic Intervention Program were held at the Adult School and the Enterprise School campuses, and the medically fragile students were served at the Garfield Center.

The Special Education students were supported by 100 teachers and 396 paraeducators.

Clovis Community Day School Intermediate Program

The Clovis Community Day School intermediate summer program combined academic support with opportunities to build practical life skills. Students received targeted, standards-aligned intervention in math and English Language Arts (ELA) while participating in lessons focused on budgeting, resume writing, and the development of essential workplace soft skills. Throughout the program, guest speakers shared their experiences, offering students encouragement and perspectives on career pathways, personal decision-making, and future opportunities. Students also completed more than 120 hours of community service through a partnership with the Boys and Girls Club and a homeless outreach project in downtown Fresno where they assembled and distributed 150 bags containing snacks and hygiene items.

Elementary Program



Overview

This year's elementary program was held June 15–July 9, Monday - Thursday, except for June 18 and July 2. For the 2026 summer school program, we continued the model of one elementary school per area and one Expanded Learning Club site per area. A total of six campuses served 1,161 students from kindergarten through 5th grade. The summer school program for elementary was designed to provide students with targeted, meaningful and engaging instruction in English, science, and math, aligned to the California Content Standards. The Curriculum, Instruction and Accountability Department worked with elementary summer school sites to provide a coordinated program for the District's elementary students.

The 2026 Elementary Summer School program included LAB, which provides instruction that benefits all students, but specifically the District's EL population. These students were able to improve their skills while attending summer school in their area with their peers. Students also received AVID curriculum, a highly engaging program rooted in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM), and also provides solid instruction in ELA.

Curriculum

The District's TOSAs worked to create the curriculum for all elementary programs, and instruction was focused on meeting the needs of students by providing targeted instruction designed to support their learning.

Intermediate Summer School

Summer 2026 AVID Intermediate Bridge Academy

Clovis Unified 6th, 7th, and 8th graders needing extra academic support attended the 6th-8th grade AVID Bridge Academy at Sierra Vista. The AVID Summer Bridge curriculum is designed to support learning in all students and empower participants to explore what is possible in school, careers, and life. Sixth graders attended the Academy rather than their area's elementary school, as they will be transitioning to an intermediate campus in the fall.

Students in the AVID Bridge Academy were given the Hope Rating Scale to measure growth in goal setting, perseverance, and self-efficacy.

- Pre-survey: 81% of students demonstrated high self-efficacy.
- Post-survey: 88% of students demonstrated high self-efficacy.
- Growth: +7%

Academically, students completed a pre- and post-assessment aligned with AVID strategies and grade-level ELA standards to measure mastery of core skills such as annotation, summarization, academic vocabulary, and note-taking.

- Pre-assessment: 79% average mastery
- Post-assessment: 88% average mastery
- Growth: +9% average mastery

Career Technical Education Summer Academy

LEGO Movie Magic: Grimm Tales at Clovis West High School

LEGO Movie Magic: Grimm Tales is a hands-on course where students bring classic fairy tales to life through stop-motion animation and video production. Using LEGO bricks and minifigures, students recreated the magical world of the Brothers Grimm, learning the fundamentals of storytelling, scripting, set design, and animation. Along the way, they developed essential filmmaking skills including camera techniques, lighting, and editing. By the end of the course, each student produced their own animated short film, turning legendary fairy tales into cinematic masterpieces one frame at a time.

Traditional High School Summer School Program

Overview

Students in grades 9-12 participated in one of three summer school programs:

- **Independent Study:** Students came to campus one day a week to turn in material and complete assessments that measured their learning.
- **In-Person Original Credit:** Students came to campus Monday–Thursday to take classes for original credit to have room in their schedule for electives such as instrumental music or leadership.
- **In-Person Credit Recovery:** Students came to campus Monday – Thursday to make up credits in a variety of subjects.

Curriculum

The curriculum used for Independent Study was created by CUSD teachers.

- Math courses were taught by credentialed teachers using curriculum provided by CUSD TOSAs.
- Science courses were taught by credentialed teachers using the school-year curriculum.
- English courses were taught by credentialed teachers using curriculum created by a team of CUSD English teachers.
- Credit Recovery courses were taught by credentialed teachers using the Edgenuity curriculum.

