SUMMARY

Therapeutic Intervention Clinician Associate provides a variety of educationally related mental health services to special education students under the direct supervision of Administrator, Special Education and a Coordinator, Therapeutic Intervention Clinician (Licensed).

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide a variety of educationally related mental health services, including assessment and treatment recommendations, individual, and group counseling services, and consultation to staff and families.
- Assess mental health needs of identified special education students.
- Develop IEP social/emotional goals and objectives for implementation through individual education plans.
- Provide individual, group, and family therapy services to identified special education students.
- Participate in IEP meetings for identified students when appropriate.
- Consult with teachers and staff regarding students' mental health needs.
- Consult with families to enhance mental health and adjustment to school.
- Work collaboratively with private providers and public agencies to facilitate treatment and referrals.
- Participate in and provide staff development and training as appropriate.
- Participate in clinical supervision weekly.