High School Online Original Credit Program

Overview

Clovis Unified students had the opportunity to complete original credit courses in Art, Physical Education, Health, and Social Science through Clovis Online. A total of 140 students participated in the Original Credit program, with all instruction provided by Clovis Online teachers using the Clovis Online curriculum.

Additionally, 328 high school students enrolled in the Clovis Online Credit Recovery program, giving them the opportunity to recover credits and stay on track for graduation.



2026 Summer School Feedback

At the conclusion of summer school, parents and teachers completed a survey, which will be used to build on successes and make improvements.

Parent Survey (371 responses)

- Quality of curriculum - 93.7% rated effective
- Student's feeling of success - 93.2% rated effective
- Communication from site - 93.8% rated effective

Summary of Parent Comments

- Elementary/Intermediate students improved core competencies and benefited from social interaction.
- Secondary students utilized summer school to complete required courses or to stay on track for graduation.

Elementary/Intermediate Teacher Survey (61 responses)

- Language acquisition block - 91.7% rated effective
- Math curriculum - 94.5% rated effective
- AVID STEM curriculum - 86.1% rated effective
- Instructional strategies - 97.2% rated effective

Summary of Elementary/Intermediate Teacher Comments

- Teachers recognized the positive impact of supportive administration, staff collaboration, and student activities.
- Teachers attribute student academic gains to targeted interventions, one-on-one support, and the implementation of specific teaching strategies.
- Intermediate teachers suggested adding math instruction/intervention.

Summary of High School Teacher Comments (23 responses)

- Teachers offered suggestions for ways to make summer school run more efficiently and effectively for students including coordinating schedules with sites for set up, auditing independent study links for functionality, and more collaborative time for teachers.
- Students' academic and social progress was noted with credit given to personalized support, pacing and rigor of the subject matter, and rapport built between students and staff.

DISCUSSION:

The PIP is available when the employing agency knows that there will be a teacher vacancy yet is unable to recruit a suitable candidate. The expectations of the employer and the employee are higher since this individual will be the teacher of record and should be on a credential track. The focus of the document is meeting subject matter competency. Once a candidate completes subject matter competency, the candidate can be employed on a document such as a District Internship Credential. Candidate requirements include the following: (1) Bachelor's degree or higher; (2) passage of the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST); and (3) specific course work or experience, explained in detail on the PIP information leaflet.

As required by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC), employing agencies offering employment to a candidate on a PIP are required to: (1) conduct a diligent search for a suitable credentialed teacher or qualified internship teacher; (2) provide the PIP holder with orientation, guidance, and assistance as specified in Title 5 Section 80026.5 of the California Code of Regulations; (3) assist the PIP holder in developing a personalized plan (kept on file at the local level) through an agency-defined assessment leading to completion of subject matter competence; and (4) counsel the PIP holder to enroll in subject matter training. Clovis Unified School District administration hereby declares that a diligent search was conducted for suitable credentialed teachers or qualified internship teachers. Upon Board approval, District administration asserts that steps 2-4, as outlined above, will be completed.

School districts submitting PIP requests must include verification that a notice of intent to employ the applicant(s) in the identified positions was made public. The public notice must include the following information: (1) the name of the applicant(s); (2) the assignment in which the applicant(s) will be employed including subject(s), grade level(s), and school site; and (3) a statement that the applicant(s) will be employed on the basis of a PIP. In cases where an interpreter candidate has not yet obtained the required certification, it is necessary to request a General Waiver from the State Board of Education (SBE). To be eligible for a waiver, a pre-certified interpreter candidate must have earned a score between 3.0 and 3.9 on the EIPA, ESSE-I/R, or NAD/ACCI assessment.

To be eligible to receive instructional materials funds, the governing board of a district is required to hold an annual public hearing and adopt a resolution stating whether each pupil in the district has sufficient textbooks and instructional materials. The public hearing must be held as a separate agenda item.

The Governing Board shall make a determination through a resolution to certify that each pupil in each school in the District has sufficient textbooks and instructional materials in math, science (including laboratory equipment for grades 9-12), history-social science, and English language arts (including English language development) that are aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board of Education.

The district ensures that new consumable textbooks are provided annually to match the student population precisely, resulting in a one-to-one ratio of enrollment to available books in these areas. For all other grades and subjects, textbooks are systematically inventoried and checked out to students through our data management system. As shown in the report, these grade levels and subjects also have an adequate supply of textbooks, ensuring that all students have the necessary resources.

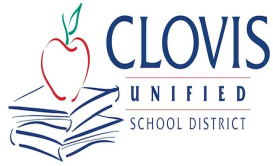

WHEREAS, the Clovis Unified School District (“District”) intends to acquire real property for a new future educational center and related facilities (the “Project”) as necessary in order to mitigate the impact of anticipated student growth in the northeastern portion of the District; and

WHEREAS, the District has selected, as the most suitable site for the Project, real property generally located at 10464 East Herndon Avenue, Clovis, California, and consisting of approximately 250 gross acres (the “Property”) owned by Timothy Indart, Andrea Indart and John Bennett (the “Sellers”); and

WHEREAS, the Property, as well as the terms of acquisition, are more particularly described in two agreements (APNs 150-340-26 and 150-340-16, respectively) entitled "Commercial Purchase Agreement and Joint Escrow Instructions" with exhibits (collectively, the “Purchase Agreement”); and

WHEREAS, California Education Code section 17211 requires a school district to evaluate proposed school site property at a public hearing using the site selection standards established by the California Department of Education (CDE) pursuant to subdivision (b) of section 17251; and

WHEREAS, notice that the District will hold a public hearing in accordance with Education Code section 17211 was provided to the public within a reasonable period of time prior to the date of the hearing; and

WHEREAS, a report was prepared by District Administration evaluating the conformity of the proposed school site to CDE site selection standards, and the report determined that the site conforms with said standards; and

WHEREAS, said report will be made accessible to the public through the District’s

Facility Services website; and

WHEREAS, the public was given the opportunity to comment on the conformity of the site with the CDE site selection standards at the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, there is no substantial evidence before the Board that the subject property conflicts with the CDE site selection standards; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code section 17213.1, the District contracted with a qualified environmental assessor to prepare a Preliminary Environmental Assessment (“PEA”) for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Project site is not, and has not been, a hazardous waste disposal site or solid waste disposal site; the Project site is not a hazardous waste release site identified by the State Department of Health Services; and the Project site does not contain pipelines situated underground or above-ground which carry hazardous substances, acutely hazardous materials, or hazardous wastes; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Public Resources Code section 21151.8, the District consulted with the Fresno County Department of Community Health and San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District to identify any facilities within one-fourth mile of the site which might reasonably be anticipated to emit hazardous emissions or handle hazardous or acutely hazardous materials, substances, or waste; and

WHEREAS, the District is consulting with CDE and Department of Toxic Substances Control with respect to evaluation or remediation of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Property selection was not based primarily on a consideration of the lower cost of acquiring land in an agricultural preserve and there is no other land without or outside the preserve on which it is reasonably feasible to locate the Project consistent with Government Code section 51292; and

WHEREAS, the District has funds available for the acquisition of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Sellers have agreed to sell the Property to the District for a total purchase price as set forth in the Purchase Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of the acquisition are set forth more fully in the Purchase Agreement (the “Agreement”); and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to acquire the Property

for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the purchase of the Property is itself a “project” for purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (“CEQA”) and so requires CEQA review and the preparation of appropriate CEQA documentation before it may be approved, except that under California Code of Regulations, Title 14, section 15004(b) the District may defer such review and document preparation until the District has completed its plans for the use of the Property if it conditions the District’s future use of the Property on compliance with CEQA before such use; and

WHEREAS, the Board intends to so condition the District’s future use of the Property; and

WHEREAS, upon approval of this Resolution, the District shall be authorized to enter into the Purchase Agreement and to acquire the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board makes the following findings:

1. The foregoing recitals are adopted as true and correct.
2. The Purchase Agreement is ratified pursuant to this Resolution.

Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement 75 (GASB 75) requires government agencies to account for Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) in their financial statements using the full accrual method. Currently, the District pays for the OPEB costs annually on a pay-as-you-go basis. Beginning with the 2008-09 fiscal year financial statements, the District has been required to show the liability of these benefits on its financial statements.

In order to comply with the requirements of GASB 75, the District secured the services of Foster & Foster Actuaries and Consultants, to perform an actuarial study of the District's retiree health liabilities or OPEB. This actuarial report is required at least once every two years.
